

Drugs Located After Short Pursuit of Seaford Man

Millsboro – The Delaware State Police have arrested a Seaford man for drugs and traffic related charges after a short pursuit that began in Oak Orchard.

The incident began around 10:22 p.m. Thursday September 28, 2017 as a trooper on patrol observed an Oldsmobile Aurora driving erratically on Oak Orchard Road. The trooper attempted to perform a traffic stop on the car when it turned into a nearby Royal Farms and then fled southbound on Oak Orchard Road. The car then made a U-turn in the River Mobile Home Park, just off Oak Orchard Road, and then continued northbound on Oak Orchard Road across John J. Williams Highway (SR24) before coming to a stop at the intersection of Mount Joy Road and Townsend Road. **Hashun A. Mitchell**, 22 of Seaford, was taken into custody without any further incident.

Just prior to crossing over SR24, Mitchell was observed throwing an object out of his driver's side window. This object was later located by troopers and determined to be

1,300 bags (9.1 grams) of heroin. A search of the Aurora also revealed 1.17 grams of marijuana.

Hashun Mitchell was transported to Troop 4 where he was charged with Possession with Intent to Deliver Heroin, Possession of Heroin, Tampering with Physical Evidence, Disregarding a Police Officer's Signal, Resisting Arrest, Driving Under the Influence of a Drug, Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and numerous other traffic related offenses. He was arraigned at JP3 and committed to Sussex Correctional Institution on \$38,762.00 cash bond.

***Traffic Advisory* Troopers Investigating Serious Motor Vehicle Crash – Greenville (Update #1)**

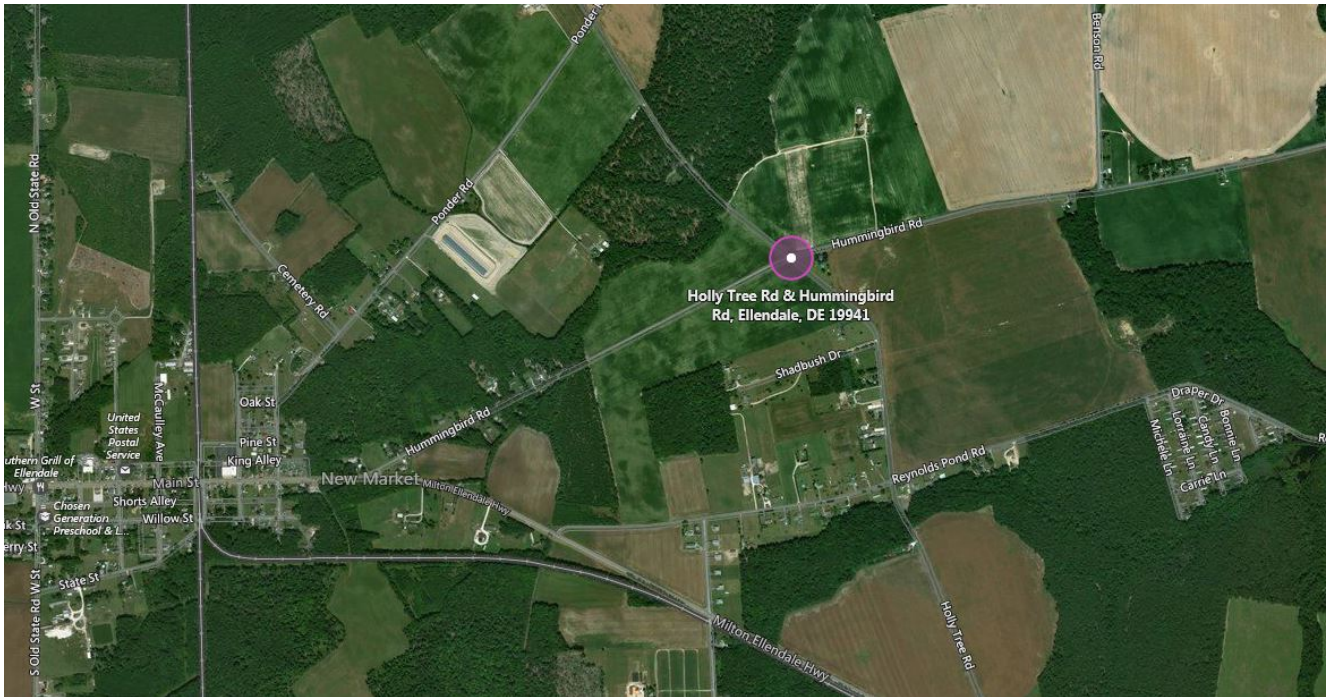

Troopers Investigating Burglary to North Harrington Shore Stop



Harrington – The Delaware State Police are investigating an early morning burglary to a gas station north of Harrington.

The incident occurred around 2:40 a.m. Friday September 29, 2017, when an alarm activation was received by the Kent County Emergency Operations Center (9-1-1) at the Shore Stop located at 16381 South DuPont Highway. Troopers and Officers from Harrington Police Department responded to the store and observed the glass to a door on the north side had been

shattered. Further investigation revealed the suspect(s) entered the store by using an unknown object to break the window and then removed an ATM machine before fleeing in an unknown direction.

The suspect depicted in the surveillance image appears to be a male wearing a light colored hooded sweatshirt, dark pants, a beanie on his head, and a mask covering the lower portion of his face. No other information is available on a possible second suspect.

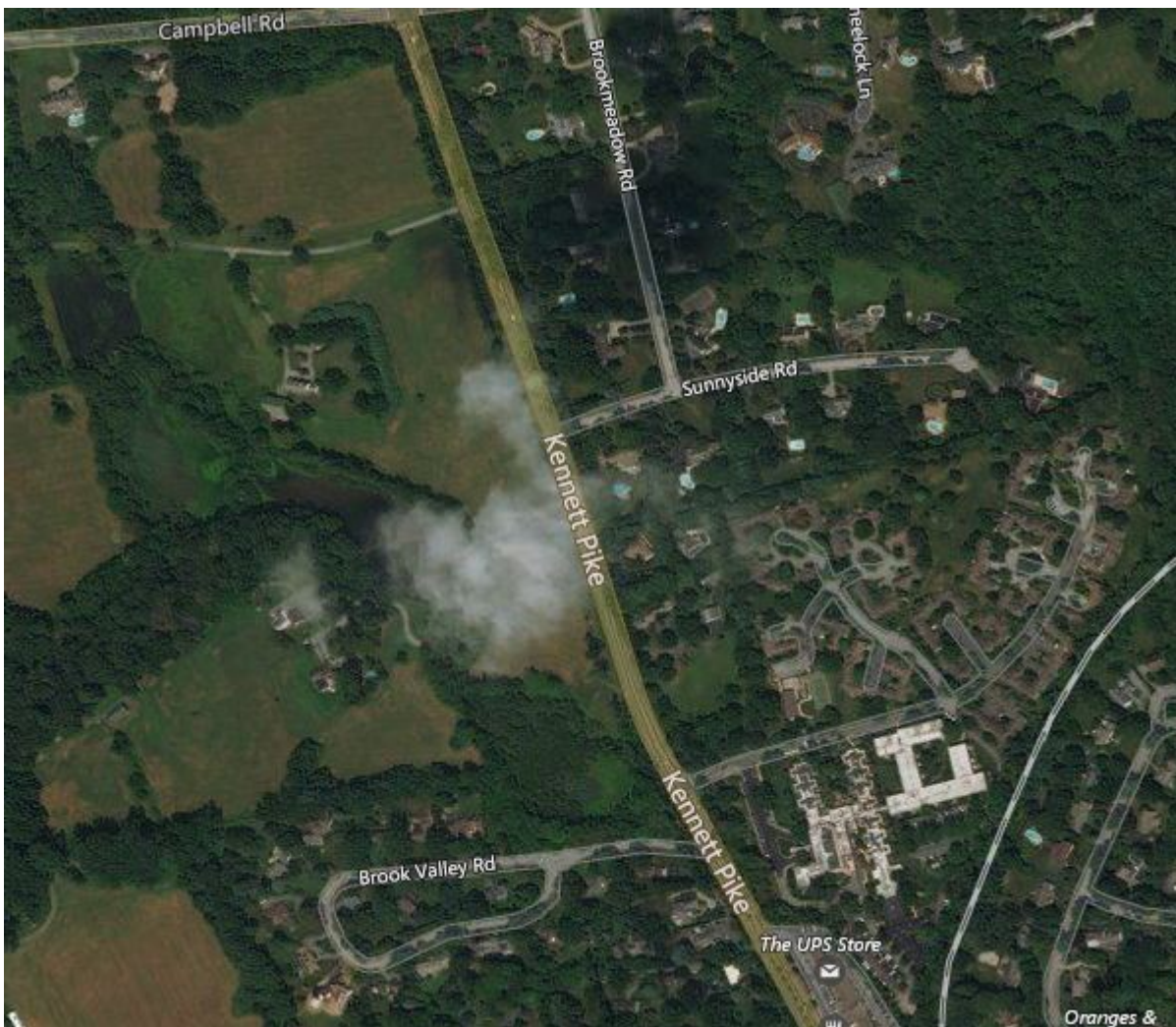

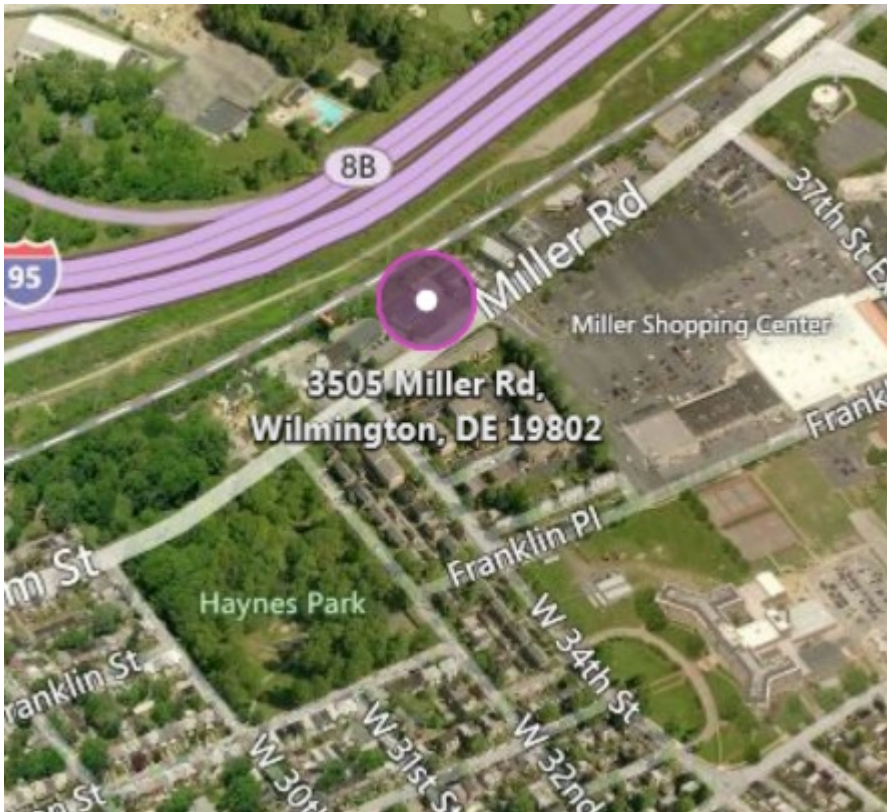
The investigation is ongoing and further details will be released as they become available.

Troopers Investigate Robbery of North Wilmington Country Farms Store



Wilmington (19802) – Delaware State Police are currently investigating the armed robbery of a North Wilmington convenience store.

The initial investigation has determined that the incident occurred at approximately 10:50 a.m. on Tuesday September 26, 2017, at the Country Farms located at 3505 Miller Rd. A male suspect entered the business and confronted a male clerk who was standing behind the sales counter. The suspect then displayed an unknown make and model handgun and demanded money from the cash register. The male clerk complied with the suspect's demands and turned over an undisclosed amount of money. Once obtaining the money the suspect fled the business in an unknown direction.

The suspect was described as black male 25-27 years of age, approximately 5'11" tall with a thin build. He was last seen wearing a gray colored hooded sweatshirt, light-colored blue jeans and black shoes. He also had a mask covering a portion of his face.

Troopers Seek Public's Assistance in Identifying Burglary Suspect

Wilmington (19803) – Delaware State Police are seeking the public's assistance in attempting to identify the subject in these surveillance photographs who was involved in the burglary of a North Wilmington grocery store.

The incident occurred at the Shop Rite located at 1300 Rocky Run Parkway, Wilmington, on Wednesday, September 13, 2017, between the hours of 1:00 and 2:00 a.m. The initial investigation indicated that the suspect entered the business and removed merchandise from various locations throughout the store before fleeing the property in an unknown direction.

The suspect was described as a black male, 30-40 years of age, 6'00" tall with a thin build. The suspect was also described as having a "salt & pepper" colored goatee.

Pennsylvania Man Succumbs to Injuries Sustained in Weekend Collision



Wilmington (19809) – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit continues the investigation of a motor vehicle crash which occurred on September 16th and that has claimed the life of a Pennsylvania man.

The investigation thus far has determined that the crash occurred on Saturday, September 16, 2017 at approximately 5:44 p.m., as a 26-year-old Wilmington male was operating a 2011 Volkswagen GTI and was traveling in a westbound direction on Cauffiel Parkway, attempting to cross the northbound lanes of Philadelphia Pike. As the Volkswagen entered the left hand lane of northbound Philadelphia Pike, its left side was struck by a 2014 Honda Accord, which was being operated by Edwin Jamieson, 70, of Aston, PA. After the impact both vehicles

came to rest in the southbound lanes of Philadelphia Pike just north of the intersection with Bellevue Parkway.

Edwin Jamieson, who was properly restrained at the time of the crash, was treated at the scene by New Castle County Paramedics. He was then transported by EMS to the Wilmington Hospital where he was admitted for his injuries. He was cited by troopers with Failure to Stop at a Red Light. The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit was subsequently contacted and advised that Edwin Jamieson succumbed to his injuries at the hospital on Sunday, September 24.

A 70-year-old female passenger in Jamieson's vehicle, who was also properly restrained at the time of the crash, was treated at the scene by paramedics. She was then transported to the Wilmington Hospital where she was treated for her non-life threatening injuries.

The male operator, and sole occupant of the Volkswagen, was also treated at the scene before being transported to the Wilmington Hospital where he was admitted for his non-life threatening injuries. He was also properly restrained at the time of the crash.

This crash remains under investigation by the Delaware State Police.

New Castle Man Charged Following Serious Assault

Wilmington (19801) – Delaware State Police have arrested a New Castle man and charged him in connection with the serious assault of a male subject which occurred at an area motel last weekend.

The initial investigation began on Saturday, September 23, 2017, at approximately 6:45 p.m. after troopers observed an argument occurring between a male and a female in the area of the Fairview Inn, located at 1051 S. Market Street. As troopers intervened, they learned that the two subjects were arguing over the assault of a 48-year-old male which had just occurred at the motel. Troopers further learned that the male victim had been involved in a verbal altercation with a second male, later identified as Jordan R. Slevin, 27, of New Castle. After the verbal altercation, Slevin and the victim separated, however, a short time later, Slevin approached the victim from behind and proceeded to strike him in the head several times with a metal pipe. Slevin then removed a cell phone from one of the victim's pants pockets before fleeing on foot in an unknown direction.

The 48-year-old victim was treated at the scene by New Castle County Paramedics before being transported by EMS to the Christiana Hospital where he was treated for his serious

injuries.

After further investigation, which included interviews and the examination of video surveillance footage, troopers were able to positively identify Jordan Slevin as the suspect and obtained warrants charging him with Assault 1st Degree, Possession of a Deadly Weapon During the Commission of a Felony, and Theft.

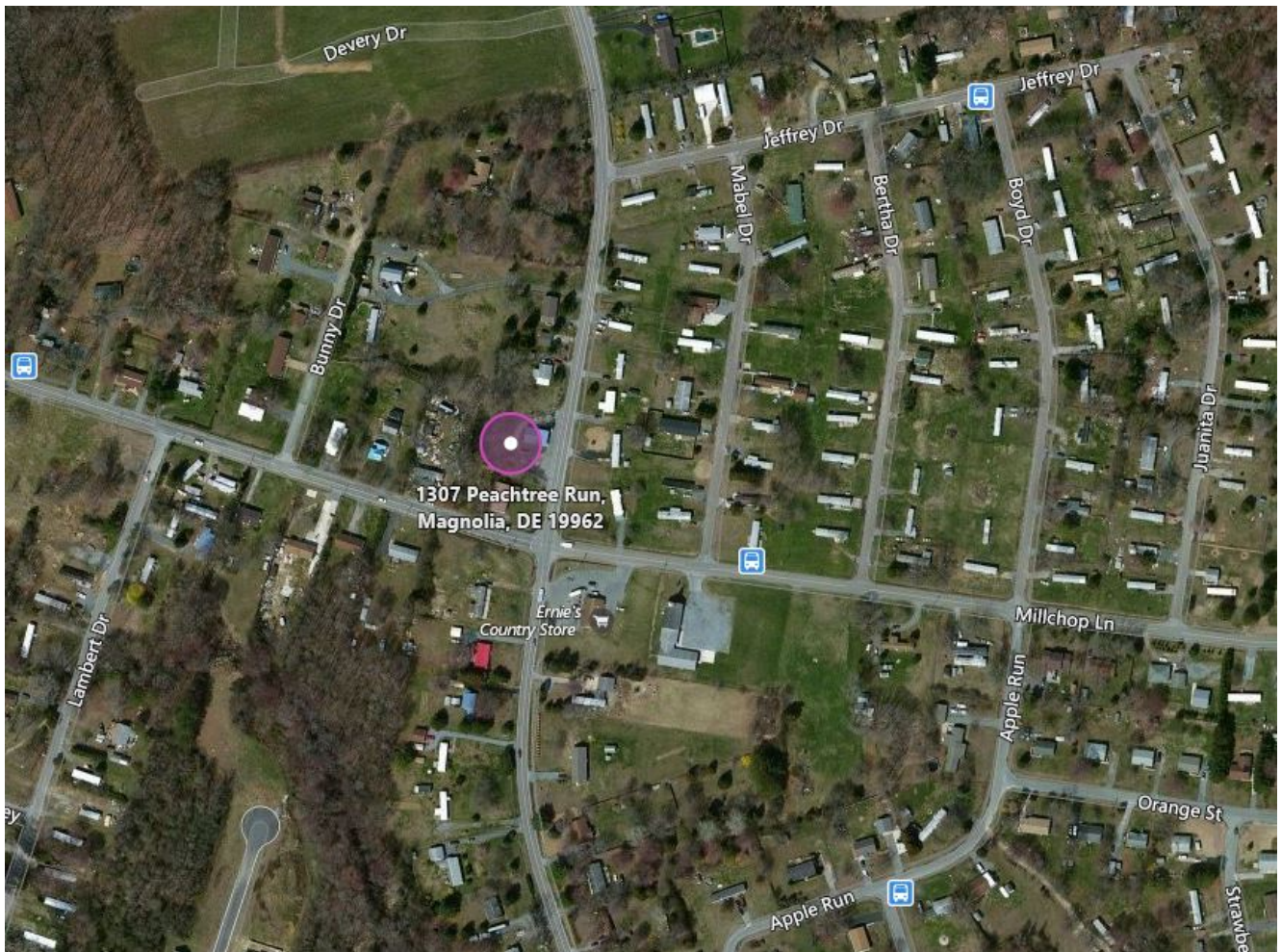
On Monday, September 25, 2017, Jordan Slevin turned himself in to detectives at Troop 2. He was arraigned at JP Court 11 and committed to the Howard Young Correctional Institution in default of \$40,500.00 secured bail.

**Detectives Investigating
Robbery of Woodside Liquors**



Magnolia – The Delaware State Police are investigating an armed robbery of an area liquor store.

The incident occurred at approximately 9:45 p.m., Wednesday September 27, 2017, as a male subject entered the Woodside Liquors, located at 1307 Peachtree Run, armed with a handgun. The suspect pointed the gun at an adult male customer that was leaving the store and told him to leave. The suspect then confronted the female employee at the counter and demanded cash. The clerk complied with the demand and turned over an undisclosed amount of cash before the suspect exited the store and ran in a northerly direction. The customer and employee were not injured.

The suspect was described as black male, 5'10"-6'00" tall, 180-200lbs. He was last seen wearing jeans, black shoes, a black jacket, gloves and a hat. (No further physical or clothing description). Armed with an unknown type handgun.
