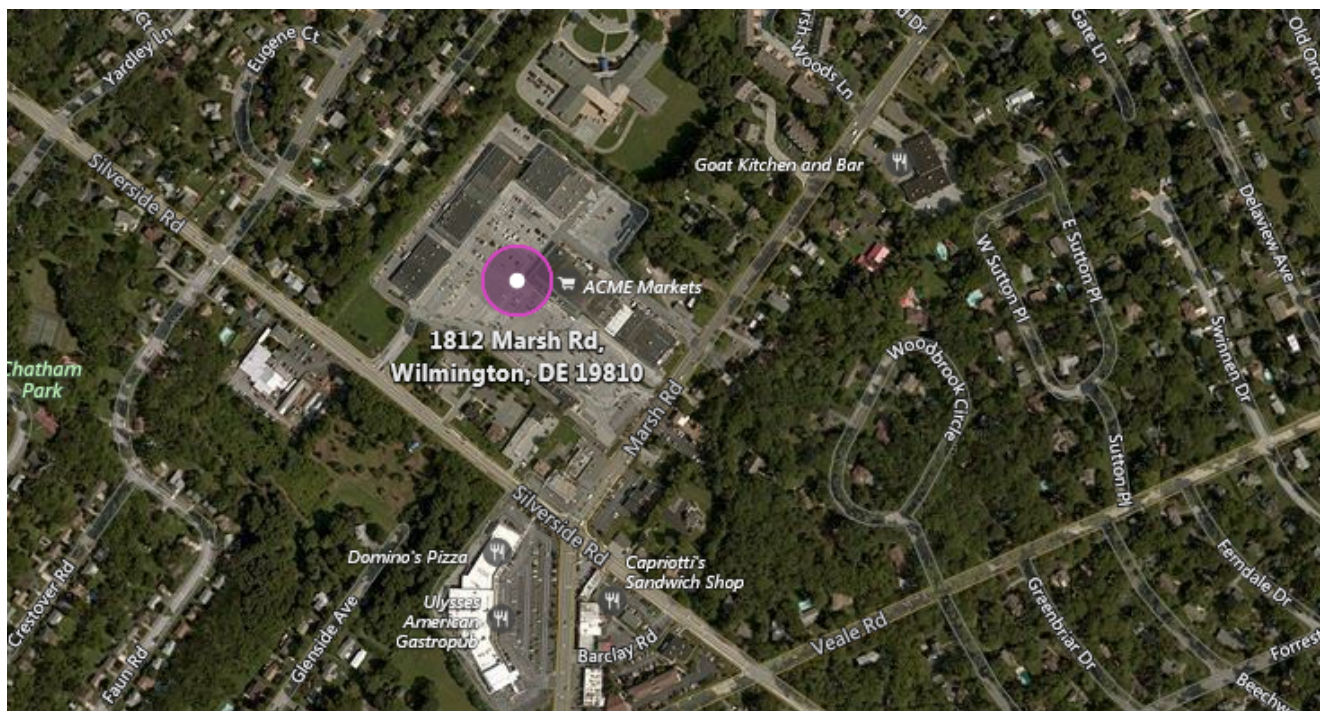


Troopers Investigate Attempted Robbery at Walgreens - Wilmington



Wilmington – The Delaware State Police are investigating an attempted robbery at Walgreens in Branmar Plaza Shopping Center, Wilmington that occurred over night.

The incident occurred on , Friday, October 27, 2017, at approximately 8:12 p.m. when an unknown male suspect entered the Walgreens store located at 1812 Marsh Road, Wilmington in the Branmar Plaza Shopping Center. As a patron of the store was shopping and approaching the cash register to pay for his items, the suspect ran into the business, jumping up and down, yelling that this was a stick up. The suspect appeared to have gotten scared and did not obtain any items before taking off running towards Marsh Road. Once outside the business, it appeared that the suspect got stopped by an unknown male subject who was driving a dark colored pick up truck. A brief struggle ensued and the suspect was able to get away, taking

off running towards Marsh Road behind the Acme.

The suspect was described as a black male, 6'00"-6'02" tall, wearing a dark colored hoodie, dark colored pants, light colored shoes and a black ski mask. No weapons were displayed and no further physical or clothing description available.

Newark – Howard V. Brinn, 93 of Newark, who was the operator of the Toyota Camry involved in the crash which occurred at approximately 7:39 a.m., Tuesday, October 24, 2017 on Otts Chapel Rd. over top of I-95 in Newark, died today, Friday October 27, 2017, as a result of his injuries.

Claymont – Delaware State Police detectives have identified **Amy D. Davis, 31**, as the suspect wanted in connection with a carjacking that occurred on Wednesday, October 18, 2017 at the Wawa, 2621 Philadelphia Pike, Claymont. Davis has been known to frequent motels within the New Castle area as well as the Churchman's Road corridor. The Hyundai Sonata taken in the carjacking has been located.

Active warrants for Davis' arrest are currently on file.

Troopers Investigate Fatal Motor Vehicle Crash - Georgetown

Georgetown- At the request of the Georgetown Police Department, the Delaware State Police are currently investigating a fatal motor vehicle crash involving a pedestrian that occurred on Monday, October 23, 2017 on South DuPont Highway.

The initial investigation has determined the incident occurred at approximately 9:50 p.m., on Monday, October 23, 2017 when a 2003 Chevrolet Cavalier, operated by a 27-year-old Dagsboro woman, was traveling southbound on S. DuPont Highway in the left lane, approaching College Park Drive in Georgetown.

A 23-year-old male from Georgetown, Delaware then proceeded to walk eastbound across the southbound lanes of South DuPont Highway, into the path of the Chevrolet. The male was struck with the front of the Chevrolet, ultimately coming to rest in the median of South DuPont Highway. The operator of the Chevrolet immediately stopped and remained at the scene.

The pedestrian, identified as Dimitri Rich, 23, of Georgetown, Delaware, was transported from the scene to Beebe Hospital with significant traumatic injuries. Once stabilized, Rich was transferred to Christiana Hospital where he was admitted in critical condition. On Wednesday, October 25, 2017 at 7:08 p.m. Mr. Rich succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced dead.

The Chevrolet operator sustained no injuries. Drug or alcohol involvement is not being considered a factor on her behalf.

The Delaware State Police Reconstruction Unit are continuing their investigation into this incident. No charges have been filed at this time.

The southbound lanes of DuPont Boulevard were closed for approximately 2 hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

Troopers Seeking Public's Assistance In Locating Organized Theft Ring Suspects-New Castle County

The Delaware State Police are asking for the public's assistance in locating the above pictured suspects who are wanted for their involvement in an organized retail theft ring.

Lucius Jones, 50 of Waymart, PA, Maurice McCorkle, 31, of Philadelphia, PA, and Lashanda Anderson, 35, also of Philadelphia, all have active felony warrants on file, stemming from multiple theft incidents that have occurred at Marshall's locations throughout New Castle County, DE.

On various dates in September and October, 2017, the suspects conspired to steal large quantities of merchandise from the Marshall's location at 4607 Kirkwood Highway, Wilmington, as well as the Marshalls located at 4000 Fashion Center Blvd., Newark.

The suspects have been seen occupying a 2012 Mercedes Benz GL4, silver in color, bearing Delaware registration 244719 (similar vehicle pictured below) as well as a red Nissan four door vehicle with unknown registration.

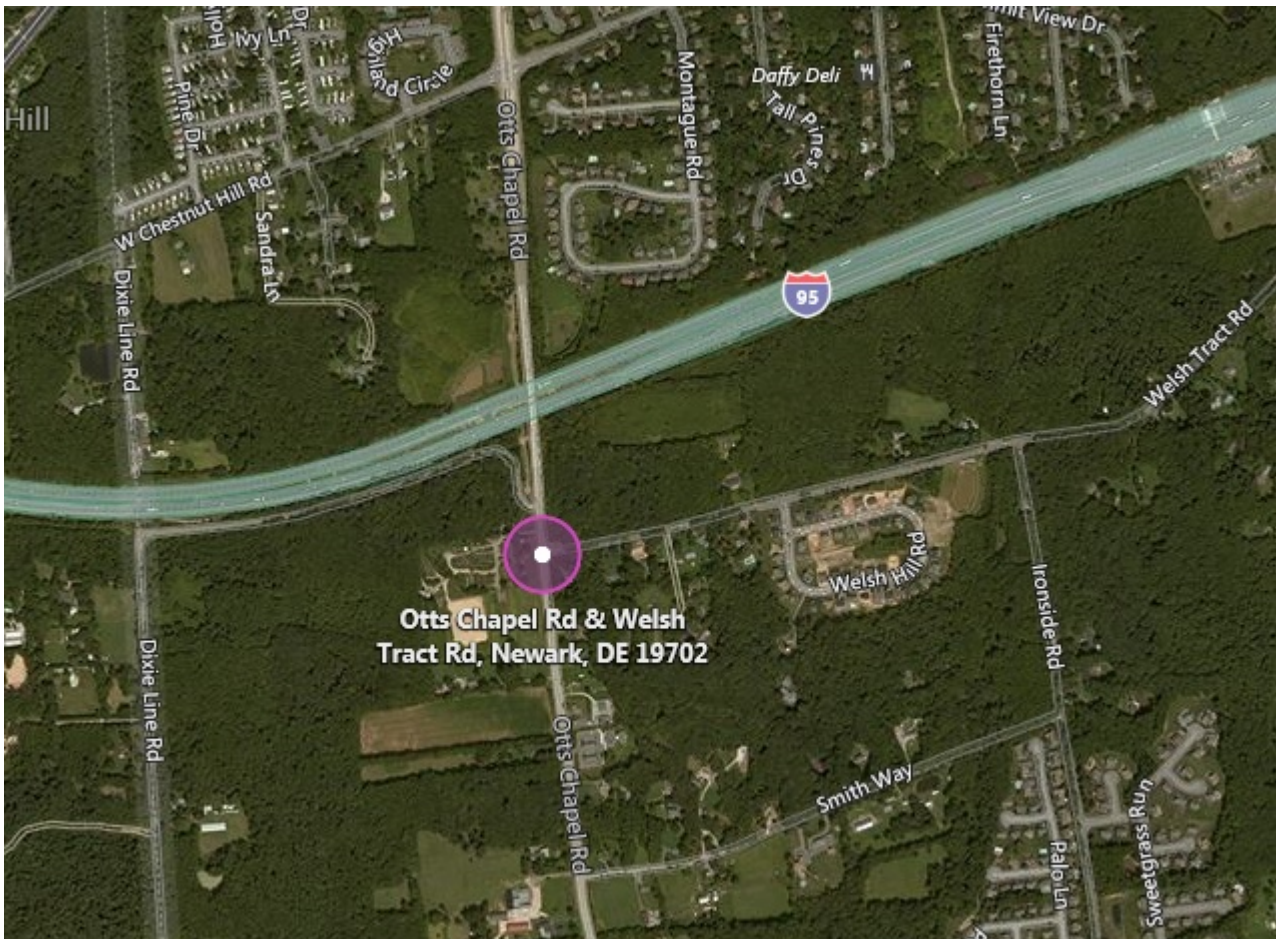

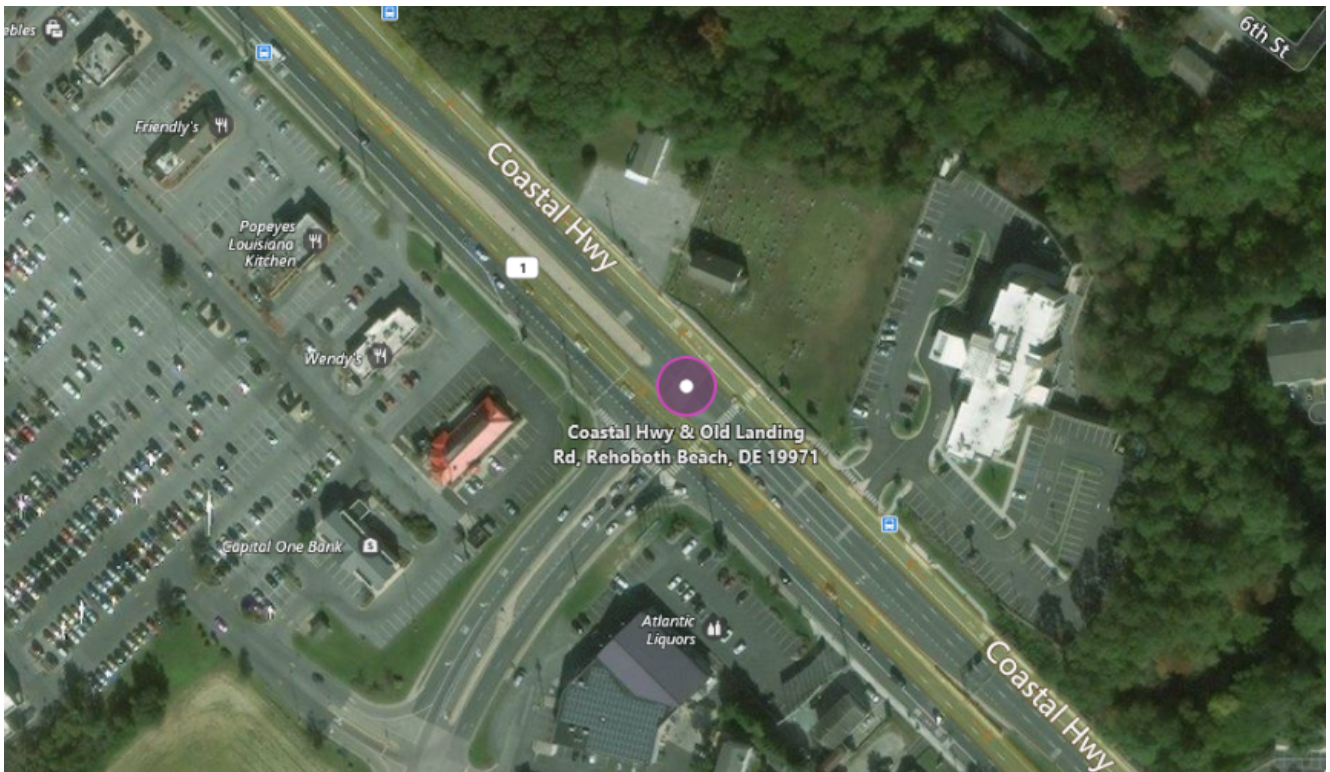

****Update** Troopers Investigating Fatal Crash Involving Pedestrian On Coastal Hwy. - Rehoboth**



Rehoboth— The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating a fatal crash that occurred on Coastal Highway in Rehoboth on Wednesday, October 25, 2017.

The incident occurred around 7:42 p.m. Wednesday, October 25, 2017 as a 66-year-old Millville man was operating a 2015 Mercedes-Benz in the center lane on southbound Coastal Highway in the area of Old Landing Road. A pedestrian was on foot and attempting to cross Coastal Highway in an easterly direction, directly in the path of the Mercedes-Benz. The operator of the Mercedes-Benz was unable to avoid the pedestrian and struck the victim with the left front bumper. The victim was forced up onto the hood and windshield before falling off in

the middle of the far left lane on Coastal Highway. The victim was pronounced dead at the scene.

The Mercedes-Benz came to a controlled stop in the southbound shoulder, south of the collision and remained at the scene. The operator and passenger of the Mercedes-Benz were properly restrained and uninjured as a result of the crash. Alcohol/Unsafe speed is not a factor on behalf of the operator.

The victim, 54-year-old Irving T. Cannon of Rehoboth Beach was wearing all dark clothing none of which was reflective, and was not carrying a light or crossing in a crosswalk. Alcohol is being considered as a factor on his behalf.

The Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing their investigation into this incident and asks anyone with information to please contact *Detective J. Burns* at (302) 703-3266. No charges have been filed at this time.

The Southbound lanes of Coastal Highway in the area of Old Landing Road were closed for approximately three hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

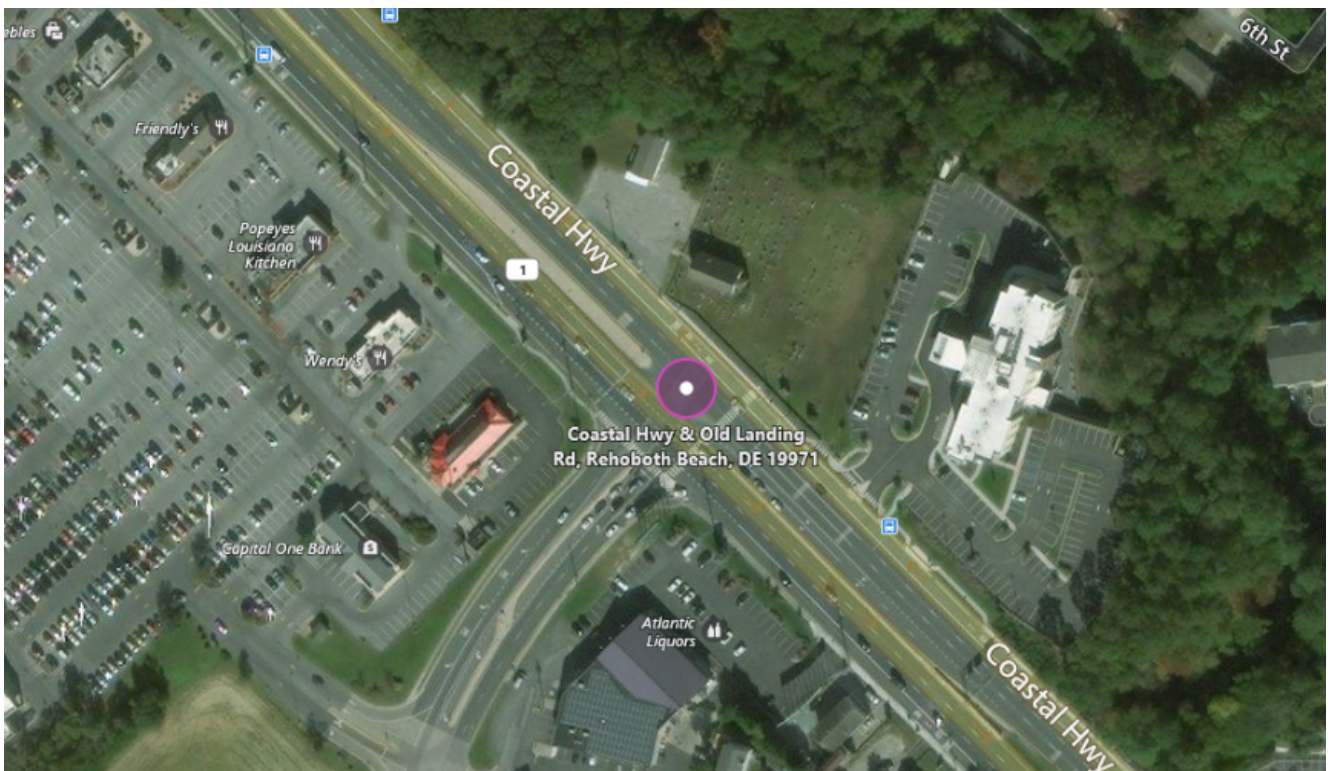

***TRAFFIC ADVISORY* Troopers Investigating Fatal Motor Vehicle Crash In Rehoboth-Coastal Highway South of Old Landing Road Closed**



Rehoboth- Delaware State Police are currently on scene of a fatal motor vehicle crash on Coastal Highway in the area of Old Landing Road. Southbound Coastal Highway south of Old Landing Road is completely shut down.

The initial investigation has determined that the crash occurred at approximately 7:49 p.m. this evening, Wednesday, October 25, 2017 on southbound Coastal Highway at Old Landing Road, and involves a passenger car and a pedestrian. As a result of the crash, the pedestrian has been declared dead at the scene.

The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is enroute to the scene and will assume the investigation. Expect delays in the area and seek alternate routes of travel. Further details will be released as they become available.

State Police Investigate Home Invasion – Seaford



Seaford – The Delaware State Police are investigating a home invasion that occurred in Seaford early this morning.

The preliminary investigation has determined the incident occurred around 4:16 a.m. Wednesday, October 25, 2017 when troopers responded to the 11,000 block of Orange Blossom lane, Seaford for a reported Home Invasion. The investigation revealed that an unknown subject entered the residence and confronted two female victims, who had been sleeping in the living room. The suspect grabbed one of the victims and dragged her through the residence while displaying a handgun. The suspect then rifled through the residence and took cell phones and a video game system. As the victims attempted to exit the residence they encountered the suspect who then fired his weapon in an unknown direction. The suspect then fled the scene. The victims were not injured.

The suspect was described as a black male, 5'10" to 6'00" tall, 150-160 lbs., wearing dark clothing with an unknown make and model handgun.
