

Troopers Arrest Woman for Assault and Burglary

The Delaware State Police have arrested 31-year-old **Brienna Wildy** of Lewes, Delaware for felony assault and other charges after an incident that occurred in Rehoboth Beach yesterday morning.

On February 14, 2023, at approximately 11:00 a.m., troopers responded to a residence on the 37000 block of Burton Avenue regarding a trespassing complaint. Troopers spoke with the 63-year-old homeowner, who advised that his acquaintance Brienna Wildy had entered his shed without his permission, despite her not being welcome on his property. Troopers learned that Wildy also confronted a disabled 57-year-old woman at the shed. Wildy attacked the woman with a wooden board, causing swelling on her arm. Wildy continued arguing with the homeowner after the assault until troopers arrived at the scene.

Troopers located Wildy on foot a short distance away, and she was detained without incident. Wildy was taken to Troop 7 and charged with the following crimes:

- Burglary Second Degree (Felony)
- Assault Second Degree (Felony)
- Aggravated Menacing

Wildy was arraigned by Justice of the Peace Court 2 and was released on \$5,000 unsecured bond.

Delaware State Police Induct 2023 Honorary Commanders

The induction ceremony was held at the Delaware State Police Training Academy in Dover and included remarks made by Nathaniel McQueen, Jr., former Superintendent of the Delaware State Police and current Secretary of the Department of Safety & Homeland Security, as well as by Senator Spiros Mantzavinos of the Seventh District, who was the 2021 Honorary Commander for Troop 6. Superintendent of the State Police Colonel Melissa Zebley also spoke and had the privilege to present each Honorary Commander with their certificate and lapel pin.

The Delaware State Police Honorary Commanders have the opportunity to become more integrated with the mission of the State Police. Honorary Commanders will be afforded the chance to tour facilities throughout the State, observe demonstrations from specialized units such as the Special Operations Response Team, Canine, Mounted Patrol, and Aviation Units, participate in trooper training exercises such as emergency vehicle operations and firearms training, and attend several Delaware State Police Centennial Anniversary events, recruit graduations, and promotional ceremonies.

Colonel Zebley also administered the Honorary Commander's Oath to each inductee:

Troop 1: Mr. James Herbert, Assistant Area Supervisor – DeIDOT

The Troop 1 Honorary Commander for 2023 is Mr. James Herbert. James, or “Herbie,” grew up in Claymont, Delaware but also spent much of his childhood in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Bullock also served as an Illinois State Commissioner on Discrimination and Hate Crimes. During the period from 1990 to 1998, he served as Pastor of the historic Eighth Street Baptist Church of Wilmington, Delaware. He also served as a Delaware State Commissioner on Minority Health and Delaware State Commissioner on Public Integrity. He has been honored by many local, national, and international organizations for his work and ministry, and he is the author of two books, “The Social Mission of the Black Church: A Call to Action” and “A Charge to Keep.”

Pastor Bullock earned the Doctor of Ministry degree from the United Theological Seminary and completed his post-doctoral work at Harvard University Divinity School. Additionally, he earned his Master of Divinity degree from the Colgate-Rochester Divinity School / Crozer Seminary and a Bachelor of Social Work degree from the University of Alaska-Anchorage.

Troopers Attempting to Identify Driver of Stolen Car

The Delaware State Police are asking for the public's help with identifying the driver who fled from troopers after he crashed a stolen car last night in Rehoboth Beach.

On February 13, 2023, at approximately 11:08 p.m., a trooper on patrol in Lewes observed a tan 2008 Chevrolet Malibu traveling southbound on Coastal Highway south of Dartmouth Drive. A computer check of the Malibu's registration showed that the car had been reported as stolen out of Milford Police Department earlier that day. The trooper began following the car and attempted to stop the vehicle, but the driver accelerated into the parking lot of the Hampton Inn, located at 18826 Coastal Highway in Rehoboth Beach. The Malibu collided with an unoccupied parked car, and three occupants fled from the stolen vehicle on foot. Patrol troopers and the

Delaware State Police Aviation Unit began searching the surrounding areas and were able to find the two passengers hiding in a yard in the Maplewood development. The driver was not located and has not been identified.

Both passengers, identified as 17-year-old males from Ellendale, were taken to Troop 7 and charged with Resisting Arrest. After being arraigned by Justice of the Peace Court 3, one teen was turned over to a legal guardian, and the other was committed to Stevenson House Detention Center on \$1,000 secured bond.

Troopers Seek Public's Help With Locating Wanted Man

The Delaware State Police are seeking the public's help with locating 22-year-old **Michael Robinson** of Millsboro, Delaware. Robinson currently has four active warrants for his arrest, including a felony warrant stemming from an incident that occurred in November and another felony warrant stemming from a separate incident that occurred in December.

Robinson is described as a black male, approximately 6'01" tall, weighing approximately 185 pounds, with brown hair and brown eyes. Robinson is believed to be homeless and his current whereabouts are unknown, but he frequents the Laurel, Bridgeville, and Millsboro areas of Sussex County.

Due to the nature of the cases and in consideration of the victims, no additional details will be released about the incidents that occurred in November and December.

Delaware State Police Investigating Shooting on Interstate 95

Delaware State Police are investigating a shooting incident that occurred on Interstate 95 in the Claymont area early this morning.

On February 13, 2023, at approximately 2:50 a.m., troopers responded to the Wilmington Hospital for two victims, a 33-year-old male and a 30-year-old male both from Wilmington, DE

who sustained gunshot wounds. Investigation revealed the two victims, and a third rear-seat occupant were traveling in a Nissan Altima in the left lane of southbound Interstate 95 in the area of Darley Road. While traveling an unknown vehicle in the right lane began shooting at the passenger side of their vehicle. The 33-year-old operator was struck once in the face and the 30-year-old front-seat passenger was shot once in the upper torso. The operator pulled to the right shoulder of I-95 and an occupant contacted the police. Subsequently, the operator was able to drive to the Wilmington Emergency Room where both victims are being treated for non-life-threatening injuries. The Altima with damage from multiple bullet holes was located in front of the emergency room.

Troopers responded to the location of the shooting and located five shell casings on I-95 southbound.

There is currently no description of the suspect vehicle.

State Police Investigating Fatal Two-Car Crash

The Delaware State Police are investigating a fatal collision that occurred this morning in the town limits of Felton.

On February 11, 2023, at approximately 10:29 a.m., a red 2012 Ford Focus was traveling northbound on South Dupont Highway approaching the intersection at Midstate Road. At this time, a white Acura RLX was stopped at the red light on westbound Midstate Road waiting to turn left onto southbound South Dupont Highway. The red light turned to a green arrow for the Acura, and the green light turned to a red light for the Ford. The Acura began to turn left, but the driver of the Ford did not stop for the red light and continued northbound. As a result, the Ford struck the driver's side of the Acura, causing both cars to come to a stop in the intersection.

The driver of the Ford Focus, a 25-year-old man from Smyrna, Delaware, was not injured. The driver of the Acura, a 66-year-old woman from Felton, Delaware, was taken by ambulance to an area hospital for non-life-threatening injuries. The front-seat passenger of the Acura, a 90-year-old man from Farmington, Delaware, was also taken by ambulance to an area hospital for his injuries but died later in the afternoon. Identification of the victim is pending notification to his family and relatives.

No other vehicles were involved in this collision. The roadway was closed for approximately one hour while the scene was investigated and cleared.
