

State Police Arrest Teen After Stabbing Two at Wilmington Hair Salon

The Delaware State Police arrested a 15-year-old female, from Wilmington, Delaware, after stabbing her hairdresser and another individual at a Wilmington hair salon Sunday afternoon.

On June 7, 2026, at approximately 4:30 p.m., troopers responded to Fransiah African Braids, located at 3914 North Market Street, in Wilmington, for a report of a stabbing. The preliminary investigation revealed the 15-year-old was having her hair braided when the teen became upset with the results.

During the incident, the teenager threw items inside the business before taking a pair of scissors from the hairdresser and entering a restroom. A short time later, she exited the restroom and confronted the stylist while threatening her with the scissors. Following a verbal altercation, the teen assaulted and stabbed the hairdresser multiple times.

A bystander attempted to intervene and restrain the teen but was also stabbed during the incident. Both victims were transported to a local hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

Responding troopers located the teen outside the business and took her into custody without incident. She was taken to Troop 1 where she was charged with the below listed offenses, arraigned by Justice of the Peace Court 11, and committed to the Department of Services for Children Youth and Their Families on a \$10,100 secured bond.

State Police Arrest Wilmington Man Following Multi-Agency Drug Distribution Investigation

The Delaware State Police arrested 42-year-old **Roberto Campusano-Campusano**, of Newark, Delaware, following a multi-agency drug dealing investigation spanning several months.

Beginning in March 2026, the Delaware State Police Special Investigations Unit and the Cecil County Drug Taskforce opened an investigation after learning Campusano-Campusano was selling narcotics in both Delaware and Maryland. Throughout the investigation, detectives determined Campusano-Campusano traveled between the two states and conducted drug transactions. Detectives also determined that although Campusano-Campusano lived in Newark, he used a residence in the 100 block of Delamore Place in Wilmington to support his drug dealing operation.

On June 4, 2026, with the assistance of the Delaware State Police Special Operations Response Team, detectives executed a search warrant at the residence and took Campusano-Campusano into custody without incident. During the search, detectives recovered the following items:

- Approximately 3.45 grams of suspected heroin
- Approximately 2.74 grams of suspected crack cocaine

- Approximately 1.21 grams of suspected cocaine
- A digital scale
- Additional drug paraphernalia and packaging materials.
- More than \$6,000 in suspected drug proceeds

Campusano-Campusano was taken to Troop 2 where he was charged with the below listed crimes, arraigned by Justice of the Peace Court 11, and committed to the Howard R. Young Correctional Institution on a \$46,100 cash bond.

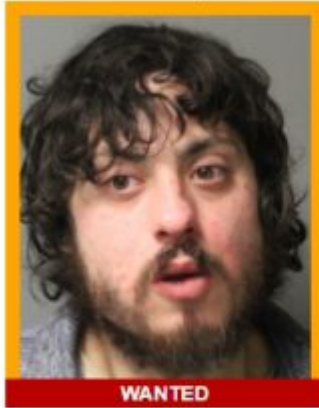

Update – Victim Identified **State Police Investigating** **Single-Vehicle Fatal Crash on** **Oak Road in Bridgeville**

The Delaware State Police have identified 17-year-old **Kensley Ramirez-Ramirez** of Lewes, Delaware, as the person who died in the [fatal crash](#) Thursday morning on Oak Road in Bridgeville.

State Police Arrest Wilmington Man Following Multi-Month Drug Dealing Investigation

The Delaware State Police arrested 49-year-old **Hector Soriano-Carela**, from Wilmington, Delaware, in connection with a multi-month narcotics distribution investigation.

Beginning in January 2026, the Delaware State Police Special Investigations Unit opened an investigation after learning Soriano-Carela was selling narcotics throughout the area. During the investigation, detectives saw Soriano-Carela drive a Honda Civic to various locations and make several drug transactions. Detectives further determined Soriano-Carela lived at a house in the 200 block of North Broom Street in Wilmington and obtained a search warrant for both the residence and the vehicle.

On June 4, 2026, with the assistance the Delaware State Police Special Operations Response Team and the Wilmington Police Department, investigators executed the search warrant and took Soriano-Carela into custody without incident. During searches of the residence and the Honda, investigators recovered the following items:

- Approximately 5.12 grams of suspected crack cocaine
- Approximately 1.75 grams of suspected cocaine
- Over \$1,200 in suspected drug proceeds
- Multiple cellphones belonging to Soriano-Carela
- Drug packaging materials

Soriano-Carela was taken to Troop 2 where he was charged with the below listed offenses, arraigned by Justice of the Peace Court 11, and committed to the Howard R. Young Correctional Institution on a \$92,100 cash bond.



- Possession with Intent to Deliver a Controlled Substance (Felony) – 9 counts
- Possession of a Controlled Substance Tier 1 Quantity (Felony)
- Possession of Drug Paraphernalia

State Police Investigating Single-Vehicle Fatal Crash on Oak Road in Bridgeville

The Delaware State Police are investigating a single-vehicle fatal crash that occurred this morning on Oak Road in Bridgeville.

On June 4, 2026, at approximately 9:05 a.m., a Toyota Sequoia was traveling southbound on Oak Road south of Apple Tree Road.

The preliminary investigation revealed that the Toyota passed a vehicle in a no passing zone, approaching a curve at an apparent high rate of speed. As a result, the Toyota failed to negotiate the curve, overturned and exited the west side of the road. The unrestrained driver was ejected.

The driver, a 17-year-old female from Lewes, Delaware, was taken to an area hospital where she died. A 4-year-old passenger, who was properly restrained in a child safety seat, was taken to an area hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

The roadway was [closed](#) for an extended time while the scene was investigated and cleared.

UPDATE – Suspect In Custody

Search Warrants Lead to Three Arrests for Drug Offenses in Wilmington

The Delaware State Police is announcing the apprehension of 44-year-old **Darvin Connor** in connection with a November [narcotics distribution investigation](#).

On November 8, 2025, members of the Delaware State Police Troop 2 Drug Unit and Special Operations Response Team executed search warrants at two residences in Wilmington following an investigation into the distribution of illegal narcotics. The investigation identified Darvin Connor, Tayvon Brown, Alexander Wade, and Rhasheed Gilliam as suspects involved in distributing narcotics from the homes. During the execution of the search warrants, Brown, Gilliam, and Wade were taken into custody. Connor was not located and remained at large.

On June 1, 2026, The United States Marshals Service Western Pennsylvania Fugitive Task Force located and apprehended Connor in Johnstown, Pennsylvania. Upon his transfer to Delaware, he will be charged for the following offenses:

- Possession with Intent to Distribute Controlled Substance Tier 3 Quantity (Felony)
- Unlawful to Knowingly Operate or Attempt to Operate a Clandestine Laboratory (Felony)

- Possession with Intent to Distribute Controlled Substance (Felony) – 3 counts
- Endangering the Welfare of a Child (Felony)
- Conspiracy Second Degree (Felony)

State Police Investigating Robbery in Wilmington

The Delaware State Police is investigating a robbery that occurred yesterday at Walgreens on Philadelphia Pike in Wilmington.

On June 1, 2026, at approximately 4:45 p.m., troopers responded to Walgreens, located at 1509 Philadelphia Pike in Wilmington, for a report of a robbery. When troopers arrived, they learned that an unknown black male suspect was purchasing an item, and when the employee opened the register, the suspect grabbed money from the drawer and ran away. While the employee was trying to stop the suspect from stealing the money, he grabbed her arm. She was not injured.

The suspect is described as an unknown black male last seen wearing a blue hooded sweatshirt and black pants.

State Police Arrest Harbeson Man for Felony DUI and Drug

Offenses

The Delaware State Police have arrested 43-year-old **Michael Mock**, of Harbeson, Delaware, for felony 3rd offense DUI and felony drug offenses following a traffic stop Sunday night.

On May 31, 2026, at approximately 9:40 p.m., a trooper saw a Chevrolet Camaro speeding and swerving while traveling westbound on John J. Williams Highway near Robinsonville Road. The trooper pulled the Camaro over and spoke to the driver, identified as Michael Mock, who showed multiple signs of impairment. Standardized Field Sobriety Tests were administered, and after the tests, he was arrested for driving under the influence. During an inventory search of the Camaro, troopers found the following items:

- Approximately 169.83 grams of heroin (approximately 5,661 bags)
- .40 caliber handgun
- Large capacity magazine and ammunition
- Drug paraphernalia

A computer check showed that Mock had two prior DUI-related convictions.

Mock was taken to Troop 7, where he was charged with the offenses listed below, arraigned by Justice of the Peace Court 11, and committed to Sussex Correctional Institution on a \$69,500 cash bond.



- Possess, Purchase, Own, or Control a Deadly Weapon, Semi Auto or Auto, by Person Prohibited Who Also Possesses a Controlled Substance (Felony)
- Carrying a Concealed Deadly Weapon – Firearm (Felony)
