

# Bank Robbery Suspect Arrested After Violating Court Order



Donald L. ROBB

***Wilmington (19808)*** – Delaware State Police have arrested Donald L. Robb, 40, of Oxford Pennsylvania, for violation of a court order related to a recent bank robbery.

Robb was arrested on Friday, November 10, 2017, for his involvement in the robbery of the Bank of America, located at 2074 Limestone Road, Wilmington. Robb was taken into custody by Troopers while in the parking lot of Delaware Park Casino. As part of his bail agreement Robb was to stay off Delaware Park property.

At approximately 11:00 a.m., on Monday, November 13, 2017, Robb was

observed and positively identified as a banned subject by Delaware Park security officers. Agents from the Division of Gaming Enforcement were alerted and took Robb into custody without incident.

Robb was transported to Delaware State Police Troop 2 where he was arrested and charged with felony Breach of Release. He was then committed to Henry R. Young Correctional Institution in lieu of \$2000.00 secured bond.

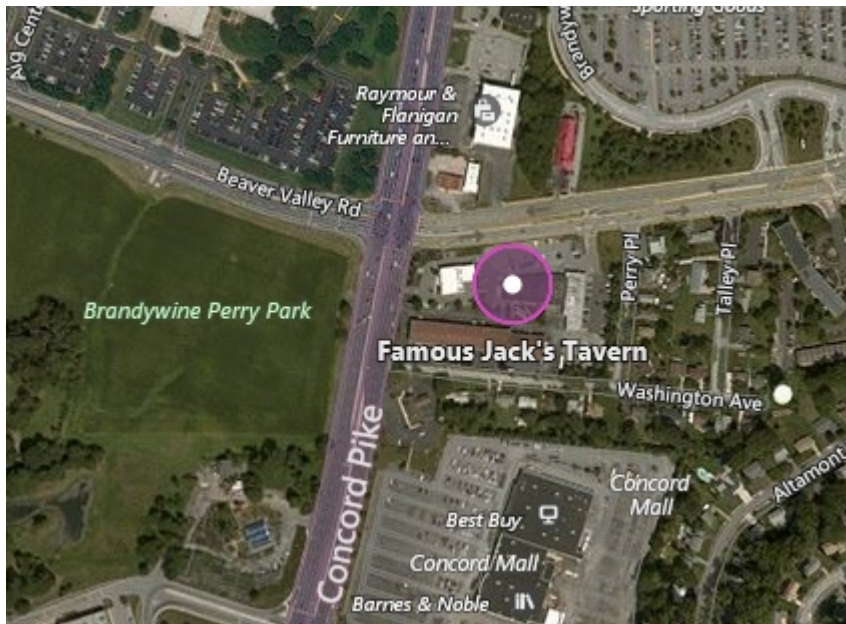

**Troopers Investigating Shots  
Fired Complaint-North  
Wilmington**



**Wilmington (19810)** – Delaware State Police are currently investigating an incident in which shots were fired at an unoccupied vehicle in the parking lot of a Naamans Road tavern.

The incident occurred at approximately 1:10 a.m., Friday, November 11, 2017, when Troopers responded to Famous Jack's Tavern, located at 3100 Naamans Road, Wilmington, for a report of shots fired.

Upon arrival Troopers discovered a silver Nissan Versa parked in the lot, unoccupied, with damaged windows, that appeared to be the result of gunshots. Multiple spent shell casings were also observed on the pavement in the lot.

There are no known injuries related to this incident at this time however the investigation is active and ongoing.

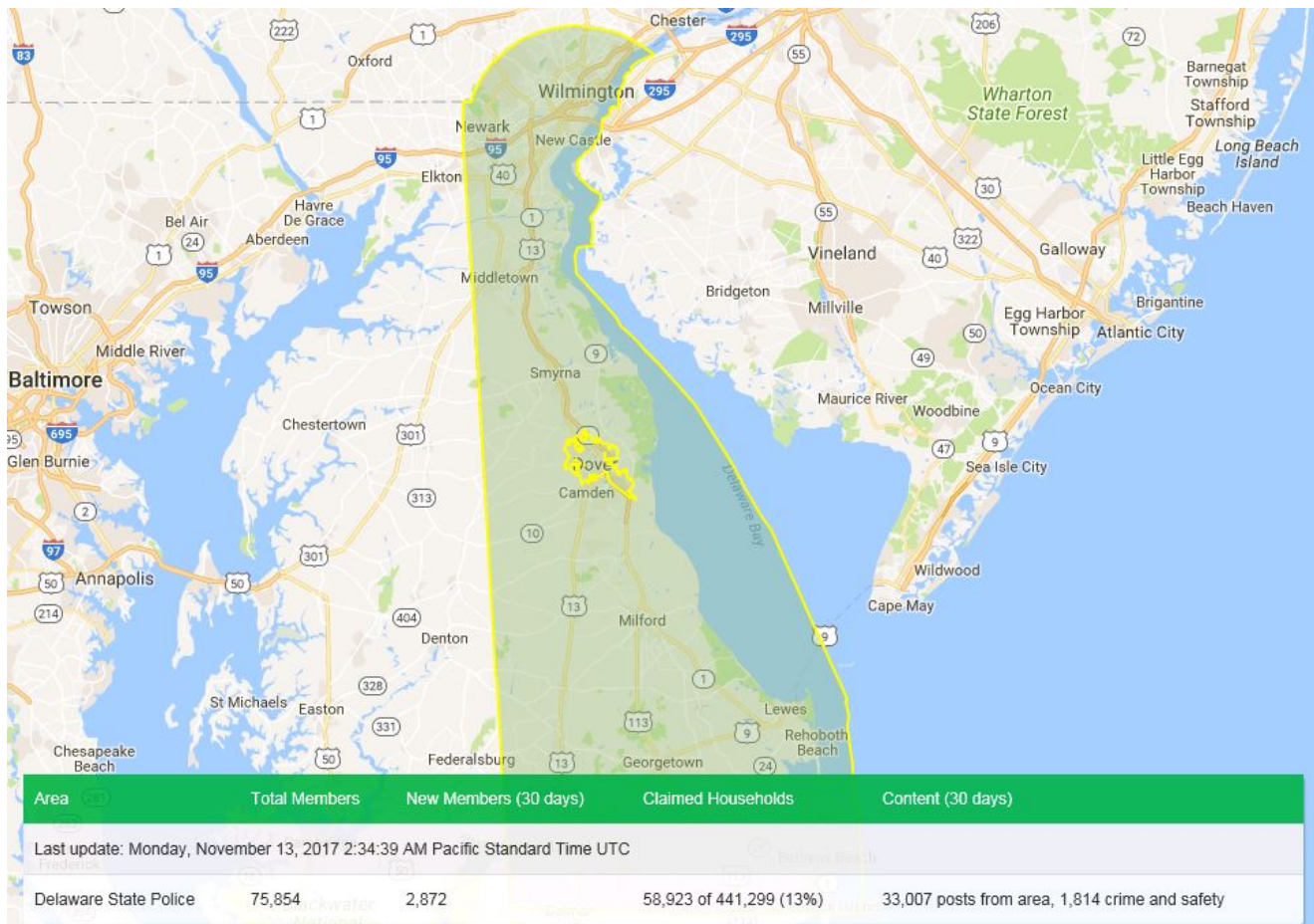

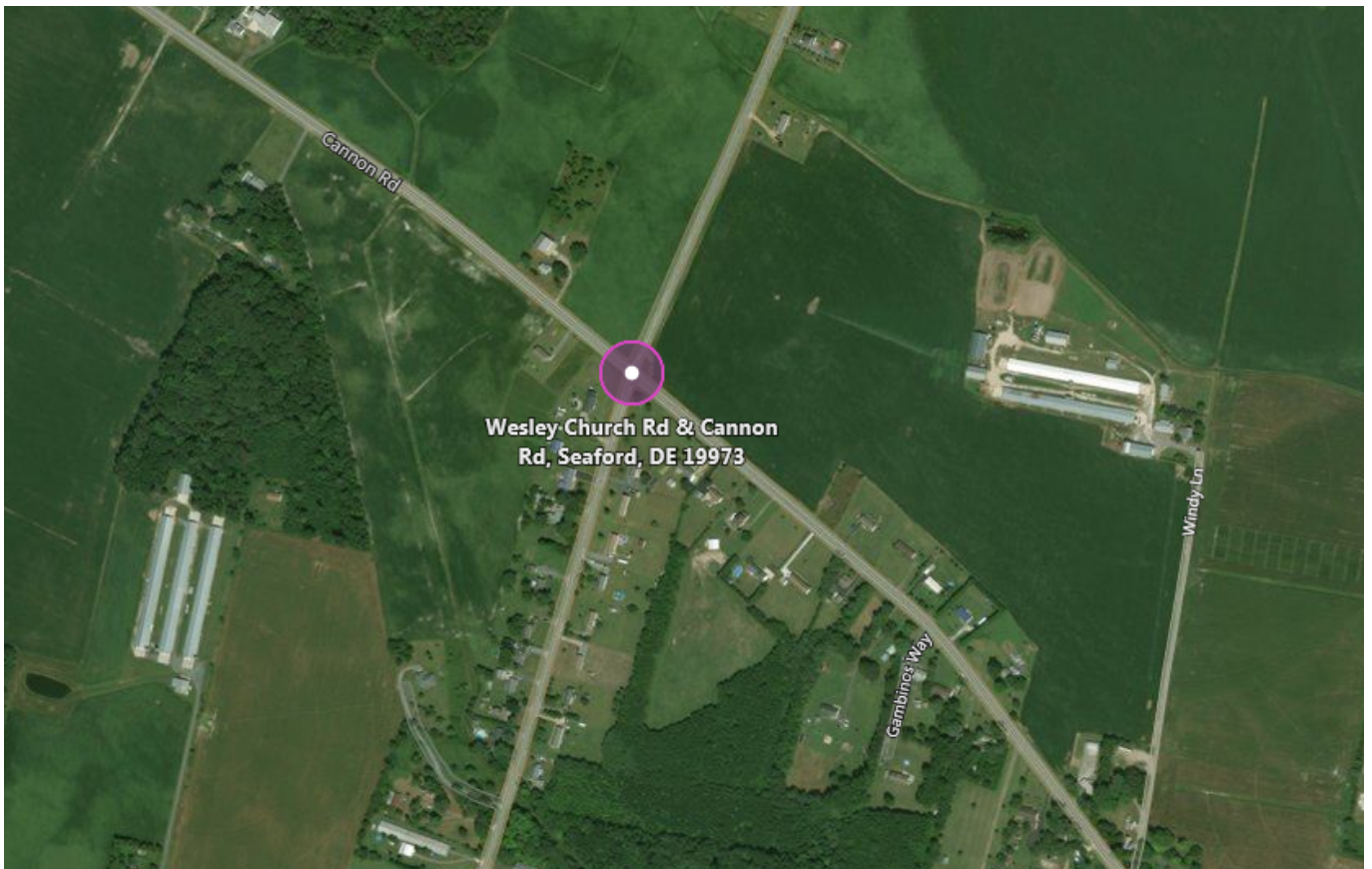

## **Troopers Investigating Crash Involving a Horse and Buggy-Hartly**



**Hartly**– The Delaware State Police is investigating a crash that occurred earlier this morning involving a horse and buggy.

The incident occurred around 7:21 a.m. Monday, November 13, 2017 as a 25-year-old female from Hartly was operating a 2014 Chevrolet Equinox southbound on Pearsons Corner Road just South of Yoder Drive. A horse and buggy driven by a 51-year-old man from Dover was traveling directly in front of the Equinox and was subsequently struck in the rear. The horse fled the scene, however was located uninjured on a nearby farm.

The operator of the Equinox was identified as **Lauren Nickerson**, was properly restrained and not injured. Nickerson was issued a traffic citation for Careless Driving.

The 51-year-old man was removed from the scene by EMS and transported to Bayhealth Kent General Hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

# **Statewide Enforcement Checkpoints Aim to Reduce DUI-Related Crashes and Fatalities**



Delaware – The Delaware State Police and the Office of Highway Safety (OHS) in partnership with local law enforcement

agencies are committed to improving the safety of Delaware's motoring public. On Saturday, November 4, 2017, more than 50 law enforcement officers from across Delaware assembled at several locations in all three counties to conduct statewide impaired driving checkpoints. The focus was on behavioral traffic safety issues such as impaired driving, seat belt use, speeding, child passenger safety, pedestrian and bicycle safety, motorcycle safety, and teen driving issues.

A total of 1,165 vehicles went through the checkpoints. Of those, 19 drivers were detained for further investigation, eight were drug arrests, one DUI arrest, 10 Seatbelt arrests, one cell phone arrest, three wanted person apprehensions, and 18 other traffic arrests.

Checkpoint Strikeforce is a regional sobriety checkpoint campaign aimed at arresting DUI offenders by using high visibility enforcement to deter those who would otherwise choose to drink and drive. In 2017, there have been 3,230 DUI arrests statewide and 24 confirmed fatalities related to impaired driving as of November 2017. The Delaware State Police have teamed up with the Delaware Office of Highway Safety and local law enforcement agencies across the state to coordinate the multi-jurisdictional DUI checkpoints for a safer Delaware.
