

Troopers Arrest Blades Man For Assault on a Law Enforcement Officer-Blades

Blades- The Delaware State Police have arrested a Blades man after a domestic incident led to him resisting arrest and assaulting a law enforcement officer.

The incident occurred on June 4, 2019 at approximately 9:30 p.m., when Troopers were dispatched to a residence on East 6th Street, Blades, for a report of a domestic incident. Upon arrival, Troopers learned that 21-year-old **Deangelo McCafferty** had engaged in an altercation with his two younger (minor) siblings and his mother. The altercation led to McCafferty striking both his mother and one younger sibling. While Troopers attempted to take McCafferty into custody, he began to actively resist arrest. During the attempt to gain control of McCafferty, a Trooper was forced into the edge of the front door, causing the Trooper injury. Subsequently, McCafferty was taken into custody. The mother and sibling did not sustain injuries.

The Trooper was transported to the Nanticoke Memorial Hospital and treated and released with non-life threatening injuries.

McCafferty was transported back to Troop 5 where he was charged with the following:

- Assault 2nd Injure a Law Enforcement Officer
- Resisting Arrest
- Endangering the Welfare of a Child (2 counts)
- Offensive Touching (2 counts)

McCafferty was arraigned before the Justice of the Peace Court and committed to the Sussex Correctional Institution on \$7200.00 secured bond.

The 2019 event is the 33rd annual Torch Run, and in its history, Delaware Law Enforcement will have raised nearly \$8 million.

Special Olympics Delaware provides a year-round program of quality sports training and athletic competition for children and adults with intellectual disabilities and/or cognitive delays. A family of over 4,000 volunteers makes this program possible for the more than 4,200 athletes who compete in Special Olympics Delaware. The organization builds sports skills, confidence, strength, motivation, and self-esteem ... not just for the athletes, but for everyone involved.

This year's Torch Run will be a three-day event, starting in Rehoboth Beach on **Wednesday, June 12th** at 7:00 p.m. Live music by 33 1/3 will lead the gala Torch Run sendoff from the **Rehoboth Beach Bandstand** at 7:00 p.m.

On **Thursday, June 13th** the Torch will start at Delmar (6:00 a.m., Rt.13 and Rt.54), Lewes (6:30 a.m., Troop 7), and Georgetown (7:30 a.m., The Circle), and will travel to Milford, Harrington, and Dover where a brief stop will be held at Legislative Hall at 2:00 p.m., and then continue on to Smyrna and Odessa.

The event continues on **Friday, June 14th** from Troop 9 at 6:00 a.m., with the Torch proceeding to the Wilmington Police Headquarters in Wilmington for a 9:45 a.m. celebration. The event culminates with a final leg into the University of Delaware Bob Carpenter Center for the official opening of the [2019 Summer Games](#) where the **Special Olympics Flame of Hope** will be delivered.

Stolen Car Crashes in Delaware during Pursuit out of Maryland – Florida Woman Charged

Newark – The Delaware State Police have charged 22 year old Quelinda Hallam, of St. Petersburg, FL, with multiple offenses stemming from a pursuit that came into Delaware from Maryland on I-95, late Sunday night.

At approximately 10:55 p.m., Sunday, June 2, 2019 Delaware Troopers were advised by Maryland authorities that the Maryland State Police and Maryland Transportation Authority Police were in pursuit of a red, Ford Focus that was traveling I-95 northbound heading towards Delaware. The Ford had been reported as stolen out of St. Petersburg, FL.

At approximately 11:11 p.m., Delaware State Police units arrived on scene with the stolen Ford and a Maryland State Police vehicle that had been involved in a collision, on I-95 northbound in the area of Christiana Rd. (DE Rt. 273), and had become disabled. Hallam along with a 22 year old St. Petersburg, FL man, who was a passenger in the vehicle, had already been taken into custody. It was determined that during the pursuit, Hallam intentionally drove her vehicle into the Maryland Troopers vehicle, causing the collision.

Hallam and the male passenger were turned over to the custody of the Delaware State Police and then transported to Troop 6 for further investigation.

The Maryland Trooper, who is assigned to the JFK Highway Barracks, sustained minor injuries as a result of the crash. Hallam and her passenger were not injured.

Hallam was charged with Reckless Endangering 1st Degree (F), Receiving Stolen Property Greater than \$1500.00 (F) and Reckless Driving. She was arraigned in Justice of the Peace Court #11 and then committed to the Dolores J. Baylor Women's Correctional Institution in lieu of \$10,000.00 cash bail.

The 22 year old male passenger, who was not charged in regards to the pursuit, was charged with Criminal Contempt of a PFA (M), after it was determined that he had violated an order which had been issued out of the Sixth Judicial Circuit Court of Pinellas County, FL. He was subsequently committed to the Howard R. Young Correctional Institution in lieu of \$2500.00 cash bail.

Troopers Investigating Shooting Incident – Ellendale

Ellendale, Delaware – The Delaware State Police are currently investigating a shooting incident that occurred early this morning.

The incident occurred on Saturday, June 1, 2019, at approximately 1:01 a.m., when troopers were dispatched to the Gateway Tavern located at 12327 DuPont Boulevard, Ellendale for a report of a shooting. Upon arrival, Troopers located a 38-year-old male victim outside who stated he had been shot in the lower extremity by an unknown person. The victim was then transported by EMS with serious but non-life threatening injuries to a local area hospital.

It was reported the Tavern brought in several local rap artists to perform for the crowd and during the musical performance several fights broke out inside the bar then continued outside the establishment where multiple groups were engaging in fights at the same time. During the fights, several gunshots were heard outside and shortly after the victim was located in the parking lot with gunshot wounds. It is unknown the cause of the altercations.

There is no suspect information at this time.

Troopers Investigating Assault – Newark

Newark – The Delaware State Police are investigating an assault that took place in the parking lot of a Newark area Wawa, early Wednesday morning.

The incident occurred at approximately 12:50 a.m., Wednesday, May 29, 2019 in the parking lot of the Perch Creek Wawa, located at 2754 Pulaski Hwy., Newark. The 32 year old male victim was attempting to pull into one of the gas pumps when he was cut off by a dark colored SUV. While the victim's vehicle was being fueled, two male suspects exited the SUV and confronted him, at which time a verbal altercation took place. The two males then began to physically assault the victim by striking him multiple times, before fleeing. The victim was later treated at an area hospital for serious injuries to his head and face.

The suspects were described as follows:

Suspect #1: Black male, light complexion, mid 20's, 5'6" tall, stocky build, with long curly hair.

Suspect #2: Black male, dark complexion, 5'9" tall, thin

build.

The SUV was reportedly occupied by multiple other female subjects who were not actively involved in the assault.

Troopers Investigating Gas Station Robbery – New Castle

New Castle – The Delaware State Police are investigating the robbery of a New Castle area gas station that occurred Thursday morning.

The incident occurred at approximately 9:45 a.m., Thursday, May 30, 2019 at the Sunoco gas station, located at 285 Christiana Rd., New Castle. A masked suspect entered the business, confronted a female employee behind the sales counter and demanded money from the register. The employee complied with the demand by opening the register at which time the suspect reached in and removed an undisclosed amount of cash before fleeing. The employee was not injured as a result of the incident.

The suspect was described as a black male, 5'9"-5'11" tall, 180-195 lbs., wearing all grey clothing and a black mask.
