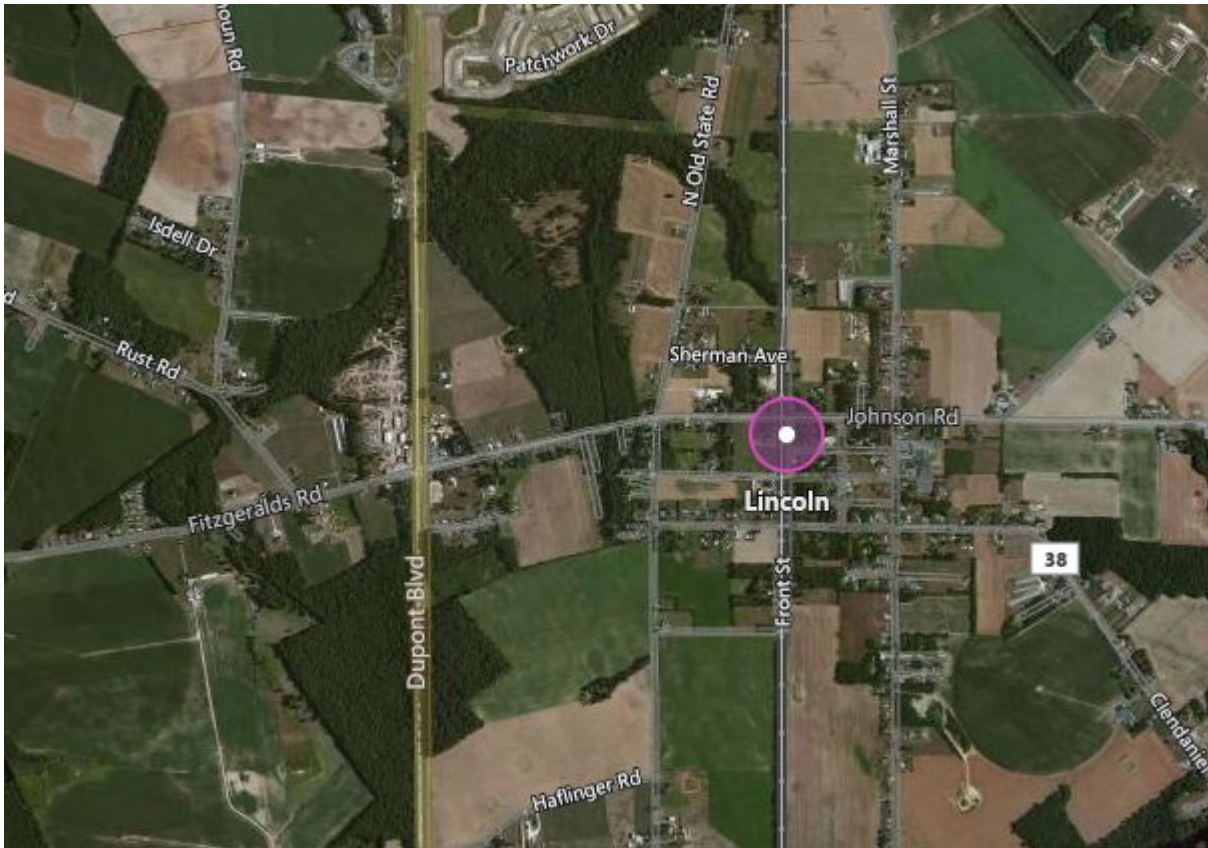

Lincoln – The Delaware State Police are currently operating in the 18000 block of Johnson Road for a report of a possibly armed barricaded subject located in a residence.

The incident began at approximately 1:03 a.m. this morning, Wednesday October 4, 2017, when troopers were called to the residence to check on the welfare of an unstable male subject alone in the house.

Troopers continue to assess the situation with no further details available at this time.

Several residences in the area of the incident have been evacuated as a precaution. Johnson Road is currently closed between DuPont Boulevard (US113) and North Old State Road. Motorists are advised to avoid the area and seek alternate routes of travel.

Traffic Stop Near Toll Plaza Nets Heroin

Dover – The Delaware State Police have arrested a Pennsylvania man for heroin possession following a traffic stop.

The incident occurred on Tuesday October 3, 2017 around 1:08 p.m. when a trooper on patrol clocked a white passenger car traveling above the posted 25 mph speed limit approaching the toll plaza on SR1 southbound. A traffic stop was conducted and as the trooper made contact with the operator and sole occupant of the car, identified as **Vincent Clark**, 37 of Lansdowne, Pennsylvania, an odor of marijuana was detected coming from the interior of the car. A computer inquiry revealed Clark's license was suspended. Upon exiting the car, a search was conducted and troopers located 11,115 bags (77.805 grams) of heroin and .16 grams of marijuana.

Vincent Clark was transported back to Troop 3 in Camden where he was charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance in a Tier 5 Quantity (Heroin), Possession With Intent to Deliver Heroin, Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Driving Without a Valid License, and Speeding. He was arraigned at JP2 and committed to James T. Vaughn Correctional Center on \$40,302.00 secured bond.

****UPDATE** Troopers Investigating Tractor Trailer Crash-US 13 southbound at Hyetts Corner Rd.- Middletown**



Middletown – Delaware State Police have concluded their investigation into a collision which occurred at approximately 1:54 p.m. on Monday October 2nd, 2017 at the intersection of Hyetts Corner Rd. and US 13 southbound.

The investigation revealed that a 2001 Mack Dump Truck operated by a 67 year old Newark man was attempting to turn from Hyetts Corner eastbound onto US 13 northbound, proceeding with a green light. A 2009 Volvo tractor trailer operated by Victor Nyanteng, 65, of Hillside NJ was travelling US 13 southbound and proceeded through the intersection with Hyetts Corner Rd. against the red light at which time both vehicles collided.

Traffic on US 13 southbound was restricted for an extended period of time as both vehicles had to be towed from the scene.

The operator of the Mack dump truck was treated on scene and transported to Christiana Hospital with minor injuries.

Nyanteng who was uninjured, was cited for Failure To Stop At A Red Light.

Both operators were properly restrained and drugs or alcohol is not being considered as a factor.

****Update #2 – Names Released** State Police Investigating Serious Crash, Greenwood**

Greenwood – The Delaware State Police are releasing the names of two people that were killed in last Friday's crash northwest of Greenwood.

The incident occurred around 9:18 p.m. Friday September 29, 2017 as Christopher J. Bramble, 41 of Georgetown, was operating a 2008 Ford F150 pickup truck eastbound on Andrews Road just east of Greenwood Road. For unknown

reasons, the pickup truck's right side tires went off the south edge of the roadway causing the rear of the vehicle to rotate in a counter-clockwise direction before crossing the westbound lane and traveling off the north side of the roadway. As the truck traveled off the roadway, it struck a mailbox with its right side. The pickup's right side tires then gouged into the grass and overturned several times through the front yard of a private residence ejecting Bramble and Ciera Smoot onto the ground. The Ford pickup came to stop in a corn field facing upright in a northerly direction. All three occupants were not properly restrained.

Christopher Bramble was removed from the scene by EMS and transported to Bayhealth Milford Memorial Hospital (MMH) where he was pronounced dead.

Ciera B. Smoot, 21 (originally listed as 22) of Greenwood, (right side passenger's seat) was transported by EMS to MMH and later transferred to Christiana Medical Center where she is admitted in critical condition. She died as a result of her injuries on Saturday September 30, 2017.

A 45-year-old Harrington man, seated in the back row middle seat, was taken to Nanticoke Memorial Hospital by EMS where he was treated and released with non-life-threatening injuries.

The Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing their investigation into this incident. Alcohol and speed may have been contributing factors in the case. Andrewville Road at Greenwood Road was closed for approximately four and a half hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

****Update #2 – Operator Dies****

Serious Crash Investigated East of Ellendale

Ellendale – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing to investigate a fatal crash that occurred last Friday east of Ellendale.

The incident occurred around 11:06 a.m. Friday September 29, 2017 as Sven Conquest, 41 of Georgetown, was operating 2004 Chrysler Pacifica westbound on Hummingbird Road entering the intersection at Holly Tree Road. A 49-year-old Georgetown man was operating a 2008 Chevrolet Silverado eastbound on Hummingbird Road approaching the same intersection. As the two vehicles converged, Conquest lost control of the Chrysler and exited the north side of the roadway before re-entering and swerving directly into the path of the Silverado. The 49-year-old pickup driver attempted to swerve to the right, however the right side front of the Chrysler struck the front center of the truck near the south edge of the roadway. After the impact, both vehicles were forced off the roadway and came to a stop.

Sven Conquest was not properly restrained and was airlifted by Delaware State Police Aviation (Trooper 2) to Christiana Medical Center where he was admitted with serious injuries. He died as a result of his injuries on Saturday September 30, 2017.

The 49-year-old pickup truck operator, was not properly restrained, and was transported by ambulance to Bayhealth Milford Memorial Hospital (MMH) where he was treated and released with non-life-threatening injuries.

A 55-year-old male passenger in the pickup truck was not properly restrained and was also transported by EMS to MMH with non-life-threatening injuries.

The State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing their investigation into this incident. It is unknown at this time if drugs or alcohol were contributing factors on behalf of the Chrysler Pacifica operator. No charges have been filed. Holly Tree Road at Hummingbird Road was closed for approximately three hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.
