

***Update* Troopers Seek Public's Assistance in Locating Wanted Suspect**

New Castle (19720)- The Delaware State Police are asking for the public's assistance in locating the above pictured suspect who is wanted in connection with filing a false report.

Koshanna Mack, 28-year-old of Newark reported an incident to the police on Thursday, April 5, 2018 at approximately 6:38 p.m. Mack stated that she was at the Shell Gas Station,

located at 299 Christiana Road, where she had just finished fueling her vehicle up at the gas pumps. She indicated that as she proceeded to retrieve her wallet off the trunk of her vehicle where she had placed it, a subject was simultaneously reaching for it. Mack stated that she was able to grab her wallet and enter her vehicle, locking the doors. Mack reported that the subject then approached the drivers side door, displayed a handgun, and began banging on the window.

Through further investigations, it was determined that the information that Mack reported to the police was false. Troopers have been unable to locate Mack who currently has an active warrant for Filing a False Report.

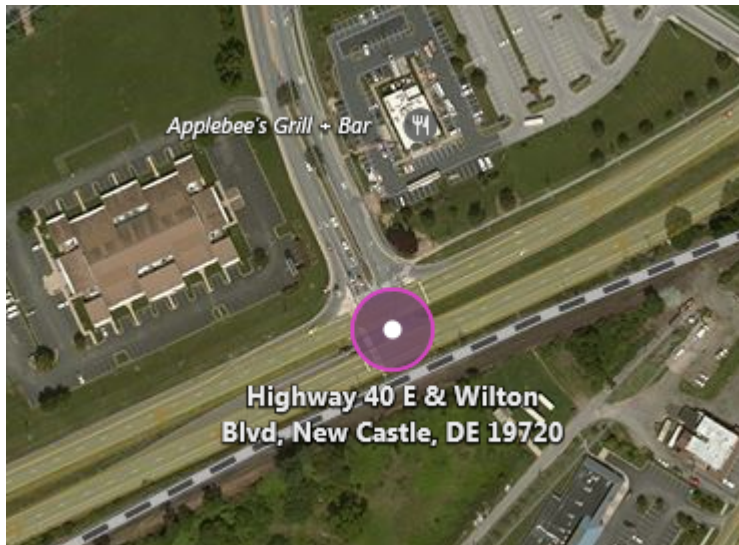

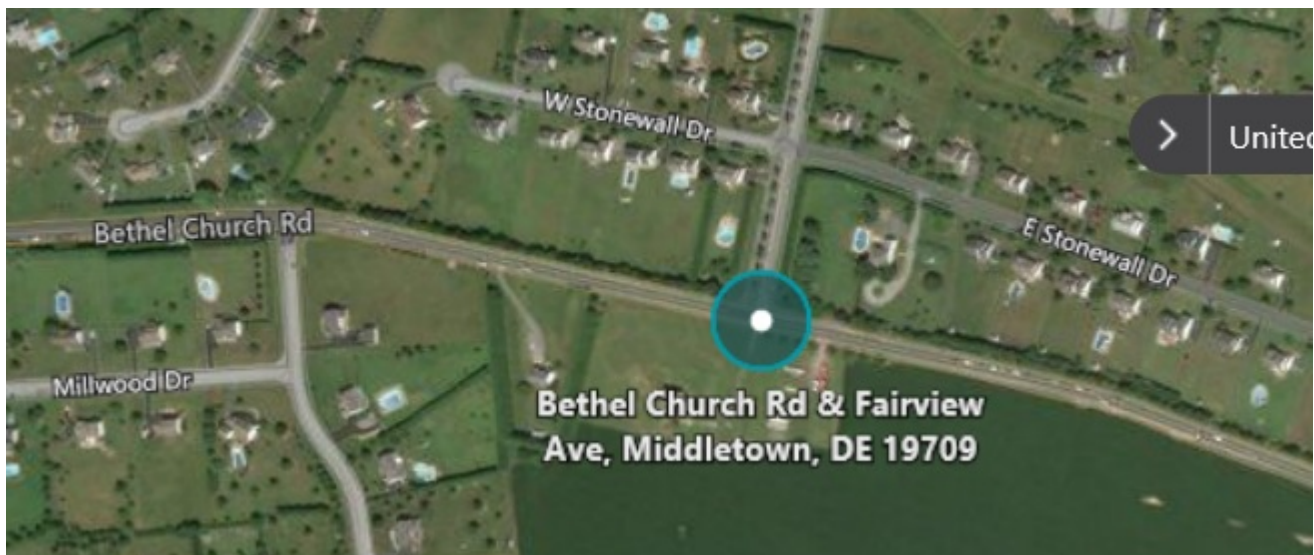

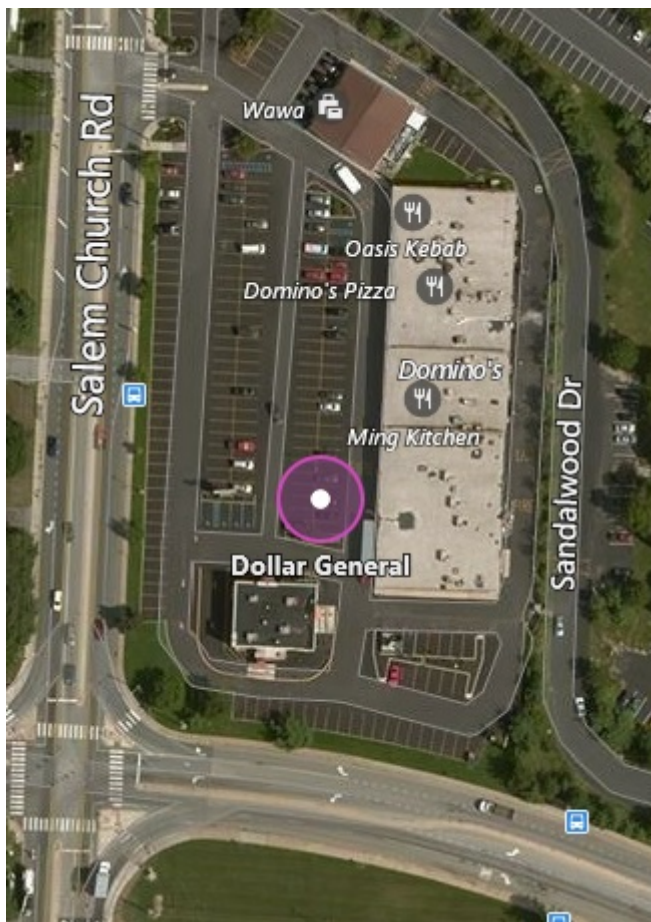

Troopers Investigating Armed

Robbery - Newark



Newark (19713) – Delaware State Police detectives are investigating the armed robbery of a Dollar General store that took place last night.

The incident occurred at approximately 9:49 p.m., Tuesday, April 10, 2018, at the Dollar General, located at 20 Salem Village Square, Newark, when two masked suspects, brandishing handguns, entered the business just prior to the scheduled closing time of 10:00 pm. The suspects confronted a female employee on the sales floor, directed her to the sales counter, and then ordered her to open the cash register. The employee complied with the demand and opened the register, at which time one of the suspects removed an undisclosed amount of cash. After obtaining the money both suspects fled in an unknown direction.

Suspect #1 was described as a black male, 5'5"-5'9" tall,

120-140 lbs., wearing all dark clothing, to include a covering over his face and armed with an unknown make and model handgun.

Suspect #2 was described as a black male 5'4'-5'5" tall, 120-140 lbs., also wearing all dark clothing and a covering over his face.

No surveillance images are available at this time.

Troopers Seek Public's Assistance in Locating Wanted Suspects

Lewes- The Delaware State Police are asking for the public's assistance in locating the above pictured suspects who are wanted in connection with a robbery.

The incident occurred on Tuesday, April 10, 2018 at approximately 1:18 p.m. when Troopers were dispatched to the 20000 block of Wil King Road for a report of an assault. Upon arrival, Troopers made contact with a 67-year-old resident who advised that he engaged in an argument with one of his tenants, 25-year-old **John Schaefer** of Georgetown. The argument led to Schaefer physically assaulting the victim. While the victim was on the ground, Schaefer took his wallet and removed cash. He furthermore removed the victim's cell phone, eye glasses and keys. Also present during this incident was 27-year-old **Amber Hoopes** of Lewes. Both Schaefer and Hoopes fled the residence in the victim's black Cadillac Escalade bearing DE registration 22607. The victim was transported to a local area hospital where he is being treated for his injuries.

Troopers have been unable to locate Schaefer and Hoopes who currently have active warrants for Robbery First Degree, Criminal Mischief, Theft of a Motor Vehicle, Malicious Interference with Emergency Communication, and Conspiracy

Second Degree.

K-9 Teams Attain National Certification

K-9 trainers from the Delaware State Police, New Castle County Police and Wilmington Police Department, recently conducted two weeks of certification training in which a total of 51 police K-9 teams from Delaware, Maryland and Pennsylvania participated.

This annual training which is held in conjunction with the National Police Canine Association (NPCA), ensures that all participating agencies work and train to meet the same certification standards. NPCA is a non-profit association dedicated to the training, development, and certification of law enforcement canine teams and their administrations.

Trainers from the three lead agencies are deemed certifying officials by the NPCA and conduct training for all law enforcement K-9 teams in the state under one certification standard for both patrol and scent detection (explosive and narcotic). Certification scenarios and standards for patrol include; K-9 obedience, tracking, building searches, vehicle searches and wooded area searches. The certification standards for explosives and narcotics include vehicle searches and building searches

During the week of March 26, 2018, a total of 23 K-9 teams successfully completed the NPCA patrol and explosive detection

certification program. Teams which received certification included 14 DSP K-9 teams and 9 municipal K-9 teams, representing Wilmington PD, Capitol PD, Laurel PD and the Delaware County Sherriff's Office (PA).

During the week of April 2, 2018, a total of 28 K-9 teams successfully completed the patrol and narcotics detection certification program. Teams which received certification included 13 DSP K-9 teams and 15 municipal K-9 teams representing Dover PD, Newark PD, Smyrna PD, Harrington PD, Bridgeville PD, Lewes PD, Ocean View PD, Havre De Grace PD (MD) and Aberdeen PD (MD).

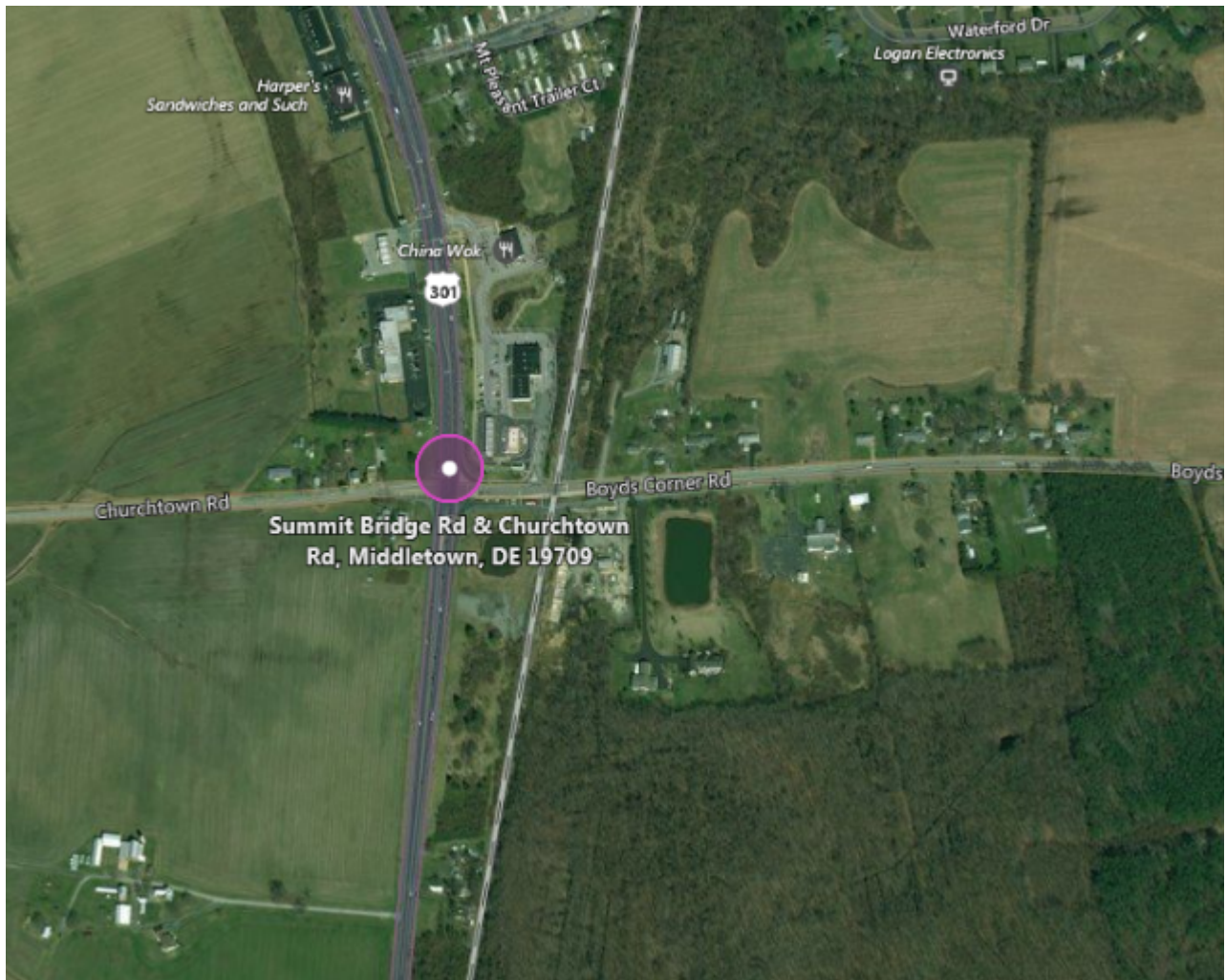
