Kent County– The Delaware State Police Troop 3 in partnership with the Caesar Rodney School District kicked off its new pilot program called STaRS, “State Troopers actively Reaching Students”! The event took place today at the Allen Frear Elementary School located in Camden.

The event was a huge successes including a collaboration of Troopers from various units as well as Delaware State Police Troop 3’s Commander, Captain Joshua Bushweller. It was a great opportunity for troopers to engage in positive conversations with students during their lunchtime. The students were extremely receptive in speaking with the Troopers and it provided them the opportunity to forge lasting relationships with the Law Enforcement community. Troopers from Troop 3 will be visiting two elementary schools per week within the Caesar Rodney School District during the students’ lunchtime.
