

****Traffic Advisory** – Troopers Investigating Fatal Motor Vehicle Crash-Pike Creek**



Pike Creek- The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit are currently investigating a fatal motor vehicle crash that occurred this morning in Pike Creek.

The initial investigation has determined that the crash occurred at approximately 11:37 a.m., Thursday, September 07, 2017, on New Linden Hill Road south of Pike Creek Boulevard and involves two vehicles. As a result of the crash the passenger of one of the vehicles was transported to Christiana Hospital and has been declared dead.

New Linden Hill Road is closed in both directions between Skyline Drive and Pike Creek Boulevard and traffic is being diverted from the crash scene. Commuters are asked to find alternate routes of travel and should expect lengthy delays in

the area.

Arrests Made in Crabapple Lane Drug Investigation

Lincoln – The Delaware State Police Sussex County Drug Unit has arrested multiple people following an investigation into the sale of illegal narcotics in the Lincoln area.

Detectives assigned to the Drug Unit, along with the assistance of the Sussex County Governor's Task Force, Troop 7 Pro-Active Criminal Enforcement (P.A.C.E.) team, State Police Special Operations Response Team (S.O.R.T.), Delaware Department of Correction, and Milford Police Department, conducted search warrants located in the 19000 block of Crabapple Lane and the 8000 block of Greentop Road around 11:00 a.m., Tuesday September 5, 2017. Upon the detectives arrival, numerous individuals were contacted and taken into custody. Upon conducting the searches, detectives located a total of 3043 bags of heroin (21.301 grams), 28.24 grams of cocaine, 11 Suboxone strips, over \$9,500.00 in suspected drug proceeds, as well as a .22 caliber rifle.

The following suspects were charged as a result of the investigation:

- **Darus E. Young**, 42 of Millsboro; Possession Heroin, Possession with Intent to Deliver Heroin, Possession Cocaine, Possession with Intent to Deliver Cocaine, Conspiracy 2nd, Resisting Arrest, and Possession Drug Paraphernalia. Arraigned at JP2 and committed to Sussex Correctional Institution on \$130,000.00 cash bond.
- **Antonio J. Belfield**, 33 of Lincoln; Possession Heroin, Possession with Intent to Deliver Heroin, Possession Cocaine, Possession with Intent to Deliver Cocaine, Conspiracy 2nd, Tampering with Evidence, and Possession Drug Paraphernalia. Arraigned at JP2 and committed to Sussex Correctional Institution on \$130,000.00 cash bond.
- **William Snyder**, 39 of Lincoln; two counts of Possession Firearm by Person Prohibited; Maintaining a Drug Property; Possession of Heroin; Possession Drug Paraphernalia. Arraigned at JP2 and committed to SCI on \$24,000.00 secured bond.
- **McKayla Snyder-Shirey**, 19 of Lincoln; Maintaining a Drug Property and Possession Marijuana. Arraigned at JP2 and released on \$2,500.00 unsecured bond.

State Police Investigating Serious Crash Involving Bicyclist



Milford – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is currently investigating a serious crash involving a bicyclist.

Preliminary investigation reveals the incident occurred around 7:35 a.m. Thursday September 7, 2017 when Thomas H. Draper, 76 of Milford, was bicycling eastbound on Slaughter Beach Road in the area of Wells Road when he was struck by a 2013 Ford F150 pickup truck operated by Shawn E. Armstrong, 37 of Lewes, who was also traveling eastbound on Slaughter Beach Road. The pickup truck stopped immediately after the collision and called 9-1-1.

Thomas Draper was initially transported to Bayhealth Milford Memorial Hospital before being airlifted to Baltimore Shock Trauma in critical condition.

Shawn Armstrong was uninjured in the collision.

The Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing their investigation into this incident. Drug and alcohol use do not appear to be a factor in this case. No charges have been

filed at this time. Slaughter Beach Road was closed for approximately three hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

Jester Jr., 35 of Felton, was arrested at his residence Wednesday September 6, 2017 by detectives and transported back to Troop 3 where he was charged with Leaving the Scene of a Collision Resulting in Death and Failure to Report a Collision Resulting in Death. He was arraigned at JP7 and committed to James T. Vaughn Correctional Center on \$4001.00 cash bond.

The incident occurred around 9:07 p.m. Tuesday September 5, 2017 as Roger L. Coberly Jr., 35 of Felton, was walking his

dog westbound on the shoulder of Willow Grove Road (SR10) east of Sandtown Road. Nathan Jester was operating a 2007 Chevrolet Cobalt westbound on SR10 when he struck Coberly and threw him into a ditch on the north side of the roadway near his residence. Jester then continued westbound without stopping.

Roger Coberly was pronounced dead at the scene by Kent County Paramedics. His dog was able to run back to the residence and was uninjured.

****Update #2 – Suspect Arrested** State Police Investigating Fatal Crash South of Hartly**

Hartly – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit has arrested a Hartly man involved in the fatal hit and run crash with the Amish buggy on August 31, 2017.

Robert H. Eckeard, 29 of Hartly was taken into custody Wednesday September 6, 2017 at his residence by detectives and transported to Troop 3 where he was charged with Leaving the Scene of a Collision Resulting in Death, Failure to Report a Collision Resulting in Death, Failure to Show Proof of Insurance, and Expired Tags. He was arraigned at JP2 and committed to James T. Vaughn Correctional Center on \$7,002.00 cash bond.

The incident occurred around 8:05 p.m. Thursday August 31, 2017 as Ervin D. Miller, 55 of Hartly, was operating a horse drawn carriage westbound on Halltown Road (SR8) attempting to make a left turn into Royal Farms at the intersection with Hartly Road (SR44). Robert Eckear was operating a 1997 Chevrolet Lumina eastbound on SR8 and collided with the

carriage, ejecting both Miller and his 55-year-old wife into the roadway. Eckhard then continued eastbound on SR8 without stopping.

Ervin Miller was transported by EMS to Bayhealth Kent General Hospital (KGH) where he was later pronounced dead. His wife was also transported to KGH where she was treated and has recently been released.

Sandtown – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing their investigation into the fatal hit and run crash involving a pedestrian.

The incident occurred around 9:07 p.m. Tuesday September 5, 2017 as **Roger L. Coberly Jr.**, 35 of Felton, was walking his dog westbound on the shoulder of Willow Grove Road (SR10) east of Sandtown Road. An unknown make and model vehicle was traveling westbound on SR10 when it struck Coberly and threw him into a tax ditch on the north side of the roadway near his residence. The vehicle then continued westbound without stopping.

SR10 between Sandtown Road and Mahon Corner Road was closed for approximately four hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

Troopers Arrest Six Following

a Dollar Tree Burglary – Wilmington

Wilmington- Delaware State Police have arrested six people and charged them in connection with a burglary of a local area discount variety store which occurred early Tuesday at the Miller Road Shopping Center.

The preliminary investigation revealed the incident occurred on Tuesday, September 5, 2017 at approximately 3:00 a.m. when a trooper on stationary patrol in the area of a Dollar Tree Store, located at 3602 Miller Road, Wilmington, observed a dark colored vehicle approach the store. After the suspect vehicle stopped at the front of the store, several subjects exited the vehicle. The vehicle was then observed driving away from the front of the Dollar Tree and park in the fire lane. The suspects then threw a rock and kicked at the large pane window of the store. The suspects then entered the store after

shattering the glass door. Troopers coordinated an apprehension plan and responded to the business where they captured all of the suspects safely as they exited the store. The suspects were carrying various stolen food items from inside the business.

During the course of this investigation the vehicle, a 2004 Volvo, which all the suspects arrived in was reported stolen to Wilmington Police Department earlier that day. The vehicle was stolen from Lancaster Avenue, Wilmington, Delaware. The vehicle was subsequently recovered and transported to Troop 2 for processing.

All defendants (three 14 year old and three 12 years old) were transported from the Dollar Tree to Delaware State Police Troop 2. All of the juvenile suspects were charged with Burglary 3rd Degree, Possession of Burglar Tools, Conspiracy 2nd Degree, Receiving Stolen Property, Criminal Mischief and Theft. All of the juveniles were arraigned at the Justice of the Peace Court 11 and were released on \$2,200.00 unsecured bond except for two who were subsequently committed to the New Castle County Detention Center on \$2,200.00 secured bond.
