

Troopers Investigate Stabbing Incident-Lincoln

Lincoln– The Delaware State Police are investigating a domestic related incident that led to a stabbing.

The incident occurred on February 16, 2019 at approximately 6:04 p.m., when Troopers were dispatched to the 200 block of Cedar Drive for an initial report of a domestic involving a stabbing. Further investigation revealed that a 36-year-old female had been stabbed numerous times by her 39-year-old husband. The suspect fled the scene prior to police arrival and was later located in a nearby park deceased.

The victim was initially transported to the Bayhealth Hospital, Sussex Campus and later transferred to the Christiana Hospital in stable condition.

The 39-year-old individual has been turned over to the Delaware Division of Forensic Science where an autopsy will be performed to determine the manner and cause of death.

Due to the sensitive nature of this case and in consideration for the victim, only limited information will be released.

***UPDATE* Troopers Still Searching for Missing 4 Year Old, Warrant Issued for Mother**

New Castle – The Delaware State Police are attempting to locate four year old Aliyah Fassett, and have issued an arrest warrant for her biological mother, 37 year old Andrea Brickhouse, for failing to relinquish custody.

On October 16, 2018, New Castle County Family Court issued an order granting custody of Aliyah to the Division of Family Services (DFS). Brickhouse was advised of the ruling but has refused to comply with numerous requests to meet with DFS caseworkers, to turn over custody. Attempts to locate Brickhouse have since been unsuccessful.

Aliyah is described as a black female, 3'00" tall and weighs approximately 30 lbs. No photograph available.

Brickhouse is known to frequent the Wilton area of New Castle and also has ties to the City of Wilmington. Information

obtained by DFS advised that Aliyah was last seen with Brickhouse on today's date in the 2000 block of N. Market St., Wilmington.

A warrant is on file charging Brickhouse with one count of Interference of Custody of a Child Under the Age of 16.

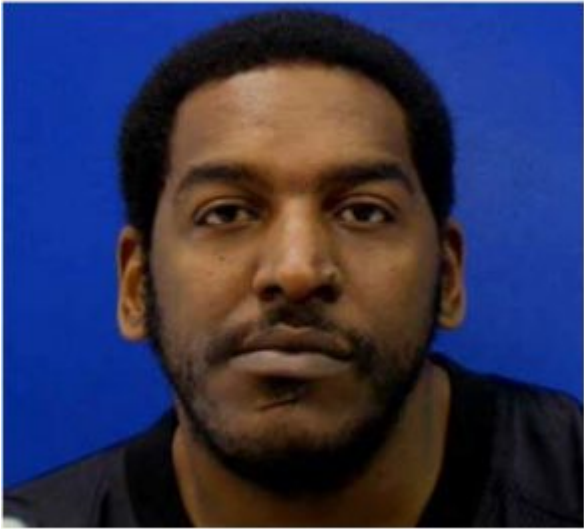

***UPDATE - Second Suspect Identified, Sought* Troopers Investigating Assault – Pike Creek**

Wilmington – The Delaware State Police have identified and issued warrants for Russell E. Brittingham, 56 of Chestertown, MD as the second suspect involved in an assault that took place in the parking lot of Goldey Beacom College on Monday, February 11. Brittingham, along with Ralph A. Cruz, also of Chestertown, assaulted the 20 year old male victim after learning that he was involved in an alleged altercation with an acquaintance of theirs. During the assault Brittingham was in possession of a knife.

Warrants are currently on file charging Brittingham with Assault 2nd Degree, Aggravated Menacing, Possession of a Deadly Weapon during the Commission of a Felony and Conspiracy 2nd Degree.

Cruz has not been located as of yet and still has active warrants for Assault 2nd Degree and Conspiracy 2nd Degree.

Detectives Conducting Homicide Investigation - Harrington

Harrington— The Delaware State Police are conducting an investigation into a homicide that occurred last evening.

On February 14, 2019 at approximately 11:40 p.m. the Harrington Police Department responded to an apartment in the 8700 block of Park Brown Road. Upon arrival, a victim was located at the base of the interior staircase suffering from a gunshot wound to his torso. The victim, a 24-year-old male from Absecon, NJ was transported to the Milford Hospital where he was pronounced deceased. At the request of the Harrington Police Department, the Delaware State Police Homicide Unit assumed the investigation.

There is no suspect information at this time. This incident continues to remain under investigation by the Homicide

Unit and further information will be released as it becomes available.
