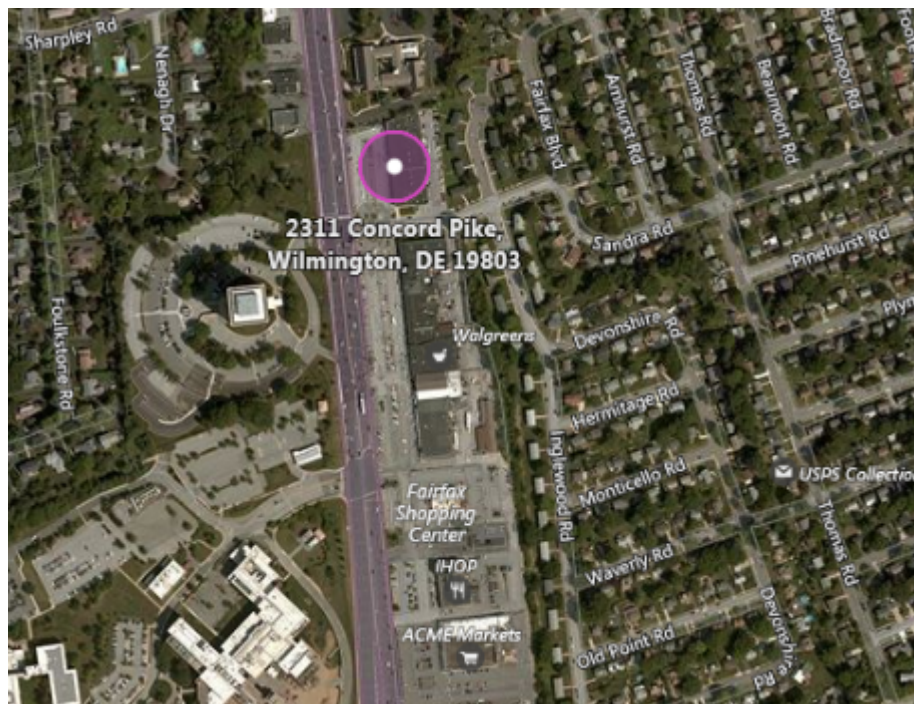


# Troopers Seek Public's Assistance in Locating Wanted Suspect



**Wilmington (19803)**- The Delaware State Police are asking for the public's assistance in locating a suspect who is wanted in connection with embezzlement from a restaurant.

The investigation began on February 6, 2018 when Troopers were contacted by a manager of the Panera Bread located at 2311 Concord Pike, Wilmington, regarding an employee who was stealing money from the cash register. Through further investigations, it was discovered that an employee, identified as 36-year-old **Yasser J. Wolf** of Downingtown, PA had been conducting fraudulent cash refund transactions from October 2017 to January 2018. Wolf made over 151 fraudulent cash refunds totaling over \$2,300.00.

Wolf (no photo available) is a white male, 5'08" tall, 220 lbs., with brown eyes and black hair.

Troopers have been unable to locate Wolf who currently has active warrants for Theft (Felony) and Falsifying Business Records.

# Traffic Stop Leads to Drug Arrest- Selbyville

**Selbyville** – The Delaware State Police arrest a suspect after a traffic stop leads to the discovery of drugs.

The incident occurred on Saturday, April 7, 2018 at approximately 1:40 p.m. when a Trooper observed a black Nissan Altima make an illegal U-turn on Lighthouse Road east of Zion Church Road. A traffic stop was initiated and contact was made with the operator, identified as 40-year-old **Steven A. Bowen** of Frankford. An odor of marijuana was detected which subsequently led to a search. Further investigation revealed that Bowen was in possession of 731.21 grams of marijuana, over \$1,800.00 in suspected drug proceeds, and drug paraphernalia

Bowen was taken into custody without incident and transported back to Troop 4, where he was charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance in a Tier 1 Quantity with two Aggravating Factors (Felony), Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and traffic related offenses. He was arraigned before the Justice of the Peace Court 3 and committed to the Sussex Correctional Institution on \$60,700.00 secure bond.

## **\*Update\*      Robbery      Suspect Arrested-Millsboro**

**Millsboro-** The Delaware State Police have arrested a suspect in connection with the robbery of a convenience store.

The incident occurred on Thursday, April 5, 2018, at approximately 9:00 p.m. when Troopers were dispatched to the Rite Aid convenience store located at 24892 John J. Williams Highway for a robbery. Further investigation revealed that the suspect, identified as 39-year-old **Christopher Radcliffe** of Millsboro, entered the business, approached the clerk and demanded money from the register. The clerk complied with Radcliffe's demands and turned over an undisclosed amount of cash, prior to him fleeing the business. The store clerk was not injured as a result of this incident.

On Saturday, April 7, 2018 at approximately 6:30 p.m., Troopers responded to a residence in the 31000 block of Legion Road, Millsboro where Radcliffe was located and taken into custody without incident. Radcliffe was transported to

Troop 4 where he was arraigned before the Justice of the Peace Court 3 on charges including; Robbery First Degree, Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle and Violation of Probation. He was committed to the Sussex Correctional Institution on \$102,000 cash bail.

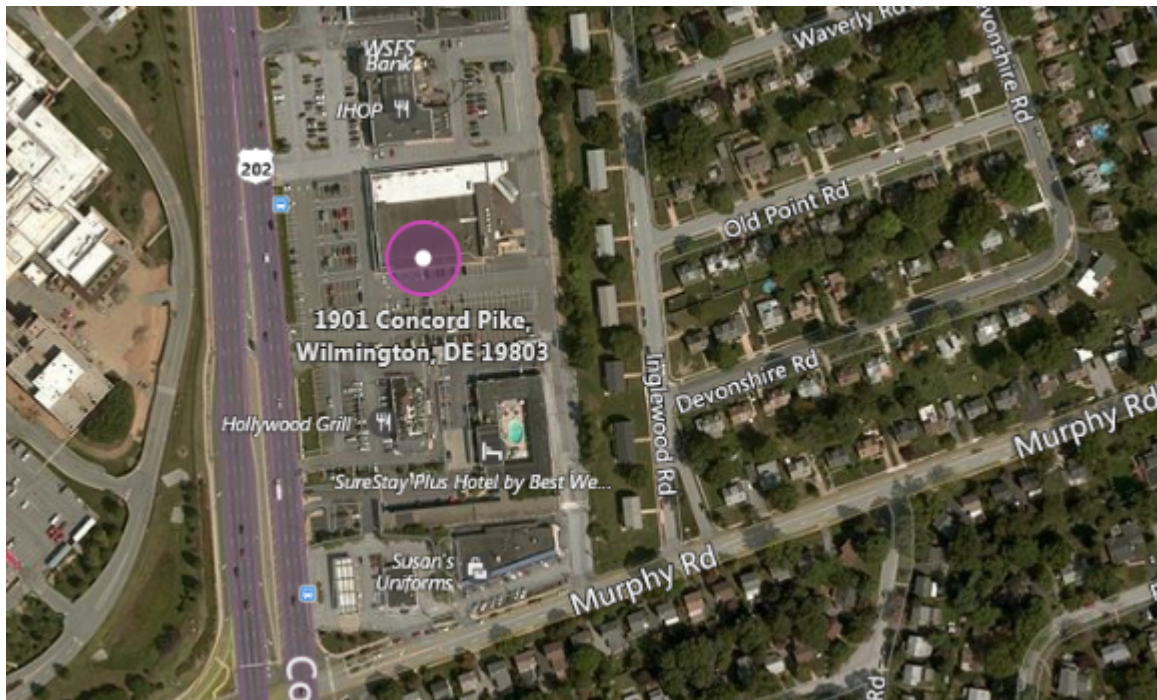

**Troopers Investigating  
Robbery Attempt-Wilmington**



**Wilmington (19803)**- Delaware State Police are investigating the attempted robbery of a Wilmington man that occurred yesterday in a grocery store parking lot.

The incident occurred on Friday, April 6, 2018 at approximately 4:40 p.m. when Troopers were dispatched to the parking lot of the Acme, located at 1901 Concord Pike for a report of an attempted robbery. Upon arrival, Troopers made contact with an 80-year-old victim who advised he had just walked out of the Acme and over to his vehicle, when he was approached by a subject asking for a helping hand. The victim informed the subject that he did not have any money. The suspect then proceeded to grab the victim's pocket in an attempt to take his wallet. The victim was able to pull away from the suspect, who then took off running without obtaining any personal belongings. The victim was not harmed as a result of this incident.

The suspect was described as a white male, approximately 25-35 years of age, 5'07"-5'09" tall, 130-140 pounds, thin build, with brown hair, wearing a long-sleeve dark colored shirt, jeans, and dark colored boots.

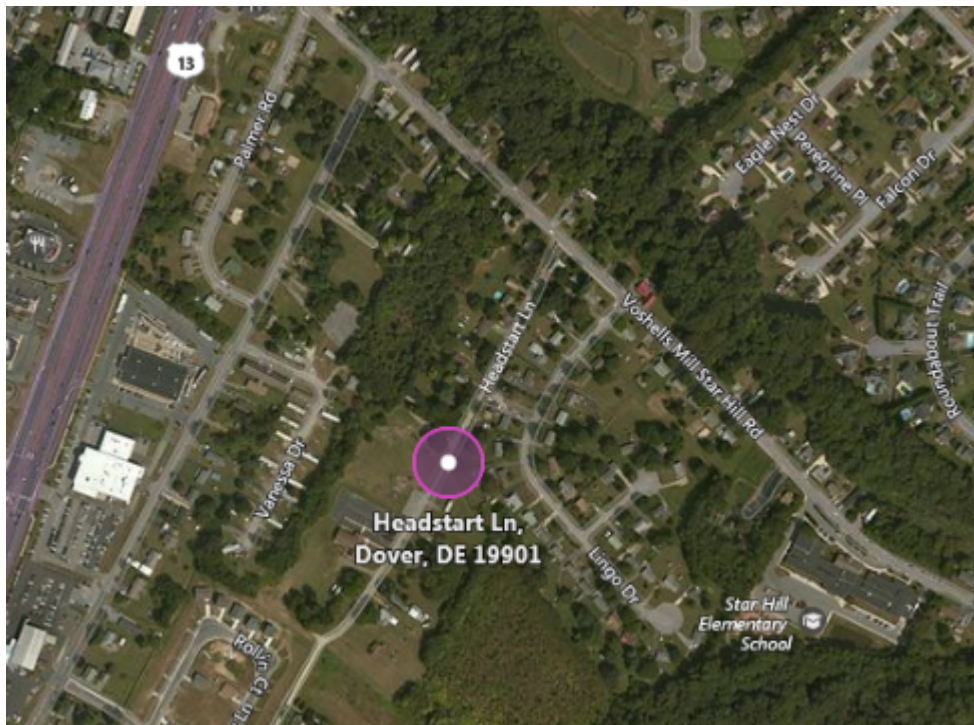

## Troopers Investigating Shooting-Dover



**Dover (19901)**– The Delaware State Police are currently investigating a shooting that occurred earlier this morning in the Dover area.

The preliminary investigation has determined that the incident occurred on Saturday, April 7, 2018 at approximately 2:17 a.m. when Troopers were dispatched to the unit block of Headstart Lane in reference to a shooting. Further investigation revealed that a 19-year-old male of Felton had left a party at a residence on Headstart Lane with his friends. While the victim was walking, an unknown subject had grabbed him by the shoulder, requesting him to turn over his personal belongings. The suspect then displayed a handgun and shot the victim in his lower extremity. The victim began to run away and was shot a second time in his lower extremity. The victim was removed from the scene and transported by EMS to a local area hospital where he is being treated for his injuries.

The suspect was described as a black male, 18-19 years of age, approximately 5'05" tall, "chubby", with black low cut hair, a black beard, and wearing all dark colored clothing.

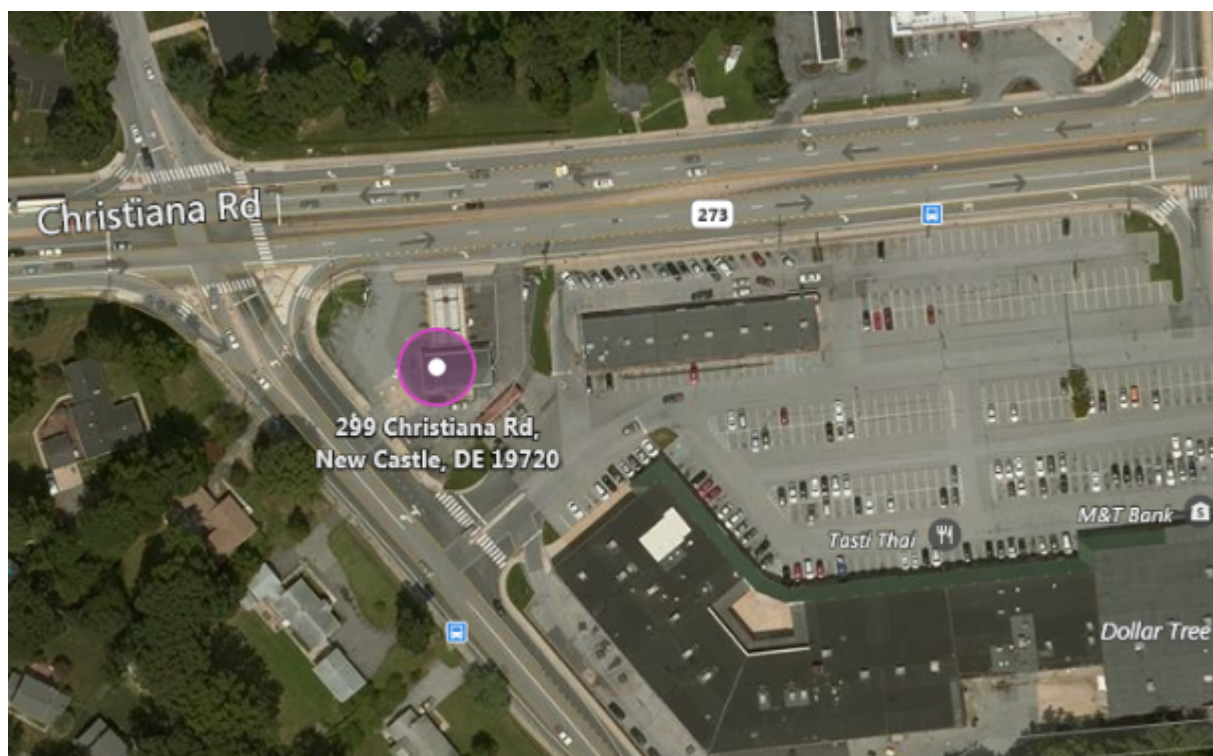

# Troopers Investigating Robbery Attempt-New Castle



**New Castle (19720)**- Delaware State Police are investigating the attempted armed robbery of a Newark woman that occurred last evening.

The incident occurred on Thursday, April 5, 2018 at approximately 6:38 p.m. at the Shell Gas Station, located at 299 Christiana Road. The victim, a 28-year-old female, had just finished fueling her vehicle up at the gas pumps. She proceeded to retrieve her wallet off the trunk of her vehicle where she had placed it, when a subject was simultaneously reaching for it. The victim was able to grab her wallet and enter her vehicle, locking the doors. The suspect approached the drivers side door, displayed a handgun, and began banging on the window. The victim was able to drive off in her vehicle unharmed. Also present in the victim's vehicle during

this incident were her four children ranging from 10 months to 11 years old who were unharmed.

The suspect was described as a light skinned black male, in his 40's, approximately 6'03" tall, 250 lbs., wearing light colored pants, a dark colored sweatshirt and a dark colored baseball hat.

**Troopers Investigating  
Robbery of Car Dealership-  
Smyrna**



**Smyrna-** The Delaware State Police are investigating the robbery of a used car dealership that occurred last evening.

The incident occurred on Thursday, April 5, 2018 at approximately 11:12 p.m. at the World Trust, located at 2620 S. Dupont Boulevard. Three suspects entered the business while two of them displayed handguns and demanded money from the employees. One of the suspects struck an employee over the head with his fist while a second suspect struck another victim in the head with a handgun. A third victim was also in the business during this incident and was not injured. All three victims complied with the suspects demands and turned over their cell phones. The suspects removed an undisclosed amount of cash from the cash register and several keys to vehicles located on the used car lot, prior to fleeing the scene in an unknown direction.

One suspect was described as a black female, wearing a dark colored sweatshirt and sweatpants, and light colored sneakers. The second suspect was described as a black male wearing a dark colored jacket, and dark colored pants and

shoes. The third suspect was described as a black male wearing a hooded sweatshirt and dark colored jeans, with a dark colored mask over his face.

# Troopers Investigating Multi-vehicle Crash I-95 – New Castle



**New Castle** – Delaware State Police are continuing to investigate a serious motor vehicle crash which took place on I-95 northbound in the area DE Route 141, yesterday evening.

The incident occurred at approximately 5:26 p.m., Thursday, April 5, 2018, on I-95 northbound, south of DE 141, in New Castle, when a 57 year old Dover man, who was operating a 2000 Chevrolet Tahoe, experienced a suspected medical emergency, which caused him to lose control of his vehicle.

The Tahoe which was traveling I-95 northbound in the right

lane, suddenly veered left in to the path of a 2008 Chevrolet Cobalt, being driven by a 27 year old female from New Castle, at which time the two vehicles collided. After the initial impact, the Cobalt was forced left and collided with a 2011 Mazda CX-9, being driven by a 47 year old male from Franklin Park, New Jersey. The Tahoe continued traveling in a northwest direction, across all lanes of I-95 before colliding with a concrete barrier, where it came to rest. The Cobalt and the Mazda came to rest in the I-95 northbound left two lanes.

The driver of the Tahoe who was not wearing a seatbelt, was transported to the Christiana Hospital in serious condition. The driver of the Cobalt, who was properly restrained, was transported to the Christiana Hospital with non-life threatening injuries. The driver of the Mazda, who was also properly restrained, was uninjured.

I-95 northbound lanes were shut down for approximately 1 hour as the crash was investigated and cleared.
