Troopers Investigating Street Robbery – Millsboro

Millsboro – The Delaware State Police are investigating a street robbery that occurred Saturday afternoon in Millsboro.

The incident occurred at approximately 2:23 p.m., Saturday, September 7, 2019 in the parking lot of the Royal Farms located on John J. Williams Hwy., Millsboro. A 63 year old female was walking through the Royal Farms parking lot when she was approached a male suspect who demanded that she turn over her back-pack. The suspect implied that he had a weapon and threatened the victim with bodily harm if she didn't comply. The suspect then grabbed the back-pack and fled on foot. The victim was not injured as a result of the incident.

The suspect was described as a black male, 30-40 years of age, 5'6" tall, 160 lbs., wearing a brown t-shirt and jeans.

Multi-Agency Crime Blitz Results in Mass Arrests

New Castle– A multi-agency operation conducted on Thursday, September 5 2019, at targeted locations throughout the greater New Castle area has resulted in the arrest of 72 individuals on criminal charges.

This crime blitz focused on the areas of New Castle Ave., Rt. 13 and the S. Market St. area and the Rt. 40 corridor. The operation was conducted in these areas to target criminal activity and to address ongoing quality of life issues.

During the eight hour enforcement blitz, police arrested 37 individuals for either a criminal charge or outstanding court capias, resulting in the clearance of 106 active warrants. There were a total of 79 traffic arrests to include 1 DUI, and 27 criminal arrests made.

Seized during the operation was 2,085 grams of Marijuana, .693 grams of Heroin, 55 Schedule II pills, .6 grams of Cocaine, assorted drug paraphernalia, \$3,458.00 in suspected drug proceeds and a Glock 9mm firearm.

This initiative was a collaborative effort between the Delaware State Police, New Castle County Police Department, Newport Police Department, Probation & Parole, Department of Corrections and Justice of the Peace Courts.

This combined effort highlights how the cooperation of multiple law enforcement agencies can effectively combat crime which in turn increases the quality of life for the

communities we serve.

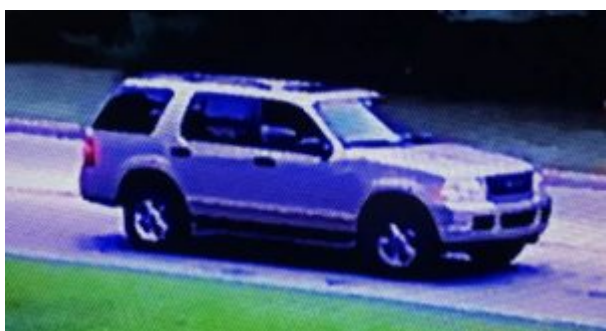

Troopers Attempting to Identify Subject who Fled from Traffic Stop – New Castle

New Castle – The Delaware State Police are attempting to identify the pictured subject who fled from a traffic stop, endangering multiple young children who were passengers in his vehicle.

The incident occurred at approximately 6:00 p.m., Thursday, September 5, 2019, on Moores Lane in the area of Midfield Rd.

when Troopers stopped a Ford Explorer for a traffic violation. Upon making contact with the driver of the vehicle (pictured), the Troopers observed 2 children in the back seat, who were properly restrained. However seated in the front seat was an approximately 3 year old child who was not restrained in any way. As the Troopers were speaking with the driver in regards to the violation he suddenly accelerated and fled at a high rate of speed. Due to the children being in the vehicle the Troopers did not pursue. The vehicle was unable to be located during a search of the area.



The vehicle was described as a tan or gold older model Ford Explorer, with a roof rack, tinted windows and bearing an unknown temporary PA tag.

Once identified the subject will face the following charges:

- Disregard a Police Officers Signal
- Reckless Endangering
- Endangering the Welfare of a Child (3 counts)

Troopers Investigating Fatal Pedestrian Crash – Frankford

Frankford – The Delaware State Police are investigating a fatal crash involving a pedestrian that occurred Friday night in Frankford.

The initial investigation has determined that at approximately 9:55 p.m., Friday, September 6, 2019, a 2010 Lexus HS250H, operated by a 22 year old Landenberg PA man, was traveling southbound on DuPont Blvd. (US 113) in the right lane, north of Berry Rd., within the limits of Frankford. A 56 year old Frankford woman was attempting to cross the southbound lanes of DuPont Blvd. on foot and walked directly into the path of the Lexus at which time she was struck. After impact, the pedestrian was thrown in a southerly direction coming to rest on the shoulder of the roadway. The Lexus came to a controlled stop and remained at the scene.

The pedestrian who was pronounced deceased at the scene was not using a marked crosswalk, was wearing no reflective clothing, nor was she in possession of a light. Identification of the victim is pending notification of next of kin. Impairment on her behalf is undetermined at this time.

The driver of the Lexus as well as an adult female passenger in the vehicle were both properly restrained and were not injured. Impairment is not deemed as a contributing factor on his behalf.

The southbound lanes of DuPont Blvd. were closed for approximately 3 hours while the scene was investigated and cleared.

UPDATE Troopers Investigating Fatal Motor Vehicle Crash – New Castle

New Castle – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing to investigate a fatal crash involving a single vehicle that occurred at approximately 1:53 p.m., Thursday, September 5, 2019 on Wrangle Hill Rd. (DE Rt. 72) in the area of School House Rd.

The initial investigation has determined that a 2014 Honda Accord, operated by a 35 year old Delaware City man, was traveling northbound on Wrangle Hill Rd. approaching the intersection with School House Rd., when for an undetermined reason the vehicle traveled off the right side of the road into a grassy area. The vehicle continued in a northbound direction and then struck a guardrail which caused it to overturn onto its roof. After overturning the vehicle came to rest in a ditch.

The driver and sole occupant of the vehicle, who was seat belted, was pronounced deceased at the scene. Speed is not considered as a contributing factor in the crash, impairment is undetermined at this time.

Wrangle Hill Rd. was closed between Rt. 13 and River Rd. for approximately 2 hours while the scene was investigated and cleared.
