

UPDATE **Troopers** **Investigating** **Fatal** **Pedestrian Crash – North** **Wilmington**

Wilmington – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing to investigate a fatal motor vehicle crash involving a pedestrian that occurred at approximately 5:19 p.m., Monday, January 7, 2019 on Philadelphia Pike just north of Beverly place, Wilmington.

The initial investigation has determined that a 1986 Chevy Caprice, being driven by a 51 year old Wilmington man was traveling northbound in the right lane of Philadelphia Pike, north of Beverly Place which is just north of Marsh Rd. A 58 year old Wilmington man was attempting to cross Philadelphia Pike in an undetermined direction when he was struck by the front right corner of the Chevy and thrown to the pavement, where he came to rest. The Chevy came to a stop just north of the spot of the collision.

The pedestrian who was pronounced deceased at the scene, was not utilizing a crosswalk, was not wearing any reflective clothing nor carrying a light. Impairment on his behalf is undetermined at this time. Identification is pending notification of next of kin.

The driver of the Chevy was wearing his seatbelt and was not injured. Neither speed nor impairment are factors on his behalf.

The northbound lanes of Philadelphia Pike were closed for approximately 3 hours while the scene was investigated and cleared.

***Update - Victim's Name Released* Conducting Homicide Investigation - Dover Detectives**

Dover- The Delaware State Police are releasing the name of the victim who was involved in the shooting during the reported home invasion at Kentwood Mobile Home Park as 30-year-old **Jesse Stanford** of Cambridge, MD.

The incident occurred on January 5, 2019 at approximately 5:57 p.m. when Troopers were dispatched to the 200 block of Kentwood Drive, Kentwood Mobile Home Park for a report of a home invasion and shooting. Upon arrival, it was discovered that a 30-year-old male had sustained a gunshot wound to his upper body.

Stanford was transported to a local area hospital in serious condition where he succumb to his injuries last evening.

Troopers Investigating Knifepoint Gas Station Robbery – Wilmington

Wilmington (19808) – The Delaware State Police are investigating the knifepoint robbery of a Wilmington area gas station that took place early this morning.

The incident occurred at approximately 2:16 a.m., Monday, January 7, 2019 at the Valero gas station located at 1327 McKennan's Church Rd., Wilmington. A male suspect with his face concealed and brandishing a knife, confronted an employee behind the sales counter and ordered him to open the register. The employee complied with the demand by opening the register at which time the suspect removed an undisclosed amount of cash. The suspect also took multiple packs of cigarettes before exiting the business where he then entered into an awaiting vehicle which was parked at the entrance doors. The employee was not injured as a result of the incident.

The suspect was described as a white male, 20-25 years of age, 5'7" tall, wearing a red hooded sweatshirt, light colored pants and a cloth covering his face. He entered the front passenger seat of a dark gray Chevy Malibu, bearing an unknown Delaware tag, which was being driven by an unknown suspect.

Troopers Investigating Home Invasion/Shooting- Dover

Dover (19901)– The Delaware State Police are investigating a report of home invasion in which one individual was shot last evening.

The incident occurred on January 5, 2019 at approximately 5:57 p.m. when Troopers were dispatched to the 200 block of Kentwood Drive, Kentwood Mobile Home Park for a report of a home invasion and shooting. Upon arrival, it was discovered that a 30-year-old male had sustained a gunshot wound to his upper body.

Further investigation revealed that two unknown suspects had entered the residence. Upon the victim being shot, both suspects fled the scene. There were two other adult individuals in the residence during this incident. Both individuals were not injured.

The 30-year-old victim from Cambridge, MD was transported to a local area hospital in serious condition.

The suspects fled the residence without obtaining any property.

Becoming aware of your status now, provides you with the opportunity to turn yourself in voluntarily and resolve the issue as opposed to being inconvenienced in the future. The warrants available in this database consist of warrants issued by the courts of Delaware. Recent changes in the status of the warrants may not be reflected in this online database. Do not attempt to make an arrest based on this warrant information. Only law enforcement officers can arrest a person for an outstanding warrant.

Troopers Investigating Royal Farms Robbery – Newark

Newark (19713) – The Delaware State Police are investigating the robbery of a Newark area Royal Farms that took place early
