

Troopers Investigating University Plaza Parking Lot Robbery

Newark – The Delaware State Police are investigating a robbery that took place in the parking lot of the University Plaza Shopping Center on Sunday evening.

The incident occurred at approximately 6:55 p.m., Sunday, January 20, 2019, in the parking lot adjacent to the Wendy's restaurant, located at 90 University Plaza, Newark. A 16 year old male had just exited his vehicle, intending to enter the Wendy's when he was approached from behind by a suspect who placed an object in his back and demanded property. Believing the object to be a gun, the victim complied with the demand and turned over his wallet to the suspect who then fled on foot. The victim was not injured as a result of the incident.

The suspect could only be described as a male, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans.

Troopers Investigating Knifepoint Robbery – North Wilmington

Wilmington (19809) – The Delaware State Police are investigating the knifepoint robbery of a north Wilmington pharmacy that took place Sunday evening.

The incident occurred at approximately 6:20 p.m., Sunday, January 20, 2019 at the Walgreens's pharmacy, located at 1508 Philadelphia Pike, Wilmington. A male suspect with his face concealed, approached the sales counter and proceeded to make

a purchase. Once the clerk opened the register to complete the transaction the suspect displayed a knife and demanded money from the register. The suspect then reached in to the cash drawer and removed an undisclosed amount of cash before fleeing the business in an unknown direction. The employee was not injured as a result of the incident.

The suspect was described as a black male, 40-45 years of age with a large build, wearing all dark clothing to include a covering over his face and a hat.

Troopers Investigating Shooting-Coverdale Crossroads, Bridgeville

Bridgeville, Delaware – The Delaware State Police are currently investigating a shooting that occurred this evening in Coverdale Crossroads, Bridgeville.

The incident was reported around 5:44 p.m. Sunday, January 20, 2019 when the victim was driving south on Coverdale Road north Hastings Farm Road. The suspect vehicle approached the victim's vehicle from behind and fired multiple rounds at the victim's vehicle causing it to crash. The operator, 36-year-old male and his passenger 35-year-old female were transported to an area hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

The suspect then fled the scene. At this time, no suspects have been developed.

Delaware State Police Arrest Multiple Suspects in Vehicle Thefts – New Castle

New Castle, Delaware – The Delaware State Police have arrested eight during the investigation of several auto thefts in New Castle County.

Detectives assigned to the Delaware State Police Troop 2 Criminal Investigation Unit continue to investigate a pattern of auto thefts in New Castle County and have determined nine separate incidents have occurred dating back to October 31, 2018 to as recently as January 15, 2019. The vehicle thefts occurred at the Trans Cargo, LLC located at 170 Pigeon Point Road and the AutoPort, Inc. located at 203 Pigeon Point Road, New Castle.

During each incident, the suspects stole vehicles or attempted to do so by either climbing over or under fencing. Suspects then entered parked vehicles stored on the lot with keys inside and drove them off the property. Suspects have driven the vehicles through open gates, secured gates and through sections of fence with no gate. In one incident, suspects stole three vehicles by ramming an occupied security truck that was blocking the gate. In most cases where a vehicle has been used to ram a secured gate, the vehicle has become disabled and left at the scene. In other cases, vehicles have run out of gas while attempting to flee onto northbound I-495. There was a total of 38 vehicles stolen with approximately half of the stolen vehicles recovered.

On January 19th, 2019, troopers observed a silver Toyota

Corolla with five subjects exiting the vehicle. Those five suspects then scaled the perimeter fence and entered the secured yard of Trans Cargo in an attempt to remove a vehicle. Delaware State Police Troopers then attempted to apprehend all suspects as they fled on foot. After fleeing, troopers were able to successfully locate and apprehend all five suspects. Additionally, the three remaining suspects inside the silver Toyota Corolla were apprehended after they initially attempted to flee in the vehicle. A search warrant was conducted on the suspect vehicle and a handgun was found with other evidence linking the suspects to the other vehicle thefts.

These following nine incidents listed have occurred between hours of 2:00 p.m. and 1:40 a.m.:

October 31, 2018 – Trans Cargo, LLC 170 Pigeon Point Road, New Castle, Delaware

*Suspects drove vehicle through secured gate.

November 5, 2018 – Trans Cargo, LLC 170 Pigeon Point Road, New Castle, Delaware

*Suspects drove vehicles through open gate.

November 6, 2018 – Trans Cargo, LLC 170 Pigeon Point Road, New Castle, Delaware *Suspects drove vehicles through open gate.

November 16, 2018 – Trans Cargo, LLC 170 Pigeon Point Road, New Castle, Delaware *Suspects entered fenced in property and attempted theft only.

December 2, 2018 – Trans Cargo, LLC 170 Pigeon Point Road, New Castle, Delaware *Suspects drove vehicles through secured gate.

December 20, 2018 – Trans Cargo, LLC 170 Pigeon Point Road, New Castle, Delaware *Suspects rammed security truck and drove out through open gate.

January 13, 2019 – Auto Port, INC / 203 Pigeon Point Road, New

Castle, Delaware *Suspects drove vehicles through secured gate.

January 15, 2019 – Auto Port, INC / 203 Pigeon Point Road, New Castle, Delaware *Suspects drove vehicle through fence.

January 15, 2019 – Trans Cargo, LLC 170 Pigeon Point Road, New Castle, Delaware *Suspects opened gate and then drove vehicles off the lot.

*Those suspects were identified and transported to Troop 2 for processing. All suspects were arraigned before Justice of the Peace Court 11 and all were committed.

Arielle Rice, 15 and Autumn Rice, 17 both of Drexil Hill, Pennsylvania were charged with Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony, Possess Purchase Own or Control of a Firearm (Handgun) by Prohibited Juvenile, Attempted to Commit Theft of a Motor Vehicle, Conspiracy Second Degree-Agreement to Engage in Felony Criminal Conduct and Resisting Arrest. Both arraigned with a parent and were committed to the New Castle County detention center in default of \$24,500.00 secured bond.

Muhnir Bey-Stockton, 15 of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania was charged with Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony, Possess, Purchase, Own or Control of a Firearm (Handgun) by Prohibited Juvenile, Attempted to Commit Theft of a Motor Vehicle, Conspiracy Second Degree-Agreement to Engage in Felony Criminal Conduct, Resisting Arrest and Criminal Trespass Second Degree. He was arraigned with a parent, and committed to the New Castle County Detention Center in default of \$25,000.00 secured bond.

Markell Grasty, 17 of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania was charged with Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony, Possess, Purchase, Own or Control of a Firearm (Handgun) by Prohibited Juvenile, Attempted to Commit Theft of a Motor Vehicle, Conspiracy Second Degree-Agreement to Engage

in Felony Criminal Conduct, Resisting Arrest and Criminal Trespass Second Degree. He was committed to the New Castle County Detention Center in default of \$53,000.00 secured bond.

Yameen Mofield, 16 of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania was charged with Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony, Possess Purchase, Own or Control of a Firearm (Handgun) by Prohibited Juvenile, Attempted to Commit Theft of a Motor Vehicle, Conspiracy Second Degree-Agreement to Engage in Felony Criminal Conduct and Resisting Arrest. He was committed to the New Castle County Detention Center in default of \$75,000.00 cash bail.

Menaje Schell, 15 of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania was charged with Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony, Possess, Purchase, Own or Control of a Firearm (Handgun) by Prohibited Juvenile, Attempted to Commit Theft of a Motor Vehicle, Conspiracy Second Degree-Agreement to Engage in Felony Criminal Conduct, Resisting Arrest and Criminal Trespass Second Degree. He was committed to New Castle County Detention Center in default of \$53,000.00 cash bail.

Ahseen Campbell-Watts, 17 of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania was charged with Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony, Possess, Purchase, Own or Control of a Firearm (Handgun) by Prohibited Juvenile, Attempted to Commit Theft of a Motor Vehicle, Conspiracy Second Degree-Agreement to Engage in Felony Criminal Conduct, Resisting Arrest and Criminal Trespass Second Degree. He was committed to New Castle County Detention Center in default of \$53,000.00 secured bail. (Photo not available at this time)

Namir McFarland, 18 of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania was charged with Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony, Attempt to Commit Theft of a Motor Vehicle, Conspiracy Second Degree-Agreement to Engage in Felony Criminal Conduct, Resisting Arrest and Criminal Trespass Second Degree. He was committed to the Howard R. Young Correctional Institution in

default of \$30,100.00 secured bail.

Troopers Investigating Fatal

Crash – Newark

Newark, Delaware – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating a fatal crash that occurred on Saturday, January 19, 2019 at approximately 8:30 p.m., in which one driver has succumb to his injuries.

The incident occurred when a 2009 Infiniti G37 was initially traveling northbound on Polly Drummond Road just south of Foxfire Drive, Newark. A 2017 Jeep Wrangler was traveling southbound on Polly Drummond Road near the intersection of Foxfire Drive. As the Infiniti G37 continued northbound, the operator failed to keep his vehicle in the northbound lane and drifted into the path of the Jeep. The operator of the Jeep did not have time to maneuver his vehicle to avoid the head-on collision. After impact, both vehicles remained disabled in the roadway across the north and southbound lanes.

As a result of the crash, both operators and sole occupants of their vehicles were transported to the Christiana Hospital for their injuries. The operator of the Infiniti G37, Lamar R. Elam 41 of Wilmington, succumbed to his injuries within the emergency room and was pronounced deceased. He was seat belted at the time of the collision and impairment on his behalf is undetermined at this time.

The operator of the Jeep Wrangler, 44 of Newark, sustained non-life threatening injuries. Impairment on his behalf is not being considered a factor in the collision

Polly Drummond Road in the area of Foxfire Drive was closed for approximately three hours as the crash was investigated and cleared. The crash remains under investigation by the Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit.

Preparing for Pending Inclement Weather

This weekend into Monday morning, Delaware may experience rain with extremely cold Arctic winter air. The combination of freezing rain and the extremely low temperatures Sunday night into Monday morning could cause dangerous road conditions.

Delaware State Police statewide continue to plan and prepare for the forecasted winter weather, as we will be ready and available to patrol, assist disabled vehicles, and manage roadway incidents and hazards for the duration of the event. Most calls for service received by Troopers during winter weather are for vehicle crashes, disabled vehicles, and abandoned vehicles which cause a major problem for DelDOT snow removal and brining trucks and equipment, as well as for Troopers responding to emergency situations. Troopers strongly encourage motorists to avoid unnecessary travel. Troopers urge all motorists who must travel to use extreme caution as road and weather conditions may change rapidly over the course of the event:

- Motorists should be prepared for snow-covered and slippery roads, along with strong winds and limited visibility which make driving conditions difficult.
- Use caution while driving when approaching intersections and off ramps, especially bridges and overpasses.
- Remember to reduce speed and increase following distance between vehicles.
- Allow ample time to reach your destination, allow extra space between vehicles, and keep vehicle headlights on to increase visibility.

Avoid unnecessary travel and please keep in mind that part of

our state may get a snow mix or freezing rain. Give DelDOT crews safe distance as they will be working to make Delaware roads safer.
