

Troopers Investigating Armed Robbery – Wilmington



Wilmington (19808) – The Delaware State Police are investigating the armed robbery of a Wilmington area Valero gas station that occurred overnight.

The incident occurred at approximately 3:35 a.m., Tuesday, September 18, 2018 at the Valero gas station located at 1327 McKennans Church Rd., Wilmington. A lone male suspect, with his face concealed and brandishing a handgun, approached an employee at the sales counter and demanded cash and cigarettes. The employee complied with the demands by turning over an undisclosed amount of cash and multiple packs of cigarettes to the suspect who then exited the business and fled on foot towards McKennans Church Rd. The employee was not injured as a result of the incident.

The suspect is described as a white male, 5'7"-5'10", 150-160 lbs., wearing all dark clothing, too include a face covering and in possession of a handgun.

No surveillance images are available at this time.

***UPDATE #3-Driver Succumbs to Injuries* Troopers Investigating Crash Involving a Motorcycle – Philadelphia Pike**

Douglas was originally admitted to the Christiana Hospital in critical condition, however on Friday, September 14, 2018 Douglas succumbed to injuries sustained in the crash and was pronounced deceased.

Shots Fired Complaint Leads

to Two Arrests-Marydel

Marydel/Felton- The Delaware State Police have arrested two suspects following a shots fired complaint.

The incident occurred on Saturday, September 15, 2018 at approximately 1:17 p.m., when Troopers were dispatched to the 300 block of Grygo Road, Marydel for a shots fired complaint. Upon arrival, Troopers learned that **Anthony Jones**, 44 of Smyrna, had responded to the residence looking for his ex-girlfriend who was not there at the time. Prior to leaving the residence, Jones had discharged a firearm that he was carrying, striking the exterior of the house. Jones fled the scene in a Honda Civic.

Troopers located the vehicle at the intersection of Holly Spring Road and Willow Grove Road, where a traffic stop was initiated. Contact was made with three occupants in the vehicle, the driver, **Angela D. Greenwood**, 43, of Clayton, **Anthony Jones**, who was a front seat passenger, and a 39 year old male from Marydel who was a rear seat passenger. All three occupants were detained without incident.

A search of the vehicle led to the discovery of the following:

- a loaded .45 caliber handgun with six rounds in the magazine
- a box containing (40) .45 auto rounds
- approximately 1.79 grams of crack cocaine
- drug paraphernalia

Further investigation revealed that the suspects had responded to a second residence in the 600 block of Equitation Lane, Felton, where Jones was again looking for his ex-girlfriend, who was not there either. Prior to leaving this residence, the suspects slashed all four tires and smashed out all of the windows to a vehicle that was parked in the driveway.

Jones was transported back to Troop 3 where he was charged with the following:

- Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony
- Possession of a Firearm or Ammunition by a Person Prohibited (2 counts)
- Reckless Endanger First Degree
- Aggravated Menacing
- Conspiracy Second Degree
- Terroristic Threatening
- Criminal Mischief
- Possession of a Controlled or Counterfeit Substance

Jones was arraigned before the Justice of the Peace Court 7 and committed to the Sussex Correctional Institution on \$72,500.00 cash only bail.

Greenwood was transported back to Troop 3 where she was charged with the following:

- Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony
- Reckless Endanger First Degree
- Conspiracy Second Degree

Greenwood was arraigned before the Justice of the Peace Court 7 and committed to the Delores J. Baylor Womens Correctional Institution on \$26,000.00 secured bond.

The male passenger in the vehicle was not charged. There were no reports of injuries as a result of this incident.

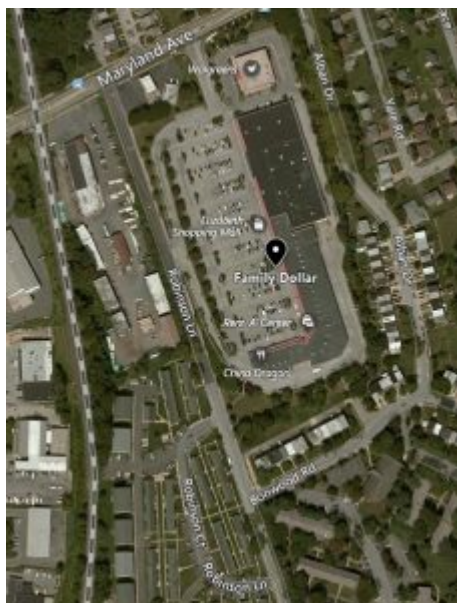

Troopers Investigating Armed Robbery – Wilmington



Wilmington – The Delaware State Police are investigating the armed robbery of a Canby Park area business that occurred Thursday night.

The incident occurred at approximately 9:49 p.m., Thursday, September 13, 2018 at the Family Dollar store, located at 1914 Maryland Avenue, Wilmington. Three suspects with concealed faces, one of which was brandishing a handgun, entered the business and confronted two employees and one customer at the sales counter. The three victims were ordered to the floor at which time the suspects removed an undisclosed amount of cash from the register and safe, along with multiple packs of cigarettes from the display. As this was occurring another customer entered the business who was also ordered to the ground at gunpoint. After exiting the business all three suspects were last seen fleeing on foot towards Maryland Avenue. None of the four victims were injured as a result of the incident.

The suspects were described as follows:

Suspect #1: black female wearing all black clothing to include a face covering and armed with a handgun

Suspect #2: Hispanic male, heavy set, wearing all black clothing, to include a face covering

Suspect #3: Black male, wearing all black clothing to include a face covering

Troopers Investigating Purse Snatching – Newark



Newark – The Delaware State Police are investigating a strong armed robbery/purse snatching that took place in the parking lot of the Christiana Mall earlier this week.

The incident occurred at approximately 7:20 p.m., Wednesday, September 12, 2018 in the parking lot of the Christiana Mall, Newark. A 40 year old Philadelphia woman had just returned to her vehicle which was parked in the lot adjacent to the Barnes & Noble book store. As she sat in her vehicle a male juvenile suspect opened the front passenger side door and snatched her purse which was still draped on her shoulder. A brief struggle ensued, however the suspect was able to take possession of the purse, at which time he fled to a Chevrolet Uplander mini-van that was parked nearby. The Uplander was also occupied by a second male juvenile. The female victim exited her vehicle and

confronted the suspects, at which time they both exited the Uplander and fled on foot, towards the Cinemark movie theater, still in possession of the purse. The victim was not injured as a result of the incident. Responding Troopers were able to determine that the Uplander had been reported stolen, earlier this same date.

The suspects were described as follows:

Suspect #1: black male, approximately 11 years of age, 5'4"-5'6", 100 lbs., wearing a blue shirt and dark pants.

Suspect #2: black male, approximately 13 years of age, 5'6"-5'8", 110 lbs., wearing a white shirt.

Troopers Investigate Home Invasion-Bridgeville

Bridgeville- The Delaware State Police are investigating a home invasion that occurred yesterday afternoon in the Walkers Meadows Development.

The incident occurred at approximately 1:33 p.m., on Thursday, September 13, 2018 when Troopers were dispatched to a residence in the 20000 block of Millstone Lane for a report of a home invasion. Upon arrival, Troopers learned that a 56-year-old female resident was home with her two grandchildren under the age of 3, when she heard a knock at the door. Upon answering the door, three subjects pushed their way into the residence and forced the victim and children into a bathroom, where they tied up the victim.

The suspects proceeded to ransack the residence, and removed an undisclosed amount of cash and a cell phone prior to

fleeing the scene. No injuries were reported as a result of this incident.

The suspects were described as three males wearing masks, and fleeing the area in a gray or silver colored Lexus cross-over type SUV with an unknown New York registration. (pictured)

***Update 2* Names Released in Fatal Crash-Dover**



Dover— The Delaware State Police is releasing the names of the four other drivers involved in a fatal crash, involving five vehicles.

The incident occurred at approximately 5:44 p.m., on Friday, September 8, 2018 when a 2018 Chevrolet Silverado was traveling southbound on South DuPont Highway (US 13) towards Walnut Shade Road. A 2009 Ford Flex was slowing in heavy traffic, which had backed up nearly half a mile from the Walnut Shade Road stop light. A 2012 UPS Truck was

stopped/slowing in traffic directly in front of the Ford Flex. A 2008 Chevrolet Silverado was stopped/slowing in traffic directly in front of the UPS truck. A 2017 Buick Envision was stopped/slowing in traffic directly in front of the 2008 Chevrolet Silverado. All of the vehicles were traveling in the left lane of South DuPont Highway.

Frederick J. Pierce, 29 of Magnolia, DE was the operator of the 2018 Chevrolet Silverado.

Harry J. Lindale, 37 of Dover, DE was the operator of the UPS Truck.

Scott Anderson, 39 of Federalsburg, MD was the operator of the 2008 Chevrolet Silverado.

Martin F. Hogan 3rd, 76 of Milford, DE was the operator of the Buick Envision.

This crash continues to remain under investigation by the Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit.
