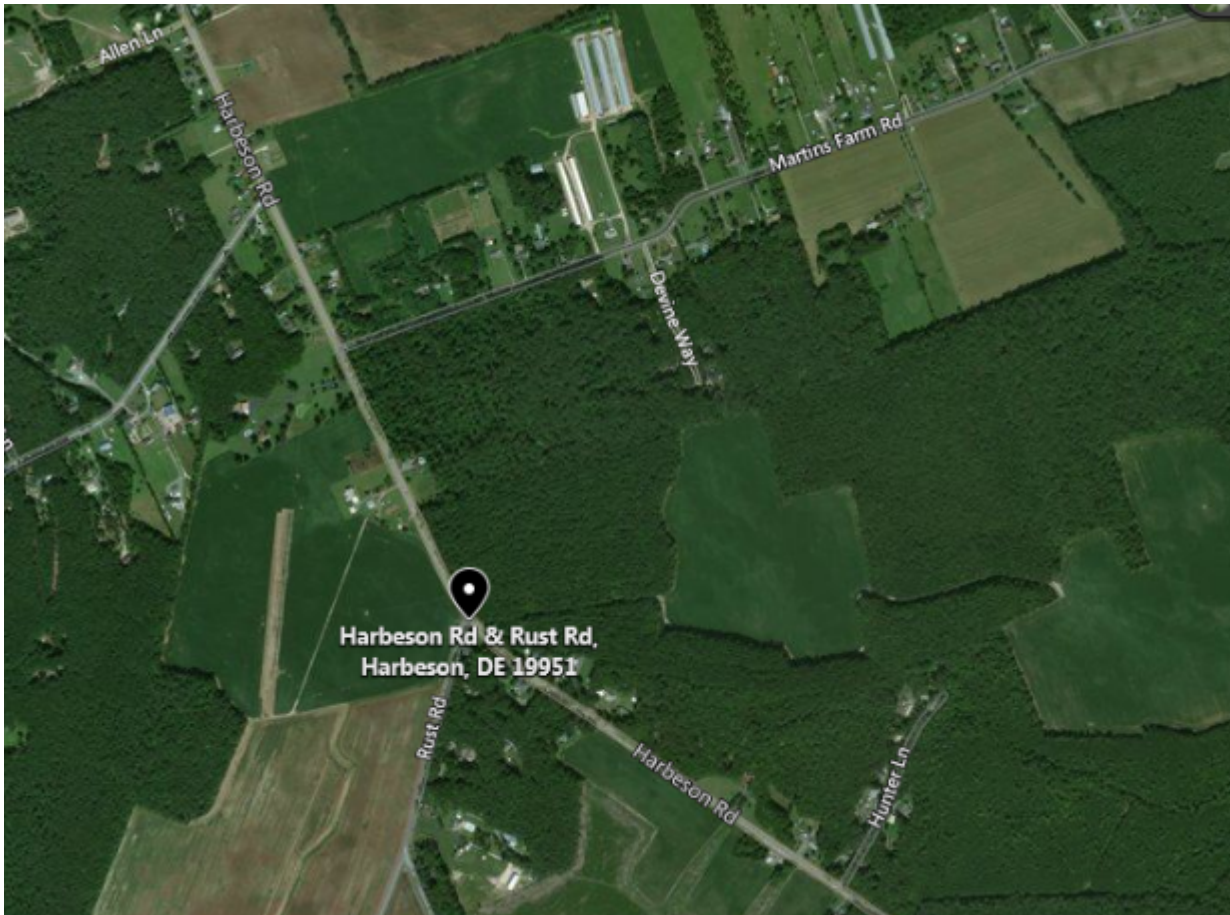


Update Troopers Investigating Fatal Crash-Harbeson



Harbeson-The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating a fatal crash that occurred this morning.

The incident occurred on Thursday, June 28, 2018, at approximately 6:42 a.m. as a 2013 Ford F-150 was traveling northbound on Harbeson Road and a 2002 Ford Ranger was traveling southbound on Harbeson Road in the same general vicinity. For unknown reasons the operator of the Ford F-150, an 18-year-old male from Milton, failed to maintain the proper lane and entered into the opposing travel lane, directly in front of the Ford Ranger. The operator of the Ford Ranger, a

53-year-old male from Seaford, was unable to avoid the F-150, which resulted in a near head-on collision.

The 18-year-old operator, was not wearing his seatbelt and was transported to the Beebe Medical Center by ambulance in serious condition.

The 53-year-old operator was properly restrained. He was extensively trapped in the vehicle and was pronounced dead at the scene.

The reason for the lane departure is currently under investigation and no charges have been filed at this time. The Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing their investigation into this incident.

Harbeson Road between Rust Road and Martins Farm Road was closed for approximately 3 hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

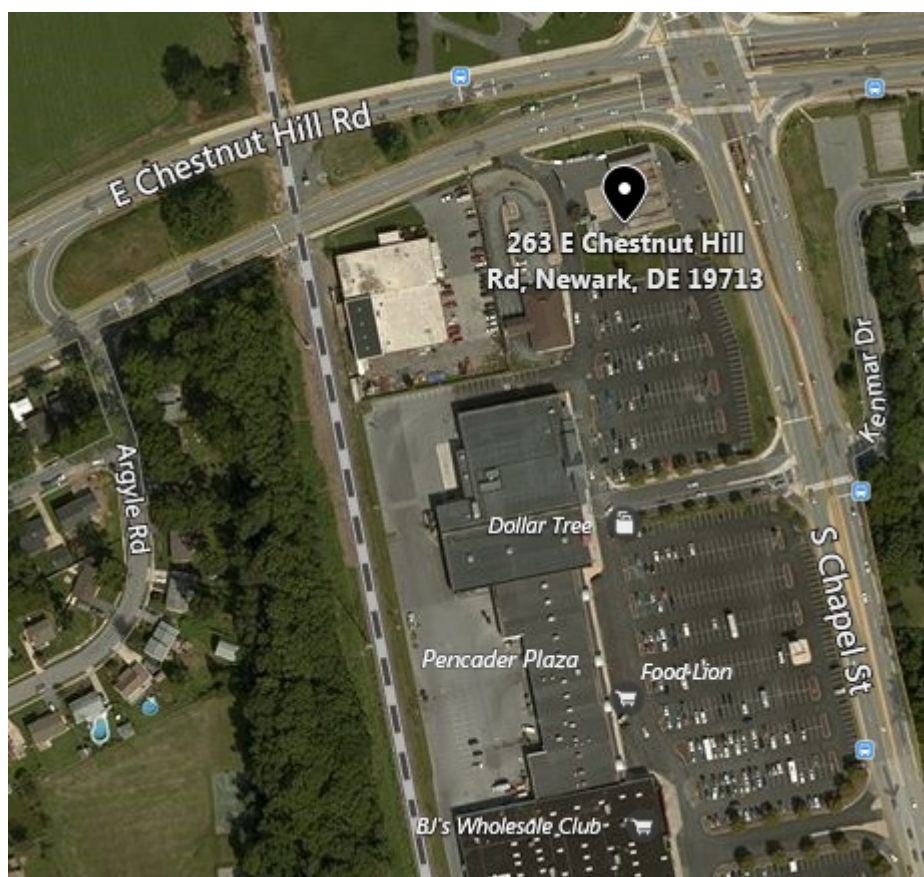

Troopers Investigating Gas Station Parking Lot Robbery – Newark



Newark (19713) – The Delaware State Police are investigating an armed robbery that took place in the parking lot of a Newark area gas station, just after midnight on Wednesday.

The incident occurred at approximately 12:57 a.m., Wednesday, June 27, 2018 in the parking lot of the Exxon gas station located at 263 E. Chestnut Hill Road, Newark. A 25 year old

Wilmington man was seated in his vehicle after making a purchase, when he was approached by a subject who asked to borrow some money. The male victim complied with the request and voluntarily gave the subject a small amount of money. The subject then requested more money, however the victim refused at which time the subject forcibly grabbed the remaining amount of money from the victim's hand. As the subject was running away with the money he displayed a handgun and threatened the victim. The subject then entered a blue, unknown make and model SUV and fled the parking lot. The victim was not injured as a result of the incident.

The suspect was described as a black male, 5'8", wearing a multi-colored hoodie.

No surveillance images are available at this time.

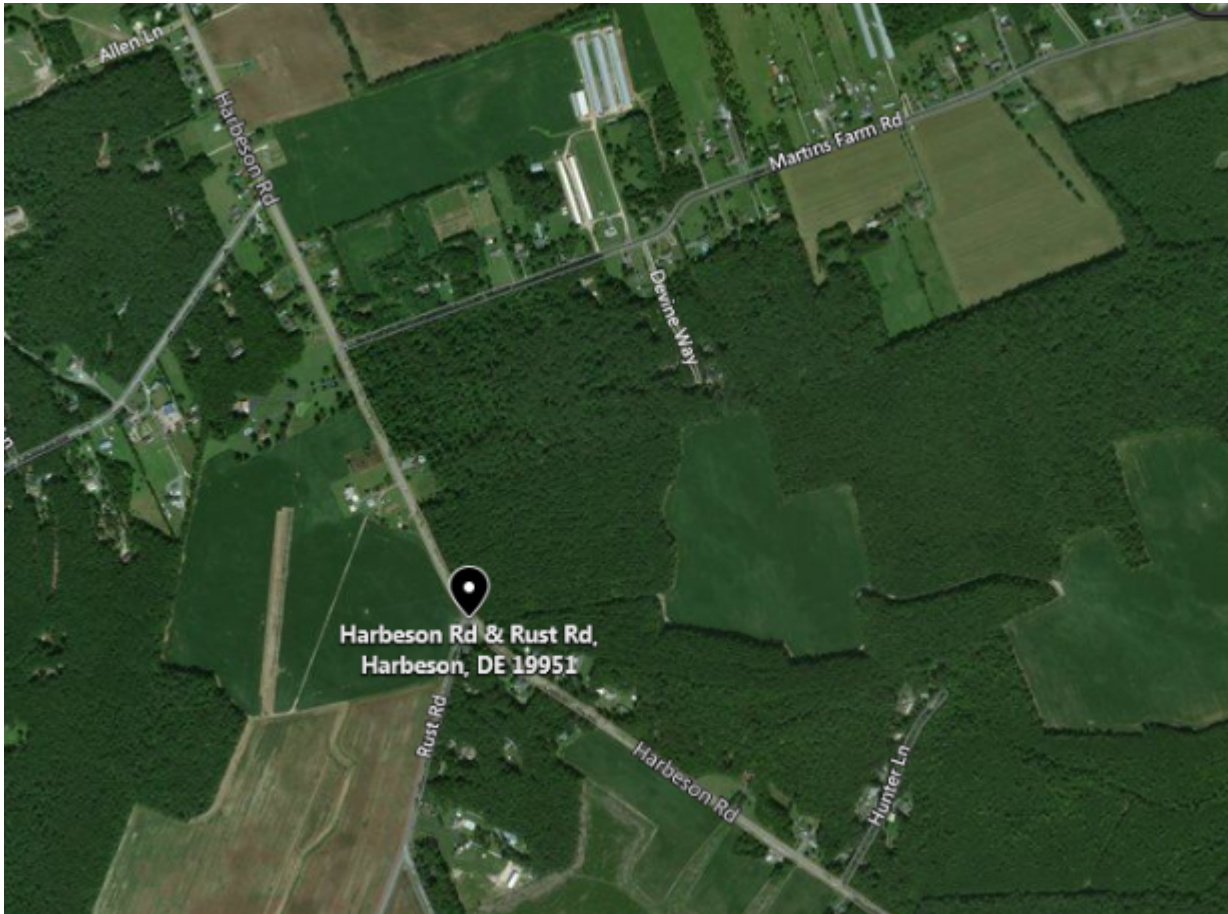

***Update 2* Stabbing Suspect Still Wanted-Millsboro**

Millsboro (19966)– The Delaware State Police Major Crimes Unit are still attempting to locate the suspect involved in a stabbing incident and are seeking the public's assistance in locating him.

The investigation began on Wednesday, January 24, 2018 at approximately 8:20 p.m., when Troopers were dispatched to the intersection of Townsend Road and Harmony Cemetery Road for a reported stabbing. Upon arrival, units made contact with a 38-year-old victim of Milford who was sitting on the side of the roadway with stab wounds to his extremities. The 38-year-old victim was removed from the scene by Emergency Medical Services and transported to a local area hospital.

Through investigative measures, Troopers were able to identify the suspect as 47-year-old **Lavocia I. Callahan** of Wilmington.

Warrants have been obtained for Callahan's arrest including charges of Assault First Degree, Possession of a Deadly Weapon During the Commission of a Felony, Aggravated Menacing, and Terroristic Threatening.

Troopers Investigate Armed Robbery of a Liquor Store – Wilmington



Wilmington, De. (19804)- Delaware State Police are investigating the armed robbery of a Wilmington area liquor store that occurred today after midnight.

The initial investigation has determined the incident occurred on Tuesday, June 26, 2018, at approximately 12:32 a.m., as two male suspects entered Ted's Liquors located at 1202 Newport Gap Pike, Wilmington. One of the suspects vaulted the sales counter and pushed the clerk to the ground demanding money. At this time the second suspect displayed an unknown make and model handgun and confronted the clerk also demanding money. The first suspect grabbed an undisclosed amount of money and the second suspect struck the clerk causing injury. Both suspects fled on foot toward Meadowbrook Avenue.

The first suspect was described as a male approximately 5'08" – 6'00" tall, average build with dark pants with his face covered.

The second suspect was described as a black male approximately 5'08"-6'00" tall, average build wearing dark clothing with his face covered armed with an unknown make and model handgun.

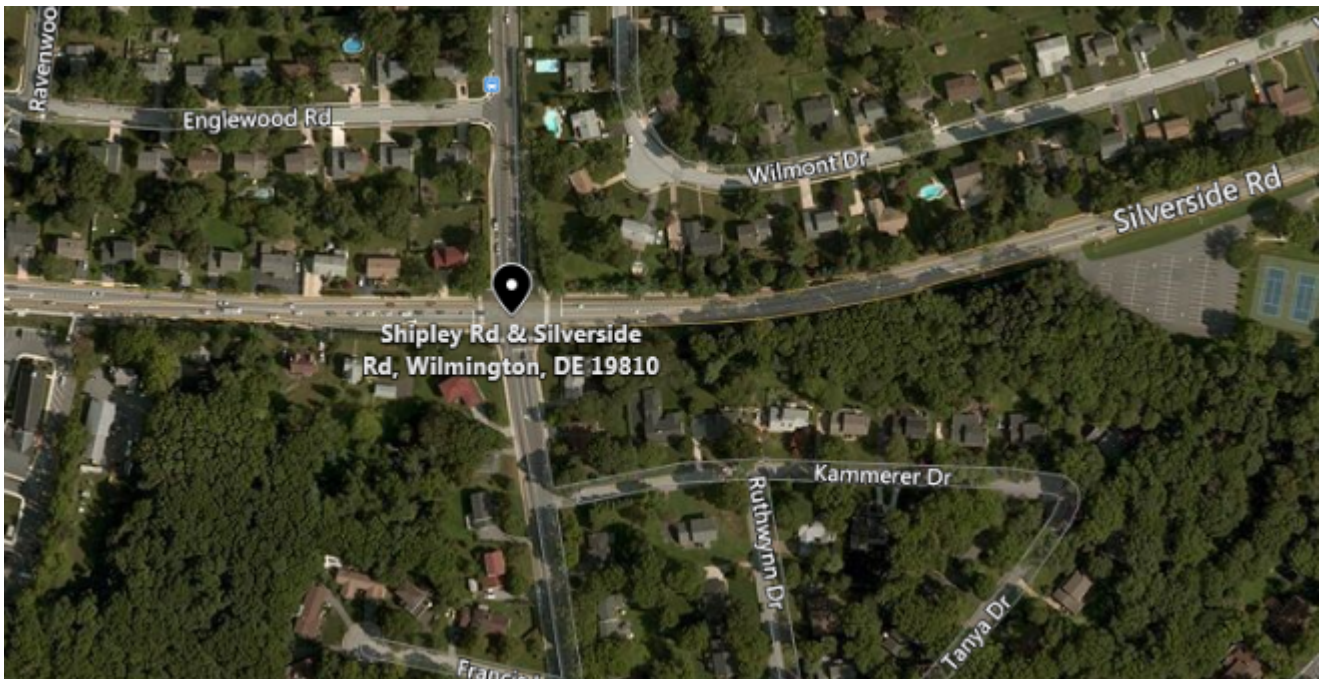

Troopers Arrest Two Juveniles for Burglary-Magnolia

Magnolia— Delaware State Police have arrested two juveniles in connection with a burglary that occurred on Monday morning.

On Monday, June 25, 2018, at approximately 10:37 a.m., Troopers were dispatched to the 300 block of Anderson Road for a burglary report. Upon arrival, contact was made with the homeowner who advised that sometime in the past 24 hours, her

two bicycles were removed from her garage.

On this same date, at approximately 1:58 p.m., Troopers were dispatched to the Magnolia Furniture Store, located at 40 S. Main Street, Magnolia, in reference to the victim locating one of her stolen bicycles. Subsequently, the two suspects identified as 17-year-old **Ross C. Madden** of Smyrna, and 16-year-old **William Figgatt Jr.** of Magnolia were taken into custody without incident.

Madden and Figgatt were transported back to Troop 3 where they were charged with Burglary 3rd (Felony), Conspiracy 2nd (Felony), and Theft. Both were arraigned before the Justice of the Peace Court 2 and released to the custody of their parents.

Troopers Arrest Millsboro Man for Attempted Burglary - Millsboro

Millsboro-Delaware State Police with the assistance of Probation and Parole Officers, arrest a Millsboro man for Attempted Burglary and other related charges.

The incident occurred on Monday, June 25, 2018 at approximately 7:15 p.m. when Troopers were dispatched to the 34000 block of Tugboat Court, Rehoboth Shores, for a report of a disorderly subject with a gun. Upon arrival, Troopers learned that 19-year-old **Dwayne A. Barnes** was involved in an altercation in the roadway in which he allegedly displayed a BB gun. Further investigation revealed that Barnes attempted to break into a 21-year-old female's residence by kicking in the rear door. The Rehoboth Shores security officer was contacted and made aware of the situation and upon his arrival, he was threatened by Barnes.

Barnes had fled the area prior to the arrival of the Troopers, however was subsequently located by Probation and Parole hiding in a pond off of Tugboat Court and taken into custody without further incident.

Barnes was transported back to Troop 7 where he was charged with Attempt to Commit Burglary Second, Terroristic Threatening, Resisting Arrest, Criminal Mischief, and Disorderly Conduct. He was arraigned before the Justice of the Peace Court 3 and released on \$12,200.00 unsecured bond.

***Update* Troopers Investigating Crash Involving a Motorcycle – Wilmington**



Wilmington– Delaware State Police are continuing to investigate a serious crash involving a motorcycle that occurred yesterday afternoon north of Wilmington.

The incident occurred at approximately 2:42 p.m. on Saturday, June 23, 2018, when a 2012 Kawasaki motorcycle sport bike, operated by Atiba Fields, 20 of Claymont, was traveling southbound at an apparent high rate of speed in the right lane of SR 141 approaching the intersection of Alapocas Drive. At the same time, a 2004 Dodge Dakota, operated by John J. Devine, 76 of Wilmington, was traveling northbound in the left turn lane on SR 141 at the intersection. As the Dodge made the left turn at the intersection it was struck on the front right side while crossing the southbound lanes with the front of the Kawasaki sport bike. The motorcycle came to a stop at the entrance of the DuPont driving range and the Dodge Dakota was pushed southbound stopping on the right shoulder. The force of the collision caused the motorcycle operator to be ejected onto the right shoulder.

The operator of the Dodge Dakota was properly restrained and

sustained non-life threatening injuries a result of this crash.

The operator of the motorcycle was wearing a DOT compliant helmet. He was transported by the Delaware State Police Aviation Unit to the Christiana Hospital, where he is listed in serious but stable condition. Impairment on his behalf is unknown at this time. Warrant was issued for Reckless Driving and drug charges for the motorcycle operator.

SR 141 at the intersection of Alapocas Drive in the area of the crash was closed for approximately three hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

The crash continues to remain under investigation by the Delaware State Police.
