

Troopers Seek Public's Assistance in Locating Isaiah Blakey- Felton

Felton- The Delaware State Police are seeking the public's assistance in attempting to locate 15-year-old **Isaiah Blakey** (no photo available) who is wanted for assault and weapons charges.

The incident occurred on August 30, 2019, at approximately 6:57 p.m., when Troopers responded to a residence on Mallory Court in reference to a physical domestic complaint. Upon arrival, it was learned that Blakey physically assaulted his girlfriend and broke her cell phone. She refused medical treatment at the scene. Blakey's brother attempted to break up the altercation when a struggle ensued between he and Blakey, causing minor injury to the victim. Blakey's brother also refused medical treatment at the scene. Prior to fleeing the residence, Blakey obtained a shovel and proceeded to smash a car windshield and a sliding glass door to the residence. He also threatened six individuals in the residence and stated that he was going to kill all of them.

Blakey currently has active warrants out of Troop 3 for the following:

- Possession of a Deadly Weapon During the Commission of a Felony
- Assault 2nd Degree
- Aggravated Menacing
- Terroristic Threatening (6 counts)
- Reckless Endangering (2 counts)
- Offensive Touching
- Criminal Mischief (3 counts)

Blakey is a light skin, black male, 5'08" tall, 130 lbs., with

blue eyes. He was last seen wearing no shirt and dark pants.

Troopers Investigating Fatal Crash-Harbeson

Harbeson- The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating a fatal crash that occurred yesterday.

The incident occurred on August 30, 2019 at approximately 4:32

p.m., when a 2014 Subaru Outback was traveling westbound on Beaver Dam Road (CR 285) approaching the intersection of Indian Mission Road (SR 5), which is controlled by a posted stop sign. A 2015 Volvo Tractor towing an enclosed box style trailer was traveling northbound on Indian Mission Road approaching the intersection of Beaver Dam Road. Indian Mission Road is a throughway and traffic is not required to stop. For unknown reasons, the operator of the Outback failed to remain stopped and entered the intersection directly in the path of the tractor trailer. After the impact the tractor trailer continued to swerve and exited the west edge of Indian Mission Road where it struck several standing trees before coming to rest in the wooded area.

The operator of the Outback, a 79-year-old male from New Jersey was properly restrained. He was transported to the Beebe Medical Center where he was pronounced deceased. His name is being withheld at this time pending the notification of next of kin. A female passenger was also in the vehicle and properly restrained. She was transported to the Christiana Hospital in critical condition.

The operator of the tractor trailer, a 33-year-old male from Pennsylvania was properly restrained. He was transported to the Beebe Medical Center where he was treated and released with minor injuries.

Indian Mission Road in the area of Beaver Dam Road was closed for approximately 5.5 hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

The crash continues remains under investigation by the Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit.

State Police Conducting Death Investigation-Lincoln

Troopers Investigating Injury

Crash, Asking for Help Locating Fleeing Vehicle – Wilmington

Wilmington – The Delaware State Police are investigating a motor vehicle crash that occurred Tuesday night and are asking for the public's help in locating an involved vehicle that fled the scene.

The incident occurred at approximately 9:46 p.m., Tuesday, August 27, 2019 on Lancaster Pike in the area of Hercules Rd. A 2003 Ford Escape, operated by a 42 year old West Grove, Pennsylvania man, was traveling westbound on Lancaster Pike in the right lane approaching Hercules Rd. A second vehicle that could only be described as possibly a white Tahoe, was also traveling westbound on Lancaster Pike and changed from the left lane in to the right lane forcing the Ford off the roadway. The Ford traveled off the right side of the road, first striking a guardrail and then a concrete barrier. The Ford then went over the concrete barrier and down an approximate 40 foot embankment, coming to rest on its roof in a body of water.

In addition to the driver the Ford was also occupied by a 31 year old Hockessin woman and a 17 day old female, all of which were able to exit the vehicle before it caught fire.

The driver and the adult female, who were properly restrained, were treated at Christiana Hospital for minor injuries. The infant who was also properly restrained was also transported for evaluation.

There was no contact between the Ford and the other vehicle, however Troopers are still attempting to locate it and identify the driver as part of the ongoing investigation.

Newark – The Delaware State Police are continuing to investigate a serious motor vehicle crash that occurred at approximately 11:48 a.m., Tuesday, August 27, 2019 on DE Rt. 72 northbound, just north of Old Baltimore Pike (entrance to Royal Farms).

The initial investigation has determined that a 2013 Jeep Wrangler, operated by a 27 year old Middletown man, was traveling northbound on Rt. 72, north of Old Baltimore Pike, in the area of the Royal Farms entrance, with the right of way. A 2007 Toyota Corolla, operated by a 63 year old Newark man, was traveling southbound on Rt. 72, attempting to turn left into the Royal Farms. The Toyota turned directly into the path of the Jeep at which time the vehicles collided. Both vehicles came to rest in the roadway.

The driver of the Toyota was transported to the Christiana Hospital in critical condition.

The driver of the Jeep was treated for non-life threatening injuries.

Northbound Rt. 72 was closed for approximately 90 minutes while the scene was investigated and cleared.

Troopers Investigating Fatal Crash-Seafood

Seafood- The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating a fatal crash that occurred earlier today.

The incident occurred on August 27, 2019 at approximately 9:51 a.m., when a 2017 Honda CRV and a 2011 Chevrolet Traverse were stopped on Atlanta Road west of Bucks Branch Road at the direction of a flagger, who was working in conjunction with a roadside tree maintenance company. A 2009 Dodge Ram Pick-up

truck was traveling westbound on Atlanta Road approaching the stopped vehicles at full speed. For unknown reasons the operator of the Pick-up truck failed to perceive the stopped vehicles and struck the rear of the Traverse. The impact caused the Traverse to strike the rear of the CRV. The Pick-up truck continued in a northwesterly direction and struck the right front of the CRV before driving off the north edge of the roadway into the roadside foliage.

The operator of the CRV, a 29-year-old female from Seaford, DE was properly restrained. She was transported to the Nanticoke Memorial Hospital with non-life threatening injuries. A one-year-old child was also in the vehicle, properly restrained and uninjured.

The operator of the Traverse, a 66-year-old female from Seaford, DE was properly restrained. She was transported to the Nanticoke Memorial Hospital where she was pronounced deceased. Her name is being withheld at this time pending the notification of next of kin.

The operator of the Dodge Ram, a 24-year-old male from Seaford, DE was not properly restrained. He was transported to the Nanticoke Memorial Hospital where he was treated and released with non-life threatening injuries.

Atlanta Road in the area of Bucks Branch Road was closed for approximately 3 hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

The crash continues remains under investigation by the Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit.

Millsboro Man Sought for Domestic Related Assault

Millsboro – The Delaware State Police are attempting to locate 30 year old Exequiel Osorto-Garcia of Millsboro, who is wanted in connection with a domestic related assault that occurred Saturday night.

On Saturday, August 24, 2019 at approximately 9:51 p.m., Troopers responded to the 29000 block of Iron Branch Rd., Millsboro, in reference to a domestic related stabbing incident. The investigation determined that Osorto-Garcia was involved in a verbal altercation with his wife, during which he produced a box-cutter knife and stabbed her in the abdomen. Osorto-Garcia fled the scene prior to the Troopers arrival and has not been located.

The entire incident took place in the presence of their two children who were not injured as a result of the incident. The female was treated and released from an area hospital with a minor laceration.

Osorto-Garcia has active warrants on file for the following charges:

- Assault 2nd Degree
- Possession of a Deadly Weapon during the Commission of a Felony
- Endangering the Welfare of a Child (2 counts)

Osorto-Garcia is described as a Hispanic male, 5'3"-5'4" tall,

weighing approximately 140-150 lbs. No photo is available at this time.
