

Delaware State Police Investigating Collision With Three Fatalities- Newark

Newark— The Delaware State Police are investigating a motor vehicle collision involving three fatalities that occurred early this morning.

The incident occurred on September 19, 2020, at approximately 2:07 a.m., when a 2003 Chevrolet Suburban was traveling westbound on Old Baltimore Pike approaching Robert L. Melson Lane. Three occupants inside of a 2015 Hyundai Sonata were traveling eastbound on Old Baltimore Pike. For unknown reasons, the Sonata crossed into westbound lanes striking the front of the Suburban for a head on collision.

The operator of the Suburban, a 35 year-old male from Newark, DE was pronounced deceased at the scene.

The operator of the Sonata, a 25 year-old male from Cary, NC was properly restrained and transported to Christiana Hospital where he was pronounced deceased. The front seat passenger in the Sonata, a 26 year-old male from New Castle, DE was properly restrained and transported to Christiana Hospital where he was pronounced deceased. The third occupant, a 26 year-old male from Linwood, PA who was seated in the second row was transported to Christiana Hospital and treated for serious injuries.

All names are being withheld at this time pending the notifications of next of kin.

Westbound Old Baltimore Pike was closed for approximately 3.5 hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.
