

Laurel Man Arrested After Assaulting Three Troopers and Resisting Arrest- Laurel

Laurel, DE- Delaware State Police arrested **Jeremy L. Showell, 35, of Laurel**, on felony criminal charges after he resisted arrest and assaulted three troopers.

On January 5, 2022, at approximately 8:05 p.m., troopers responded to a domestic incident at a residence in the 28000 block of Seaford Rd. Troopers were advised **Jeremy Showell** was acting disorderly in the home and had an active warrant from Laurel Police Department for shoplifting. Upon arrival, troopers located Showell in the backyard. He was advised he was under arrest, but he failed to comply with commands to place his hands behind his back. He was again directed to put his hands behind his back, at which time he appeared to comply. As the trooper attempted to place Showell in handcuffs, he punched the trooper in the face with a closed fist, causing a minor injury before he fled on foot from officers. Showell failed to comply with commands to stop running, and the trooper deployed his divisionally issued taser, which was ineffective. Troopers again attempted to take Showell into custody, at which time Showell punched another trooper in the face with a closed fist, causing minor injuries. Again, attempts to get Showell to comply were unsuccessful, and he continued to resist arrest. Troopers continued to try and take Showell into custody when he punched the third trooper in the head with a closed fist, causing minor injuries. The three troopers were then able to take Showell into custody. The troopers did not require medical attention for their injuries. All three troopers are currently assigned to Delaware State Police Troop 5 located in Bridgeville, DE.

Showell was transported to Delaware State Police Troop 5, where he was charged with three counts of [Assault Second Degree on Law Enforcement Officer](#) (Felony) and [Resisting Arrest with Force](#) (Felony).

Showell was arraigned in the Justice of the Peace Court #3 and committed to Sussex Correctional Institution on a \$32,500.00 cash bond.

***UPDATE #2* Delaware State Police Investigate Fatal Motor Vehicle Collision- Seaford**

Seaford, DE- Delaware State Police are investigating a fatal motor vehicle collision that occurred in the Seaford area early Thursday afternoon.

On January 6, 2022, at approximately 12:33 p.m., a **2009 Nissan Altima operated by a 53-year-old Seaford man** was traveling southbound on Atlanta Rd. At the same time, a **2018 Kia Soul driven by a 36-year-old Seaford woman** was traveling northbound on Atlanta Rd. in the area of the Nissan. For unknown reasons, the driver of the Nissan crossed the double solid yellow line and struck the Kia head-on in the northbound lane of travel.

The driver of the Nissan was properly restrained and airlifted to an area hospital where he was admitted in serious condition.

The driver of the Kia was properly restrained and transported by ambulance to an area hospital, where she was admitted with non-life-threatening injuries.

The **Kia driver's 14-year-old daughter** was properly restrained in the left rear passenger seat. The **driver's 6-year-old son** was properly restrained with a backless booster seat in the right rear passenger seat. Unfortunately, due to injuries sustained during the collision, the juveniles were pronounced dead at the scene.

The Delaware State Police extend our condolences to the victims' families during this difficult time. Atlanta Rd. in the area of the collision was closed for approximately 5.5 hours as troopers conducted their on-scene investigation.

Troopers Investigating Two Carjacking Incidents – Wilmington

Wilmington – The Delaware State Police are investigating an attempted carjacking and carjacking that took place Wednesday night in North Wilmington.

The first incident occurred at approximately 9:03 p.m., Wednesday, January 5, 2022, in the parking lot of Wawa, located at 1702 Rocky Run Parkway, Wilmington. Investigation determined a black male suspect approached a 42-year-old male victim as he exited his vehicle in the parking lot. The suspect demanded the victim out of the vehicle and displayed a handgun tucked in his waistband. The victim pushed the suspect away but was physically assaulted by the suspect. The victim then ran towards the rear of the business. His vehicle was unable to be operated because the victim still had the key fob in his possession. The suspect then fled the scene in a gold

sedan.

A short time later, at approximately 9:04 p.m., the same suspect who exited a gold sedan approached a second victim in the parking lot of the Green Turtle located at 307 Rocky Run Parkway, Wilmington. The suspect approached a 26-year-old victim, pointed a handgun towards him, and demanded the victim's car keys. The victim complied and the suspect fled the scene in the stolen 2000 Chevrolet Malibu.

The suspect was described as a black male, approximately 5'8"-5'11" tall, 160-175 lbs., wearing all dark clothing and a mask. There are no surveillance images available at this time.

The stolen vehicle was located in the Chateau Orleans Apartments located in the 300 block of Shipley Road, Wilmington.

***UPDATE* Delaware State Police Investigate Fatal Pedestrian Crash- Felton**

Felton, DE- Delaware State Police are investigating a fatal pedestrian crash that occurred late Wednesday night in Felton.

On January 5, 2022, at approximately 11:12 p.m., a 2011 Nissan Rogue was traveling southbound on S. DuPont Hwy (US 13), in the left lane, just north of Peach Basket Rd. At the same time, a 55-year-old Harrington woman was near the center of the left lane of southbound S. DuPont Hwy, just north of Peach Basket Rd. As a result, the Nissan struck the pedestrian near the center of the left lane with its front bumper. The vehicle continued southbound a short distance and stopped in the left lane of S. DuPont Hwy, just south of Peach Basket Rd.

The 55-year-old Harrington woman was dressed in dark clothing and was not carrying any light. She was pronounced dead at the scene. Identification is pending notification to next of kin.

The 17-year-old driver is from Harrington, DE. She was uninjured during the collision.

S. DuPont Hwy was closed for approximately 3 hours for the crash investigation.

Delaware State Police Troop 3 Collision Reconstruction Unit continues to investigate this collision. Troopers Seek Public's Assistance Locating Wanted Sussex County Men- Lewes

Lewes, DE- Delaware State Police Troop 7 is seeking the public's assistance locating **Jhareed Alexander Ayers, 21, of Sussex County, and his brother, James Robert Ayers, 19, of Lewes,** who are wanted on multiple felony criminal charges.

On **December 16, 2021,** Jhareed and James were involved in a home invasion on Needle Dr. Lewes. A 57-year-old male was held at gunpoint and then physically assaulted during the home invasion before an undisclosed amount of money was stolen from the residence. Three juveniles were present inside the home during the incident and were not injured. The 57-year-old male received minor injuries but did not require medical attention. As a result of this incident, **Jhareed is wanted for Home Invasion Burglary First Degree (Felony), Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony (Felony), Conspiracy Second Degree (Felony), Aggravated Menacing (Felony), Possession of a Firearm by a Person Prohibited (Felony), Theft \$1,500 or Greater (Felony), Assault Third Degree, and three counts of Endangering the Welfare of a Child.**

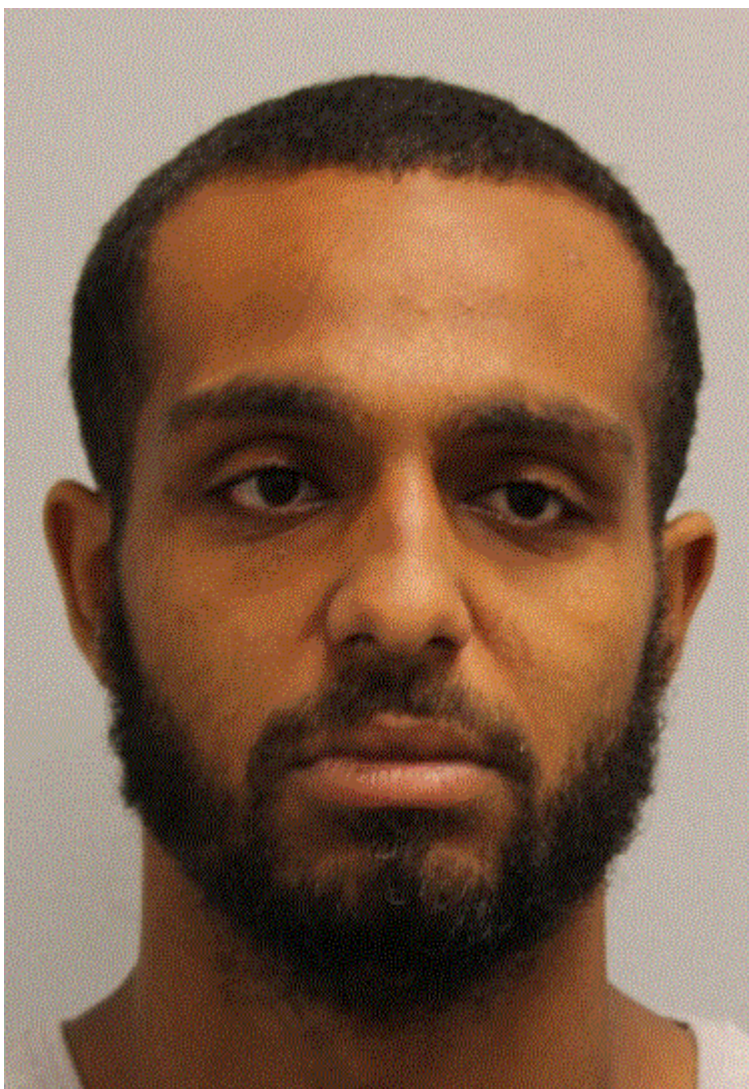
James is wanted for Home Invasion Burglary First Degree (Felony), Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony (Felony), Conspiracy Second Degree (Felony), Aggravated Menacing (Felony), Possession of a Firearm by a Person Prohibited (Felony), Theft \$1,500 or Greater (Felony), Assault Third Degree, and three counts of Endangering the Welfare of a Child

On **December 22, 2021,** Jhareed responded to Duffy Street,

Rehoboth Beach, attempting to locate an acquaintance. When unsuccessful, he pointed a firearm at an individual outside and demanded they help him find the person. When Jhareed was unsuccessful in locating the individual, he fled the area. The victim was not injured. As a result of the incident, **Jhareed is wanted for Possession of a Deadly Weapon During the Commission of a Felony (Felony), Possession of a Firearm by a Person Prohibited (Felony), Offensive Touching, and Aggravated Menacing (Felony).**

Jhareed also has an active capias for Failure to Pay out of Sussex County Court of Common Pleas.

James has an active capias for Failure to Appear out of Sussex County Court of Common Pleas.

Delaware State Police Arrest Four Juveniles for Robbery Following Carjacking – Newark

Newark- Delaware State Police have arrested four juveniles, two males (17-year-old of Wilmington and 16-year-old of Newark) and two females (13-year-old and 14-year-old of New Castle), for robbery and related charges following a carjacking that occurred Monday afternoon.

The incident occurred at approximately 3:25 p.m., Monday, January 3, 2021, in the parking lot of Acme, located at 1 University Plaza, Newark. Investigation determined two male suspects approached a 44-year-old female victim and her 15-year-old son while they returned to her black Dodge sedan in the parking lot. One of the suspects forcibly removed the victim's purse while the second suspect entered the vehicle from the passenger door and physically assaulted the juvenile victim. After a brief struggle with both victims, the suspects who implied they had a weapon, were able to get into the driver and front passenger seat. The suspect operating the stolen vehicle put the vehicle in reverse which threw both victims to the ground. The victims were transported to an area hospital with minor injuries.

Through investigative means, troopers quickly identified the two male juvenile suspects and obtained arrest warrants. On January 4, 2021, troopers conducted surveillance and located the stolen vehicle in front of a residence on Mackay Lane, Newark. A perimeter was established around the residence and troopers were successfully able to talk the suspects outside where they were taken into custody without incident. Also taken into custody at the residence were two female juveniles who were determined to be accomplices in the carjacking.

Additionally, investigators linked the two juvenile males to a second carjacking that occurred on January 1, 2021, at approximately 2:41 p.m., at the BJ's Wholesale Store located at 100 Pencader Plaza, Newark. Investigation determined the two juvenile suspects approached a 58-year-old female victim of Middletown, DE, in the parking lot, implied they had a weapon, and demanded her car keys. The suspects then forcibly removed the victims purse from her possession which contained the key fob to the vehicle and the suspects fled in the stolen tan Jeep Grand Cherokee.

The Jeep has not been recovered at this time

The four juveniles were transported to Troop 2 where they were charged with the following crimes:

Two Juvenile males

- Robbery 1st Degree (Felony)- 3 Counts
- Conspiracy 2nd Degree (Felony)- 2 Counts
- Wearing a Disguise During the Commission of a Felony (Felony) – 2 Counts

The two juvenile males were arraigned in the Justice of the Peace Court #11 and committed to the New Castle County Detention Center on \$187,000 cash bond.

Two Juvenile females

- Robbery 1st Degree (Felony)
- Conspiracy 2nd Degree (Felony)

The two juvenile females were arraigned in the Justice of the Peace Court #11 and committed to the New Castle County Detention Center on \$42,000 secured bond.
