

Troopers Arrest Dover Woman for Brandishing Handgun

Magnolia – Delaware State Police have arrested a Dover woman for pointing a handgun at another woman and threatening to shoot her, during an argument at a local gas station.

The incident occurred at approximately 7:32 p.m., Thursday, December 21, 2017, at the Happy Gas, located at 50 W. Birdie Lane, Magnolia.

While inside the Happy Gas, the victim, a 24 year old Dover woman, became engaged in a verbal altercation with Shaniqua Saunders, 24, also of Dover. After the argument, Saunders exited into the parking lot, with the victim remaining inside the business with an acquaintance, a 37 year old Dover man.

The pair eventually exited the business at which time the

victim was again confronted by Saunders, who was waiting in the parking lot. Another verbal altercation ensued and as Saunders walked towards the victim, she produced a black handgun and pointed it at the victim, threatening to shoot her. The male acquaintance intervened, and was able to disarm Saunders, taking possession of the handgun.

Upon Troopers arriving on scene all parties were still present, and Saunders was taken in to custody without incident. A loaded Ruger LCP 9 mm handgun, was recovered from the scene and positively identified as the weapon possessed by Saunders during the altercation. None of the involved parties were injured as a result of the incident.

Saunders was transported to Delaware State Police Troop 3 where she was arrested and formally charged with one count each of: Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony, Carrying a Concealed Deadly Weapon, Aggravated Menacing and Reckless Endangering 1st Degree.

Saunders was arraigned at Justice of the Peace Court #7 and released after posting \$30,000.00 secured bail.

Dover- On Thursday, December 21, 2017, The Superintendent of the Delaware State Police Colonel Nathaniel McQueen Jr. and The Delaware State Police K9 Unit recognized the individuals that have made contributions to the K9 Unit this past year. 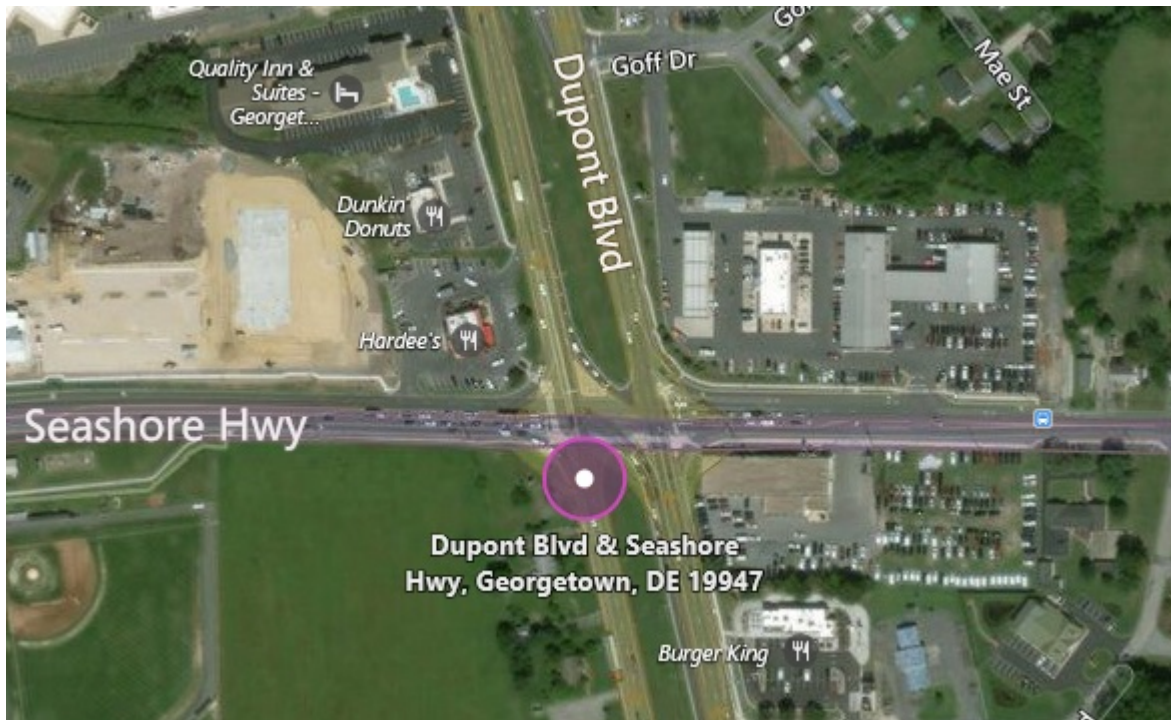

Troopers Investigating Fatal Pedestrian Crash-Georgetown



Georgetown – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating a motor vehicle crash involving a pedestrian that has claimed the life of a Virginia man.

The incident occurred at approximately 8:47 p.m., Friday, December 22, 2017, on DuPont Boulevard (U.S. 113) southbound, just north of the intersection with Seashore Highway (S.R. 18), Georgetown.

A 2006 Jaguar S-Type, being operated by a 53 year old Pennsylvania woman, was traveling DuPont Boulevard southbound in the left lane, approaching the intersection with Seashore Highway. Daniel W. Rohde Jr., 75, was on foot, attempting to cross DuPont Boulevard, in an easterly direction and proceeded directly into the path of the Jaguar. The driver was unable to avoid Rohde, and he was in turn struck by the right front bumper of the vehicle, while in the left lane of travel. Rohde was thrown onto the hood and windshield of the vehicle, before falling to the ground, eventually coming to rest in the DuPont Boulevard southbound, right lane. The Jaguar continued southbound, coming to a controlled stop, in the left turn lane.

Rohde, who was wearing dark clothing, had no light and was not utilizing a marked crosswalk, was pronounced dead at the scene by responding EMS. Alcohol does appear to be a factor on his behalf.

The operator of the Jaguar, as well as a 24 year old Pennsylvania man, who was a front seat passenger in the vehicle, were both properly restrained and sustained no injuries as a result of the crash. Neither speed nor impairment are being considered factors on behalf the driver.

The southbound lanes of DuPont Boulevard were closed for approximately 3 hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

Troopers Make Arrests in Dover Drug Investigation

The Delaware State Police have concluded an investigation into suspected drug dealing, after the execution of a search warrant, which has resulted in the arrest of two Dover residents.

On Friday, December 22, 2017, members of the Kent County Drug Unit, assisted by the Kent County Governor's Task Force (GTF) and the Delaware State Police Special Operations Response Team (SORT), executed a narcotics search warrant at a residence, in the 100 block of Jeri Lane, Dover.

Upon making entry into the residence, members of SORT, located Carlisle Lindmark, 20, and Jazmyne Harris, 20, and took them in to custody without incident.

A subsequent search of the residence, produced 65.41 grams of Marijuana, 3 un-prescribed Alprazolam pills and \$3000.00 in

suspected drug money.

Lindmark and Harris were transported to Delaware State Police Troop 3, where they were arrested and formally charged with one count each of: Possession with Intent to Deliver Marijuana, Possession of a Schedule IV Controlled Substance and Conspiracy 2nd Degree.

Lindmark was arraigned in Justice of the Peace Court #2 and released after posting \$6000.00 bail.

Harris was also arraigned in Justice of the Peace Court #2 and released on \$6000.00 unsecured bond.

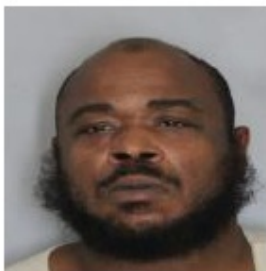

***UPDATE-Arrest Made* Newark Area Verizon Wireless Store Robbed**

Newark – Delaware State Police detectives have arrested Jeremy P. Poore, 30, of Newark, in connection with the September 2016, armed robbery of a Newark area Verizon Wireless store.

The original incident occurred at approximately 10:05 a.m., Saturday, September 10, 2016, at the Verizon Wireless store, located at 1209 Churchman's Road, Newark. Poore entered the business brandishing both a handgun and knife, and ordered employees to turn over money from the safe. After a brief struggle, Poore was able to flee with an undisclosed amount of cash.

Through various investigative leads and measures, to include physical evidence collected at the scene, detectives were able to positively identify Poore as the suspect responsible for the robbery.

On Thursday, December 21, 2017, Poore was taken into custody without incident, and formally charged with 2 counts of

Robbery 1st Degree, and 1 count each of Possession of a Deadly Weapon During the Commission of a Felony, and Wearing a Disguise During the Commission of a Felony.

Poore was arraigned in Justice of the Peace Court #2, and released after posting \$80,000 secured bond.

****Update #2** Magnolia Man Arrested in Connection With Shooting-Capitol Park, Dover**

Dover – The Delaware State Police Troop 3 Major Crimes Unit is continuing its investigation into a shooting that occurred in the Capitol Park Development in early October in which one suspect has been identified and arrested.

The incident occurred around 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, October 11, 2017 in the area of the 100 block of Presidents Drive where a 29-year-old male from Dover was shot by an unknown suspect(s) while standing next to a parked vehicle. The victim, who was shot multiple times, was transported from the scene by EMS to an area hospital where he was admitted in serious condition.

Through investigative measures, a suspect has been identified as 24-year-old **Khalil-Mahlik T. Hanzer** of Magnolia. On Tuesday, October 17, 2017, Hanzer was taken into custody on an outstanding warrant for unrelated charges. A search warrant was executed at the residence where Hanzer was staying and a handgun was recovered.

On Wednesday, December 20, 2017 Hanzer was charged with Attempted Murder First Degree, Possession of a Firearm by a Person Prohibited, and Possession of a Firearm During the

Commission of a Felony. Hanzer was arraigned at Justice of the Peace Court 2 and committed to the James T. Vaughn Correctional Center on \$1,080,000.00 cash bond.

This case continues to remain under investigation by the Major Crimes Unit..
