## **Troopers Investigating Fatal Hit and Run Pedestrian Crash – Wilmington**

*Wilmington* – The Delaware State Police have identified Kevin Price, 49, of Wilmington, as the pedestrian who was struck and killed by a hit and run vehicle, at approximately 1:50 a.m., Tuesday, February 26, 2019, on Governor Printz Blvd., just south of Seton Drive.

## **Troopers Investigating Fatal Hit and Run Pedestrian Crash – Wilmington**

*Wilmington* – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating a fatal hit and run crash involving a pedestrian that was reported at approximately 1:50 a.m., Tuesday, February 26, 2019.

The initial investigation has determined that an unknown vehicle was traveling southbound on Governor Printz Blvd. in the right lane, just south of Seton Drive, and struck a 49 year old Wilmington man, who was walking in the roadway. The victim was thrown in a southerly direction, coming to rest on the right shoulder of southbound Governor Printz Blvd. The striking vehicle then fled the scene without stopping.

The victim was discovered by a passing motorist so an exact

time of the crash is unknown at this time.

The victim, who was pronounced deceased at the scene, was wearing all dark clothing, with no reflective material and was not carrying a light. Impairment on his behalf is undetermined at this time.

The southbound lanes of Governor Printz Blvd. were closed for approximately 3 hours while the scene was investigated and cleared.

# Trooper Seek Public's Assistance in Locating Rape Suspect

**Selbyville-** The Delaware State Police are currently investigating a sexual assault incident and are seeking the public's assistance in locating the suspect.

The incident occurred on February 22, 2019 at approximately 10:00 p.m., when Troopers responded to a local area hospital and made contact with a 17-year old female victim who reported that she had been sexually assaulted. Further investigation revealed that the victim was at a residence in Selbyville when she had been sexually assaulted, strangled, physically assaulted and held against her will, by the suspect, identified as 23-year-old **Xavier Aiken** of Milton, DE.

Troopers have been unable to locate Aiken who currently has active warrants out of Troop 4 for the following:

- Rape First Degree
- Rape Second Degree
- Kidnapping First Degree
- Assault Second Degree
- Strangulation

# Trooper Dragged by Vehicle While Directing Traffic – Wilmington

*Wilmington* – The Delaware State Police are searching for the driver of a vehicle that injured a Trooper while he was directing traffic Monday afternoon.

The incident began at approximately 1:48 p.m., Monday, February 25, 2019 as the Trooper, an 18 year veteran assigned to Troop 6, was out of his vehicle, manually directing traffic at the intersection of Kirkwood Hwy., and Farrand Dr., due to the lights malfunctioning.

Soon after beginning the traffic detail, the Trooper encountered a dark colored SUV, and had an interaction with the driver as the vehicle was stopped. During this interaction the vehicle drove off, dragging the Trooper approximately one tenth of a mile, before he was separated from the vehicle, coming to rest in a grass median on Farrand Dr., at the entrance to Kirkwood Gardens. The vehicle then fled the scene without stopping.

The Trooper was transported to the Christiana Hospital where he was treated for non-life threatening injuries.

## **Troopers Investigating Serious Crash SR 1 – Smyrna**

**Smyrna** – The Delaware State Police are continuing to investigate a serious crash involving two vehicles that took place on State Route 1 in Smyrna, late Saturday afternoon.

The initial investigation has determined that a 2007 Chevrolet Impala was travelling southbound on State Rt. 1 approaching the State Rt. 6 overpass when for an unknown reason the vehicle traveled into the center grass median. The Chevy began

to spin counter-clockwise as it crossed the median, continuing into the SR 1 northbound lanes, and directly into the path of a 2019 Toyota Tacoma, driven by a Pennsylvania man. The front end of the Toyota struck the passenger side of the Chevy, pushing it northbound for a short distance before both vehicles came to a stop in the center of the roadway.

The Chevy was occupied by four male subjects. The driver and right front passenger of the Chevy were transported to the Christiana Hospital in critical condition. A left rear passenger was transported to the Christiana Hospital in stable condition. The right rear passenger was transported to Kent General Hospital in stable condition.

The driver and sole occupant of the Toyota was transported to the Christiana Hospital in stable condition.

The investigation is in the very early stages with further details being released as they become available.

State Route 1 northbound was closed for approximately 4 hours while the scene was investigated and cleared.

# Troopers Investigating North Wilmington Bank Robbery

# Clerk Stabbed during Robbery Attempt – Newark

*Newark (19702)* – The Delaware State Police are investigating the robbery of a Newark area Dollar General store in which a clerk was stabbed.

The incident occurred at approximately 8:56 p.m., Thursday, February 21, 2019 at the Dollar General located at 1154 Pulaski Hwy., Newark. A male suspect loaded a shopping cart with assorted merchandise and exited the business without paying. An employee of the business confronted the suspect outside the business and attempted to recover the merchandise. A brief struggle ensued over possession of the shopping cart at which time the suspect produced a knife and stabbed the victim in the knee. The suspect then relinquished possession of the cart and fled on foot towards Pulaski Hwy., without any property. The victim sustained a minor laceration to his knee and was treated at Christiana Hospital.

The suspect was described as a black male, 40-45 years of age, 5'9" tall, 230 pounds, wearing a dark colored sweatshirt, blue jeans and a dark colored hat.
