# Delaware State Police Investigate Fatal Crash Involving Tractor Trailer- Newark

*Newark, DE-* Delaware State Police are investigating a fatal motor vehicle crash involving a tractor trailer that occurred early Sunday morning.

On January 30, 2022, at approximately 4:04 a.m., a 2017 Ford Focus operated by **John D. White, 58, of Effingham, New Hampshire**, was traveling southbound on Interstate 95 (I-95) in the right thru lane at speeds below the posted speed limit. At the same time, a 2020 Freightliner Tractor/Trailer operated by a 37-year-old Newark man was traveling in the right thru lane approaching the Ford from the rear. Due to the slower moving vehicle ahead in the right-thru lane, the driver of the Freightliner changed lanes and entered the center-right lane

to move past the slower passenger vehicle. After changing lanes, the Freightliner began approaching the rear of the Ford from the center-right lane. Moments later, White merged into the center-right lane into the path of the Freightliner. The truck driver was unable to avoid the rear-end collision, resulting in the front right bumper striking the rear center of the Focus. The vehicles continued traveling into the right thru lane than the right exit lane to SR-896. The Freightliner followed the damaged Ford as it coasted onto the exit ramp from I-95 to northbound SR-896, where it came to a controlled stop in the right shoulder.

A 56-year-old Richmond, Virginia woman was seated in the front seat of the Ford Focus. She and White were not properly restrained. As a result of the collision, the female sustained life-threatening injuries. She was transported to a nearby hospital, where she died a short time later. Identification is pending notification to next of kin.

The 37-year-old Newark man was properly restrained and was uninjured in the collision.

After the initial investigation, John D. White was charged with the following crimes:

- Operation of a Vehicle Causing Death of Another Person
- Driving without a Valid Driver License
- Improper Lane Change
- Failure to Signal Lane Change

White was arraigned in the Justice of the Peace Court #11 and committed to Howard R. Young Correctional Institution on a \$1,500.00 secured bond.

The ramp from southbound I-95 to northbound SR-896 was closed for approximately 4-hours during the on-scene investigation.

# Troopers Investigate Fatal Single Vehicle Crash- Lincoln

*Lincoln, DE-* Delaware State Police are investigating a fatal single vehicle crash that occurred Friday in Sussex County.

On January 28, 2022, at approximately 9:14 a.m., a 1995 Chevrolet Blazer was traveling northbound on Greentop Road, just south of Bunting Avenue. For unknown reasons, the Blazer caught fire while still in motion. The driver exited the east edge of the roadway into a grassy area, where it came to a controlled stop before becoming completely engulfed. The driver attempted to exit the vehicle but was unsuccessful and was located deceased in the driver seat. The body was turned over to the Division of Forensic Science for identification.

The Delaware State Fire Marshal responded to the scene and determined the fire started in the dashboard/firewall area of the vehicle.

The roadway was closed for approximately three hours as the investigation was completed.

## Troopers Offer Safety Tips to Help Prevent Vehicle Thefts

**Sussex County, DE-** During the last week, the Delaware State Police have seen an increase in vehicle thefts in Sussex County, with many occurring in the western part of the county. In an effort to help reduce the chance of becoming a victim, the following safety tips are offered as a reminder:

- **Park in well-lit areas.**

- **Lock and secure homes and garage doors.** Doors left unlocked allow vehicle theft suspects an opportunity to search for keys and steal vehicles undetected.
- **Close and lock all windows and doors when you park.** Most vehicle thefts can be prevented by locking your car doors.
- **Secure your valuables.**
- **DO NOT leave your keys in your vehicle.** Keys and FOBs should **NEVER** be left in a vehicle, whether at home, work, or running errands. *Take your keys with you!*
- **DO NOT leave your vehicle running unattended.** Warming your car up on a cold winter morning or going inside a convenience store while your car is left running and unattended, make you vulnerable. A car thief is looking for these easy targets!

It only takes seconds for your vehicle to be stolen. However, you can prevent yourself from becoming the next victim by taking the necessary precautionary measures.

## **\*Attempt To Identify\* Public Assistance Needed Identifying Robbery Suspect- Bear**



Delaware State Police are asking for the public's assistance in identifying the pictured suspect who committed an armed robbery.

At approximately 1:00 p.m., Friday, December 31, 2021, troopers responded to the La Morena, located at 757 Pulaski Highway, Bear, for a knife point robbery. The investigation determined a male suspect entered the grocery store and confronted an employee behind the sales counter. The suspect displayed a large kitchen knife and removed an undisclosed

amount of money from the cash register. The suspect then entered a small drawer below the register and removed cashier checks. The suspect fled on foot eastbound towards Pulaski Highway. The employee gave chase which caused the suspect to drop his phone. The employee picked it up, but gave it back after the suspect engaged the victim again brandishing the knife. The suspect then ran to a black sedan parked in the rear of the business and fled the scene. The employee was not injured as a result of the incident.

The suspect is described as a Hispanic male, early to mid 20's, approximately 5'7" tall, with an average build, and possibly operating a black four door sedan.

**Dover Man Arrested After**

# Pursuit in Stolen Truck and Crashing into Another Vehicle

*Kent County, DE-* Delaware State Police arrested **Demetrius Wright, 29, of Dover**, Sunday morning after fleeing from troopers in a stolen truck and crashing into another vehicle.

On January 23, 2022, at approximately 7:25 a.m., troopers responded to southbound Korean War Veterans Memorial Highway (SR 1) for a reported stolen vehicle located traveling on the roadway. The red Dodge RAM 1500 was reported stolen out of the City of Dover and was traveling southbound in the area of I.G. Burton, north of Milford. A traffic stop was initiated on the truck, but the operator failed to pull over and continued traveling on US 113. The operator accelerated as the Dodge continued to travel south through multiple intersections. Troopers attempted to deploy stop sticks in the area of Rt. 16, Ellendale, but the truck swerved to avoid them and entered the right shoulder, striking the rear of a 2020 Dodge work van operated by a 43-year-old Bridgeton, NJ man. After the collision, the driver of the Dodge RAM, identified as **Demetrius Wright**, exited through the right rear passenger door and was taken into custody. He was transported to a nearby hospital by EMS, where he was medically cleared. The investigation determined Wright was driving the stolen truck under the influence of drugs.

The operator of the Dodge work van had pulled to the shoulder before the collision to allow police to pass. EMS transported him to a nearby hospital with minor injuries.

A 48-year-old Bridgeton, NJ man was seated in the front right passenger seat. He was transported by EMS to a nearby hospital with minor injuries.

Demetrius Wright was transported to Delaware State Police

Troop 3 and charged with the following crimes:

- Disregarding a Police Officer Signal (Felony)
- Driving While Suspended
- Reckless Driving
- Aggressive Driving
- Driving Under the Influence of Drugs
- (Two Counts) Speeding in Excess of Posted Limit
- Failure to Stop at Red Light
- Speeding in Excess of 50mph on 2 Lane Road
- (Two Counts) Speeding in Excess of 55mph on Divided Roadway
- Failed to Remain Within a Single Lane

Wright was arraigned in the Justice of the Peace Court and committed to Sussex Correctional Institution on a \$2,470.00 secured bond.
