Directions:

From Baltimore, Washington or Richmond via the Chesapeake Bay Bridge: Take US 50/301 across the bridge. Follow US 301 North to Maryland Route 302 (right turn at mile marker 102). Turn right onto Maryland Route 454 at Templeville. Route 454 becomes Route 8 at the Delaware state line. In Dover, turn left onto US 13 North (N. DuPont Hwy.). Dover Downs Hotel & Casino is located approximately two miles further on the right. Dover is about 50 miles from the Bay Bridge.

From Areas South of the Chesapeake Bay via Bridge-Tunnel: At Norfolk, cross the Bridge-Tunnel and follow US 13 North to Dover, approximately 170 miles from the Bridge-Tunnel. Dover Downs Hotel & Casino is located two miles north of downtown on the right.

From Baltimore or Washington via Interstate 95: From I-695 (the Baltimore Beltway), take I-95 North to exit 4A. Take US 1 to Exit 104. Turn left at the light onto US 13 South (N. DuPont Hwy.). Dover Downs Hotel & Casino is located approximately two miles further on the left.

From Areas Served by the Pennsylvania Turnpike: Take the turnpike East to the Valley Forge Exit, then US 202 South to US 13 South. Follow US 13 South to the split with Route 1 South. Take Route 1 South to Exit 104 (50 cent toll/exact change only). Turn left on US 13 South (N. DuPont Hwy.). Dover Downs Hotel & Casino is located approximately two miles further on the left. Dover is about 70 miles from Center City Philadelphia.

From Philadelphia or Trenton: Take I-95 South to I-495 South to Exit 1 (US 13 South exit). Follow US 13 South to the split with Route 1 South. Take Route 1 South to Exit 104 (50 cent toll). Turn left onto US 13 South (N. DuPont Hwy.). Dover Downs Hotel & Casino is located approximately two miles further on the left. Dover is about 70 miles from Center City Philadelphia.



21st Annual Delaware State Police Homicide Conference Oct. 24 - Oct. 28, 2016

The Conference will provide a forum for intensive training and education in medico-legal death investigation and comprehensive instruction on the basic techniques in forensic pathology.

Nationally and regionally recognized instructors will lecture on state-of-the-art technology and management advances in aspects of homicide investigation such as crime scene reconstruction, interview and interrogation, forensic pathology and their practical application in law enforcement.

PRESENTATIONS

Domestic Violence Related Homicides -

Retired Sergeant Michael Coker served as a police officer for 20 years in the Portsmouth, Virginia Police Department. He worked in the supervisory capacity in both the Homicide and Robbery Bureaus. Mr. Coker is also a court certified instructor in the field of family violence and is a past Board of Director's member of Help Emergency Response (HER) - a local battered women's shelter in Portsmouth, Virginia.

Crime Scene Management -

Lieutenant Tom Martin retired from the New York State Police. He holds several forensic science certifications and regularly gives expert forensic testimony in various state and federal courts. He is a national speaker who has instructed at numerous law enforcement training seminars across the country, including several lectures in Washington D.C., which included presentations to the Executive Office of the National Institute of Justice and members of the United States Congress. Lt. Martin has appeared on Court TV as an Expert Guest Analyst and has been featured on the Law Enforcement Television Network (LETN); the HBO Series "Autopsy" and the Court TV series "Trace Evidence".

BTK Killer Investigation -

Kelly Otis is the Chief of Criminal Investigations with the District Attorney's Office in Wichita, Kansas. The office is the largest DA's office in the state and has a staff of over 60 prosecutors. Kelly has been a police officer for 30 years. He spent 22 years with the Wichita Police Department-working in patrol, undercover investigations, and 10 years in the Homicide Division. Kelly has supervised major crime investigations out of the District Attorney's office since 2007.

Police Officer Involved Shootings -

Sergeant Dave Rivers (Ret.) is a 27 year veteran of the Miami-Dade Police Department (20 years in Homicide). During his tenure he supervised the Cold Case Squad and the Polygraph Section of the Homicide Bureau. Sgt. Rivers is Board Certified by the American College of Forensic Examiners in the field of Crime Scene Reconstruction and Homicide Procedures. He has lectured throughout the United States, England and Canada.

Interview and Interrogation -

Jay Koerner was a Special Agent of the FBI for thirty-two years. He was a Supervisor in the Counterintelligence Training Unit at FBI Headquarters where he provided training to Special Agents in the areas of Counterintelligence investigations, Double Agent operations, Informant and Asset development, Espionage

investigations, and interviewing and interrogation techniques. In addition to teaching FBI personnel Mr. Koerner provided a wide array of training to members of various Department of Defense components, officers of the CIA, NSA investigators, employees of the Departments of State, Justice, Energy, and Commerce. He also lectured to security officials employed at numerous private industries involved in classified research, development and manufacturing. After his retirement from the FBI, Mr. Koerner was hired as a contractor to lecture at the FBI Academy providing instruction to specialized counterintelligence classes and to address FBI executives in various strategic approaches to combating the foreign intelligence threat. During his career with the FBI, Mr. Koerner received in excess of 50 personal commendations, was nominated for the Director's Award for excellence, and was named the Exceptional HUMINT Collector for the intelligence community by the CIA. In 1991 he was the Tampa Bay Chamber of Commerce Law Enforcement Officer of the Year. In 1996 he was awarded the FBI Star for wounds sustained in the line of duty.

Homicide Investigations Best Practices -

Retired Captain Brian E. Russell serves as an investigator supervisor with the Virginia Department of Juvenile Justice, Gang Management Unit. In this position, he oversees the investigations of criminal gang activities involving juveniles under the care of the Virginia Department of Juvenile Justice. In 2011, Mr. Russell retired from the Richmond, Virginia, Police Department as the Captain and Commander of the Major Crimes Division. Before his promotion to Captain, he served five years as the Officer in Charge of the Homicide Unit. From 2010 to the present, the Bureau of Justice Assistance asked Mr. Russell to participate on a homicide unit assessment team that has conducted several assessments and has provided training at the conclusions of those assessments. In 2013, the Office of Justice Programs asked Mr. Russell to conduct several assessments of homicide units. In 2013, Mr. Russell assisted in the project that resulted in the publication of the Homicide Process Mapping: Best Practices for Increasing Homicide Clearances.

Dennis Ravers Homicide (Banther Investigation) -

John Evans has twenty-eight years of experience as a Trooper with the Delaware State Police, with a concentration in operations and criminal investigations. He holds the rank of Major and is a member of the Executive Staff, where he currently oversees statewide Special Operations to include the Intelligence Section, Aviation Section, SORT and the Homicide Unit to name

a few. Prior to that, Major Evans was the Administrative Officer, where he had oversight of the Delaware State Police budget, Human Resources and Training. Before joining the Executive Staff, Major Evans was the Commander of Criminal Investigations from 2009-2012, where he provided case management and oversight on felony level criminal investigations involving Fraud, Youth Crimes, Burglary, Robbery and Sex Crimes. From 2002-2009, Major Evans was the Section Chief/Commander of the state-wide Homicide Unit, where he provided case management and oversight of approximately 100 homicide cases. In addition, Major Evans assisted in Divisional policy review and revisions related to Deadly Force and he conducted investigations surrounding numerous deadly force events. Major Evans has provided advanced and progressive training through lectures on topics including major case management, death investigation and deadly force. Prior to 2002, Major Evans spent ten years as a criminal investigator, during which time he investigated homicides, sex crimes, burglary and fraud.
