

Troopers Investigating Assault – Pike Creek

Wilmington – The Delaware State Police are investigating an assault that took place in the parking lot of Goldey Beacom College, Monday afternoon and are asking for help in locating the suspect.

The incident occurred at approximately 1:38 p.m., Monday, February 11, 2019 in the parking lot of Goldey Beacom College, located at 4701 Limestone Rd., Wilmington. A 20 year old male subject was confronted in the parking lot by a suspect later identified as Ralph A. Cruz, 42, of Chestertown MD. Cruz proceeded to knock the victim to the ground and then struck him repeatedly with his closed fist. After the assault Cruz entered into a vehicle that was occupied by multiple other subjects, which fled onto Limestone Rd. The victim was treated at the Christiana Hospital for serious, non-life threatening injuries.

Further investigation determined that the assault was not a random act but that the victim was specifically targeted due to a prior alleged altercation with an acquaintance of Cruz.

Cruz is described as a black male, 6'1" tall, 205 lbs.

Troopers Investigating Armed Robbery – Wilmington

Wilmington – The Delaware State Police are investigating a robbery that occurred Tuesday evening, in which the victim was assaulted and robbed by multiple suspects.

On Tuesday, February 12, 2019 at approximately 7:21 p.m., a 31 year old male subject was in the parking lot of the Canby Park

Shopping Center, located at 1900 Maryland Ave., when he was offered a ride. The victim entered a gray Nissan Altima, which was occupied by four other subjects, and then driven to Saint Patrick's Cemetery which is located in the 1500 block of Ashland Clinton School Rd., in Hockessin. Once at the cemetery two male suspects, one armed with a handgun and the other with a knife, forced the victim out of the vehicle. Once outside the vehicle the victim complied with the suspect's orders to remove his jacket, sweatshirt and shoes. The suspects then proceeded to go through the victims pockets and removed his wallet and cell phone. After obtaining the property, the suspects proceeded to physically assault the victim. After the suspects fled the area the victim ran to a nearby residence where he was able to call 911. The victim was treated at an area hospital for non-life threatening injuries.

The suspects were described as follows:

- **Suspect #1**: Black male, 20-22 years of age, 5'8"-6'00", 160-180 lbs., wearing all dark clothing and in possession of a black handgun.
- **Suspect #2**: White male, 20-22 years of age, 5'5"-5'8", 150-160 lbs., wearing a dark jacket, blue jeans and in possession of a knife.
- **Suspect#3**: White female, 20-22 years of age, short, heavy set, wearing all gray clothing.
- **Suspect #4**: White female, 20-22 years of age, tall and thin, wearing a gray sweatshirt and blue jeans.

Wilmington – The Delaware State Police are investigating an incident in which an unknown suspect videotaped a female victim while she was changing in the fitting room of a north Wilmington clothing store.

The incident occurred at approximately 8:15 p.m., Friday, February 1, 2019 at the H&M store located in the Concord Mall, 4737 Concord Pike. The above pictured suspect held what appeared to be a small camera over the partition of a fitting room stall, adjacent to the stall occupied by the victim. When the victim observed the camera the suspect fled on foot and was last seen exiting the east doors of the mall.

The suspect was described as an Asian male, 25-35 years old, fair complexion, 5'08'', medium build, clean shaven, wearing glasses.

Troopers Investigating Armed Robbery – North Wilmington

Wilmington – The Delaware State Police are investigating the armed robbery of a north Wilmington Walgreen's that took place Monday night.

The incident occurred at approximately 9:18 p.m., Monday, February 11, 2019 at the Walgreen's pharmacy, located at 802 Philadelphia Pike. A disguised suspect brandishing a handgun, confronted a male employee on the sales floor, escorted him to the sales counter at gunpoint and then ordered him to open the cash registers. The employee complied with the demand at which

time the suspect removed an undisclosed amount of cash before fleeing on foot, in an unknown direction. The employee was not injured as a result of the incident.

The suspect was described as a black male, 5'8", 220 lbs., wearing a dark hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans with a light colored fabric covering his face.

Troopers Investigating Pharmacy Robbery – North Wilmington

Wilmington – The Delaware State Police are investigating the robbery of a north Wilmington Walgreens that took place Saturday night.

The incident occurred at approximately 9:41 p.m., Saturday, February 9, 2019 at the Walgreen's pharmacy, located at 1508 Philadelphia Pike, Wilmington. A male suspect confronted an employee on the sales floor, implied he had a weapon and threatened to shoot him. The employee was then directed to the sales counter where complied with the suspect's demand to open the cash register. Once open, the suspect removed an undisclosed amount of cash before fleeing on foot. The employee was not injured as a result of the incident.

The suspect was described as a black male, 5'8" tall, 220 lbs., wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt and dark pants.

Trooper Struck by Stolen Vehicle – New Castle Man Charged

Wilmington (19808) – The Delaware State Police have charged 38 year old Cam L. Herring of New Castle with multiple felonies,

to include assault of a law enforcement officer, after he stole a vehicle Friday morning.

On Friday, February 8, 2019 at approximately 9:22 a.m., Troopers responded to the Citgo gas station, located at 3625 Kirkwood Hwy., Wilmington, for the report of a stolen motor vehicle. The investigating Trooper determined that a 2008 Chevy Impala had been left running and unoccupied in the parking lot while the owner entered the business to make a purchase. Upon returning to the lot, the owner discovered the vehicle was missing.

Information obtained by the Trooper during the course of the investigation determined that the vehicle was currently in the development of Coventry in New Castle. At approximately 11:54 a.m., while searching the area, the Trooper located the stolen vehicle in the 100 block of W. Edinburgh Dr. The Trooper exited his patrol vehicle and approached the Impala at which time the operator and sole occupant, later identified as Herring, accelerated, striking the Trooper as he fled. Multiple units, to include officers from the New Castle County Police Department and the Delaware State Police helicopter began a search of the area. A short time later the stolen Impala was located, unoccupied in the unit block of Dunsinane Dr.

At this same time multiple 911 calls were being received describing a white male subject attempting to access multiple residences on Dunsinane Dr. While canvassing the one block area Troopers were flagged down by a female who advised that an unknown male subject had entered her residence and was hiding in the attic. At approximately 12:25 p.m., a Delaware State Police K-9 unit entered the residence at which time Herring surrendered and was taken in to custody without incident.

Further investigation determined that Herring attempted to make access to two other residences before successfully accessing the location where he was apprehended.

The injured Trooper, who is assigned to Troop 6 was treated and released from an area hospital with minor injuries.

Herring was transported to Troop 2 where he was charged with the following:

- Possession of a Deadly Weapon during the Commission of a Felony
- Assault 2nd Degree (assault of law enforcement officer)
- Theft of Motor Vehicle
- Burglary 2nd Degree
- Attempted Burglary 2nd Degree (2 counts)
- Resisting Arrest
- Criminal Mischief less than \$1000.00 (2 counts)

Herring was arraigned in Justice of the Peace Court #2 and then committed to the Howard R. Young Correctional Institution in lieu of \$73,000.00 secured bail.
