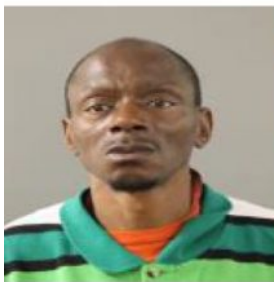

Recent Phone Spoofing Scam Advisory

Dover – The Delaware State Police are issuing the following advisory in response to a recent phone scams involving a “spoofed phone number”.

The Delaware State Police were made aware of multiple incidents in which individuals received a phone call advising that they were under investigation. The caller asked the individuals to verify all of their information, and threatened to “put a hold on their Social Security number” if they did not comply. The call is appearing on caller ID as a Delaware State Police issued phone number. The caller suggested to the victims to look up the phone number in which they

are calling from so that the victims would see that it is in fact a Delaware State Police issued phone number.

A second scam incident was also reported today in which the caller identified themselves as the "Delaware State Police Alliance" requesting donations on behalf of the Delaware State Police. The call appears on caller ID to be originating from a Frankford area phone number.

Caller ID spoofing is when a caller deliberately falsifies the information transmitted to your caller ID display to disguise their identity. Spoofing is often used as part of an attempt to trick someone into giving away valuable personal information so it can be used in fraudulent activity or sold illegally.

The Federal Communications Commissions has provided the following tips to avoid spoofing scams:

You may not be able to tell right away if an incoming call is spoofed. Be extremely careful about responding to any request for personal identifying information.

- Don't answer calls from unknown numbers. If you answer such a call, hang up immediately.
- If you answer the phone and the caller – or a recording – asks you to hit a button to stop getting the calls, you should just hang up. Scammers often use this trick to identify potential targets.
- Do not respond to any questions, especially those that can be answered with "Yes" or "No."
- Never give out personal information such as account numbers, Social Security numbers, mother's maiden names, passwords or other identifying information in response to unexpected calls or if you are at all suspicious.
- If you get an inquiry from someone who says they represent a company or a government agency, hang up and

call the phone number on your account statement, in the phone book, or on the company's or government agency's website to verify the authenticity of the request. You will usually get a written statement in the mail before you get a phone call from a legitimate source, particularly if the caller is asking for a payment.

- Use caution if you are being pressured for information immediately.
- If you have a voice mail account with your phone service, be sure to set a password for it. Some voicemail services are preset to allow access if you call in from your own phone number. A hacker could spoof your home phone number and gain access to your voice mail if you do not set a password.
- Talk to your phone company about call blocking tools they may have and check into apps that you can download to your mobile device to block unwanted calls. Information on available robocall blocking tools is available at [fcc.gov/robocalls](https://www.fcc.gov/robocalls).

Troopers Investigating Serious Crash Involving a Pedestrian – New Castle

New Castle – The Delaware State Police are investigating a serious motor vehicle crash involving a pedestrian that occurred at approximately 10:26 p.m., Thursday, January 31, 2019, on I-495 northbound, north of Rogers Rd.

The initial investigation has determined that an unidentified male pedestrian was attempting to cross the I-495 northbound lanes from the right shoulder towards the center median when he was struck in the left travel lane by a 2008 Pontiac G6, operated by a 37 year old Wilmington man.

The pedestrian was transported to the Christiana Hospital in critical condition. Impairment on his behalf is undetermined at this time.

The driver of the Pontiac along with a 30 year old female, front seat passenger were treated for minor injuries.

Neither speed nor impairment are contributing factors on behalf of the driver.

I-495 northbound was closed for approximately 2.5 hours while the scene was investigated and cleared.

Troopers Investigating Armed Robbery – Wilmington

Wilmington (19808) – The Delaware State Police are investigating an armed robbery that took place at a Wilmington area cellular store, Thursday afternoon.

The incident occurred at approximately 1:37 p.m., Thursday, January 31, 2019 at the Metro PCS store, located at 3608 Kirkwood Hwy., Wilmington. A disguised suspect approached an employee at the sales counter, displayed a handgun and demanded money from the register. The employee complied with the demand by turning over an undisclosed amount of cash to the suspect who then fled the business via a rear door. The employee was not injured as a result of the incident.

The suspect was described as a white male, 5'10"-6'00" tall, thin build, approximately 30 years of age, wearing all black clothing to include a covering over his face and in possession of a handgun.

No surveillance images are available at this time.

Suspect Still At Large-Laurel

***Update 2* Troopers Seek Public's Assistance In Locating Shooting Suspect- Seaford**

Seaford- The Delaware State Police are seeking the public's assistance in attempting to locate 32-year-old **Teron West** who is wanted in connection with a shooting incident that occurred in November 2018.

The incident occurred on Sunday, November 18, 2018, at approximately 11:57 a.m. when troopers were dispatched to a residence located in the 11000 block of Park Drive for a

report of shots fired.

Further investigation revealed that a physical altercation occurred between two male subjects and during the argument several shots were fired at a vehicle leaving the scene. All of the subjects involved in the incident fled prior to Troopers arrival.

Through investigative measures, 32-year-old **Teron West** of Seaford was developed as a suspect. Troopers have been unable to locate West who currently has active warrants for the following:

- Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony
- Possession of a Firearm or Ammunition by a Person Prohibited
- Reckless Endanger First Degree
- Aggravated Menacing

This incident remains under investigation by the Delaware State Police Criminal Investigations Unit.
