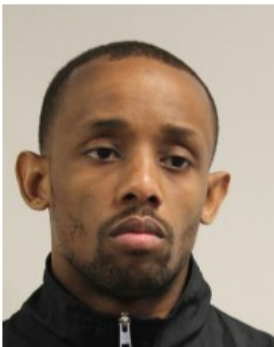

# State Police Investigate Fatal Pedestrian Collision

Delaware State Police are investigating a fatal collision involving a pedestrian that occurred in Seaford yesterday evening.

On December 8, 2022, at approximately 8:18 p.m., a 2013 gray Dodge Caravan was traveling in the left lane of eastbound Norman Eskridge Highway having just passed through the intersection at North Front Street. At the same time, a 52-year-old man was walking from an unknown direction and was in the left lane of eastbound Norman Eskridge Highway. The man was not using a designated crosswalk, carrying a light, or wearing any reflective clothing. As a result, the Caravan struck the pedestrian, leading to him sustaining serious injuries.

The pedestrian, a 52-year-old man from Seaford, Delaware, was transported to an area hospital, where he was later pronounced deceased. Identification of the victim is pending notification to his family and relatives. Both the driver of the Caravan, a 62-year-old man from Laurel, Delaware, and the passenger, a 39-year-old man from Laurel, Delaware, were wearing their seatbelts, and neither person was injured.

No other vehicles were involved in this collision. The roadway was closed for approximately three hours while the scene was being investigated and cleared.

## State Police Investigate Roadway Shooting

Delaware State Police are investigating a vehicle shooting that occurred in the Georgetown area last night.

On December 7, 2022, at approximately 9:28 p.m., troopers responded to the area of Cokesbury Road and Seashore Highway regarding a shooting that had occurred on the roadway. Upon their arrival, troopers contacted the 32-year-old male victim who had crashed his car into a ditch. The ensuing investigation revealed that the victim had been driving northbound on Cokesbury Road when an unknown suspect began driving next to his car. The suspect then fired several rounds into the victim's vehicle, causing him to drive off the roadway. The victim was not shot but was transported to an

area hospital for minor injuries sustained when he struck the ditch. He was released a short time later.

No one else was harmed during this incident. There is no suspect information available, and the circumstances and motive surrounding the shooting remain under investigation.

# **Delaware State Police Investigating Armed Robbery at GameStop**

Delaware State Police are investigating an armed robbery that took place yesterday evening.

On December 7, 2022, at approximately 7:39 p.m., troopers were dispatched to an armed robbery at GameStop, located at 3204 Kirkwood Highway in Wilmington. The investigation revealed that an unknown male suspect entered the store wearing an unknown type of face covering and dark clothing. The suspect approached two store employees, displayed a firearm in his waistband, and demanded numerous video game accessories. The suspect also demanded an undisclosed amount of money from the cash registers. The suspect then fled the area with the stolen merchandise and money. No one was injured during this incident.

# Don't Allow the Grinch to Steal Your Sleigh – Keep Your Car Doors Locked!

The Delaware State Police continually investigate theft of motor vehicle complaints. These crimes result in not only the loss of your car, but also the loss of money, electronics, personal belongings of value, personal identification, and other items including holiday gifts. Many of these complaints result from the owner leaving their vehicle unsecured. These crimes are avoidable by simply taking the extra time to ensure that your vehicles are locked while parked at work, gas stations, shopping centers, and your residence. Delaware State Police want to share the importance of securing your sleighride to combat this preventable crime trend.

The Delaware State Police are offering the following prevention and awareness tips:

- Always keep the doors of your unattended vehicles **locked** and the windows **shut**.
- Do not leave **items of value** in your vehicle. These items include purses, wallets, credit cards, electronics, checkbooks, money, Social Security cards, loose change, documents, and paperwork with your printed personal information.

- Store **valuable tools** inside your residence. If needed daily for work, create an easy system to load and unload, such as using storage containers to transport.
- Lock your **glove box**, which should only store your registration and insurance cards. Do not store your vehicle title in the glove box. Store it in a safe place in your residence.
- Clear the vehicle of all **clutter** and personal items. This can give the general impression that other property of value may be kept within the vehicle.
- Do not keep a **spare vehicle key** hidden in the same vehicle. Do not store house keys or other keys in your vehicle.
- If possible, keep your vehicle parked under a **lighted area** that you can check from your residence.
- If you have a **surveillance security system** at home, include your vehicle in the angle of your camera. If you locate a suspicious subject on your property or around your vehicle, do not confront them. Instead, call 9-1-1 immediately.

And finally, **be a good witness** for your neighbors, co-workers, and fellow citizens. Pay attention and be aware of what is going on in your neighborhood and other places that you frequent throughout the course of your day.

Avoid taking a false security mindset. These crimes happen in all communities across the region. Your address will not safeguard your property. Don't let the Grinch ruin the holiday season. Secure Your Sleigh!

## **Detectives Seek Public's Assistance With Locating Wanted Subject**

Delaware State Police are seeking the public's assistance with locating a subject who is wanted on several felony charges after he used a stolen debit card to make numerous unauthorized purchases and withdrawals.

On the morning of November 18, 2022, a victim from Rehoboth Beach informed troopers that an unknown subject had been using his debit card numerous times to make unauthorized purchases.

Detectives assumed the investigation, and it was discovered that **Jorge Vasquez**, 54, had been fraudulently using the victim's stolen card repeatedly over the course of two months. Troopers have attempted to locate Vasquez but have been unable to do so. Vasquez currently has several active warrants for his arrest, including a felony warrant stemming from this case.

Vasquez is described as a Hispanic male, approximately 5'06" tall, weighing approximately 190 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes. Vasquez is homeless and believed to be frequenting the Rehoboth Beach and Georgetown areas.

# State Police Investigate Fatal Two-Car Collision

Delaware State Police are investigating a two-vehicle fatal collision that occurred yesterday afternoon in the Bridgeville area.

On December 5, 2022, at approximately 1:22 p.m., a gray 2010 Ford Focus was traveling northbound on Wesley Church Road approaching the intersection at Cannon Road. At the same time, a white 2014 Dodge Charger was traveling eastbound on Cannon Road approaching the same intersection. There is a posted stop sign and flashing red traffic light for northbound traffic on Wesley Church Road at this intersection, whereas traffic on Cannon Road does not have to stop. For unknown reasons, the driver of the Focus did not stop and proceeded through the intersection and into the path of the Charger. As a result, the front of the Charger struck the left side of the Focus, and both vehicles exited the roadway and came to rest north of Cannon Road.

The driver of the Focus, an 83-year-old man from Greenwood, Delaware, was properly restrained. He was pronounced deceased at the scene and identification is pending notification to his family and relatives. The driver of the Charger, a 26-year-old man from Bridgeville, Delaware, was properly restrained. He was transported by ambulance to an area hospital, where he was treated for injuries and released.

No other vehicles were involved in this collision. The intersection was closed for approximately three hours while the scene was investigated and cleared.
