

# Delaware State Police Investigate Fatal Single Vehicle Crash- Millsboro

*Millsboro, DE-* Delaware State Police are investigating a fatal motor vehicle collision that claimed the life of a 16-year-old Millsboro juvenile.

On August 31, 2021, at approximately 11:55 p.m., a 2005 Infiniti G35 sedan was traveling southbound on DuPont Boulevard (US 113), north of Delaware Avenue. For an unknown reason, the 16-year-old operator from Millsboro lost control of the vehicle and exited the roadway while spinning clockwise. It continued traveling southbound before striking several fence posts on the Atlantis Homes property. While still traveling sideways, the left side of the Infiniti hit a curb and began to overturn before going airborne and striking the steel Atlantis Homes signpost with the left rear side before coming to rest.

Also in the vehicle was a 16-year-old front-seat passenger from Millsboro that was not properly restrained and was pronounced deceased at the scene. Identification is pending notification to next of kin.

A 17-year-old rear seat passenger from Milford was not properly restrained and transported to an area hospital and admitted with non-life-threatening injuries.

The 16-year-old operator was properly restrained and transported to an area hospital with minor injuries and released.

The roadway was closed for approximately 3.5 hours while the investigation was completed, and the roadway was cleared.

The collision remains under investigation by the Delaware State Police Troop 7 Collision Reconstruction Unit. # Delaware State Police Investigating Fatal Motor Vehicle Collision- Newark

*Newark-* Delaware State Police are investigating a fatal motor vehicle collision that occurred Monday afternoon on Old Baltimore Pike at Dixie Line Road.

On August 30, 2021, at approximately 4:01 p.m., a white 2003 Jeep Liberty, was traveling westbound on Old Baltimore Pike towards the area of Dixie Line Road and the Maryland State Line. At this time, a red 2001 Chevrolet Cavalier, was traveling eastbound Old Baltimore Pike and had just entered into Delaware passing Dixie Line Road. The Chevrolet crossed over the dashed yellow line and entered into the westbound lane of travel while continuing to travel eastbound. The front center of Chevrolet then struck the front left of the Jeep. A silver 2007 Kia Sportage that was traveling westbound directly behind the Jeep was unable to avoid the initial collision. Immediately after the initial impact, the Kia struck the driver side of the Jeep. All three vehicles came to a rest in the westbound lane of travel.

There were two occupants, a 28-year-old male and a 38-year-old female inside of the Chevrolet. Both occupants were not properly restrained. The 28-year-old male operator was transported to Christiana hospital for serious injuries. The 38-year-old female passenger was transported to Christiana hospital where she was pronounced deceased. Identification is pending notification to the next of kin.

The 63-year-old male operator of the Jeep and 44-year-old female operator of the Kia were transported to Christina

Hospital for non-life-threatening injuries.

Old Baltimore Pike was closed in both directions for approximately 4 hours while the crash was being investigated and the roadway cleared.

The investigation remains on-going. # Lincoln Man Arrested for DUI after Pursuit- Dover

**Dover, DE-** Troopers arrested **Kenneth Barlow, 26, of Lincoln** on multiple charges following a pursuit Sunday night.

On August 29, 2021, at approximately 10:01 p.m., troopers were dispatched to Bay Road (SR 1) in the area of Exit 91 (Kitts Hummock Road) for reports of a red Ford Ranger traveling northbound in the southbound lanes on Bay Road. A trooper operating a fully marked police car in the area located the vehicle traveling the wrong way on the southbound side of Bay Road and attempted to stop the vehicle. The vehicle failed to stop and continued traveling in the wrong direction for several minutes before Stop Sticks were successfully deployed by assisting troopers. The vehicle continued traveling on SR 1 until troopers were able to successfully slow and stop the vehicle by surrounding it. The occupant and sole operator of the vehicle, Kenneth Barlow, was contacted and a strong odor of alcohol was detected. A DUI investigation ensued and Barlow was found to be driving under the influence of alcohol. He was transported by ambulance to an area hospital where he was medically cleared before being transported to Troop 3 and charged with the following crimes:

- Disregarding a Police Officers Signal (Felony)
- Driving a Vehicle Under the Influence
- Failure to Have Insurance in Possession
- Failure to Maintain Lane
- Must Maintain Travel Lane
- Failure to Obey Traffic Device
- Driving on the Wrong Side of the Road

Barlow was arraigned in the Justice of the Peace Court #7 and

committed to Sussex Correctional Institution on a \$2,400.00 secured bond.

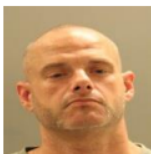

# Delaware State Police Investigating Gas Station Shooting- Wilmington

*Wilmington*– The Delaware State Police are investigating a shooting at a Wilmington area gas station that occurred this morning and left one man dead.

The incident was reported at approximately 6:14 a.m., Thursday, August 26, 2021, when troopers responded to the Sunoco gas station located at 1950 Maryland Avenue, Wilmington, for a report of a subject shot. Upon their arrival, a 34-year-old male victim was located outside the front of the convenience store with apparent gunshot wounds. The victim was transported to an area hospital where he was pronounced deceased. Identification of the victim is pending notification to the next of kin.

Investigation determined two unknown males approached the victim in front of the convenience store and opened fire. There is currently no description of the suspects at this time.

## **Troopers Offer Safety Tips for a Safe School Year**

The Delaware State Police would like to offer safety guidelines for a great beginning to this new and exciting school year. With some schools already in session and some that will start next week; it is important to know thousands

of Delaware's precious children will ride a school bus every day. Some of our youngsters will be introduced to school bus transportation for the first time. Knowing this, everyone should consistently make safety a high priority for our children walking to and from the school bus stop. Motorists must share the road with buses during the school year and must take into account any possible delays and exercise good judgment and patience throughout the school year. Do not pass stopped school buses!

Delaware's over 1,800 school buses travel great distances throughout the school year. It is most important to understand the dangers for children and their families. There are some easy steps children, parents and motorists can do to make this a safe school year for Delaware students.

### **PARENTS**

- If your child's bus stop is not near your home, walk the route to the bus stop with your child until they are familiar with it and follow safe practices.
- Familiarize yourself with the bus driver.
- Make sure you have the Transportation Director's contact information just in case you have any questions or encounter a problem.

### **CHILDREN**

- Start your day with plenty of time to get to the bus stop.
- Stay alert as you walk to the bus stop. Always be aware of your surroundings.
- Know your bus driver and bus number.
- Wait for the bus in a safe place. Avoid horseplay that may cause you to fall into the street.
- Never run to or from the bus.
- When the bus arrives, make sure it comes to a complete stop before approaching it.

- Remain seated at all times while the bus is in motion.
- Don't push or shove when getting on or off the bus.
- Always keep your arms and head inside the bus.
- Learn about the "danger zone". There is a 10-foot wide area on all sides of the bus, where the driver cannot see you. When you get off the bus, step outside of the danger zone until you can see the driver's face.
- Only cross in front of the bus where the driver can see you.
- Never run behind the bus, or bend down to pick up an object. The bus driver may think you've crossed safely and start to move.
- Do not distract the bus driver so that he/she may get you safely to and from school.
- Listen to the bus driver and bus aid to ensure your safety.
- Make sure to be courteous and respectful to the school bus driver

## **MOTORISTS**

- Please slow down and give yourself some time to make adjustments to the new change in your schedule and traffic patterns.
- Drivers traveling in either direction on a two-lane road must stop when a school bus activates its flashing red lights and stop sign or arm.
- Drivers traveling in the same direction as a school bus on a four-lane, divided road must stop for a stopped school bus. Drivers travelling in the opposite direction are not required to stop.
- Delaware law requires vehicles to stop even when the bus is stopped to load/unload students on private property.
- Anyone convicted of passing a stopped school bus can be fined as much as \$230 dollars for the first offense and as much as \$575 for the second offense. The individual will also have their license suspended for between 1 and

12 months.

- Please watch for the little ones crossing the roads and parking lots to and from the bus or private vehicles.
- Please watch your speed at all times especially in school zones. The School Resource Officers and other law enforcement officers will monitor the safety of all who are going to and from the schools.
