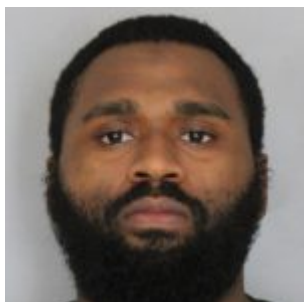
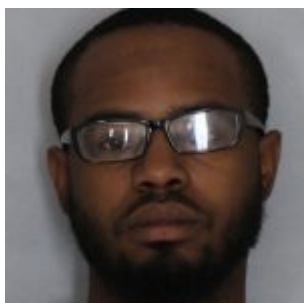


Three Arrested in Storage Facility Break-Ins

New Castle – State Troopers have arrested three people after they were caught breaking into multiple storage units.

The investigation began Thursday August 31, 2017 around 1:40 a.m. when a 9-1-1 call was placed from the on-site facility manager of Public Storage, located at 425 Churchmans Road, to report drilling a banging coming from inside the area. Troopers and officers from New Castle City Police Department responded to the compound and noticed a fence had been cut. Entry into the facility was made through the hole by the responding agencies and upon approaching “C” building, observed three subjects running away. Officers and troopers gave chase and took all three subjects into custody without incident. Further investigation revealed the three had utilized cutting tools to break the locks off 16 storage units and placed items, such as televisions and stereo equipment,

outside the units to remove later.

Damere P. Minter, 22 of Wilmington, **Vaughn King**, 24 of Wilmington, and a 16-year-old male from New Castle, were all transported back to Troop 2 where they were charged with 16 counts of Burglary 3rd, Possession of Burglary Tools, Conspiracy 2nd, Criminal Mischief, and Criminal Trespass 2nd. Vaughn King was additionally charged with Aggravated Menacing as he began running at a trooper with a crowbar above his head before putting the item down and surrendering. The three were arraigned at JP2 and all released on unsecured bonds.

Smyrna Man Arrested After Firing Gun in the Air During Dispute

Leipsic – A Smyrna man was arrested by troopers after he fired his shotgun into the air to break up a verbal dispute.

Leonard H. Voss Jr., 61 of Smyrna, was arrested Monday August 28, 2017 for Possession of a Firearm During a Commission of a Felony, Aggravated Menacing, Terroristic Threatening, and Reckless Endangering 2nd. This stemmed from an incident that occurred the same day around 12:25 p.m. in the parking lot of

Careys Diesel located at 168 E. Denny St., Leipsic, when he fired a single shotgun round into the air to break up an argument between a 23-year-old male (victim) and Voss' brother. Voss is alleged to have pointed the gun at the victim and threaten to shoot him after firing the round. The incident on Monday stemmed from a separate incident that occurred on Sunday August 27, 2017 when Voss and the 23-year-old male were involved in an apparent physical confrontation after the 23-year-old got into Voss' face while selling crabs to buyers. No charges have been filed in that incident.

Voss was arraigned at JP2 and released on \$23,000.00 unsecured bond.

Troopers Seek Public's Assistance in Locating Wanted Subject

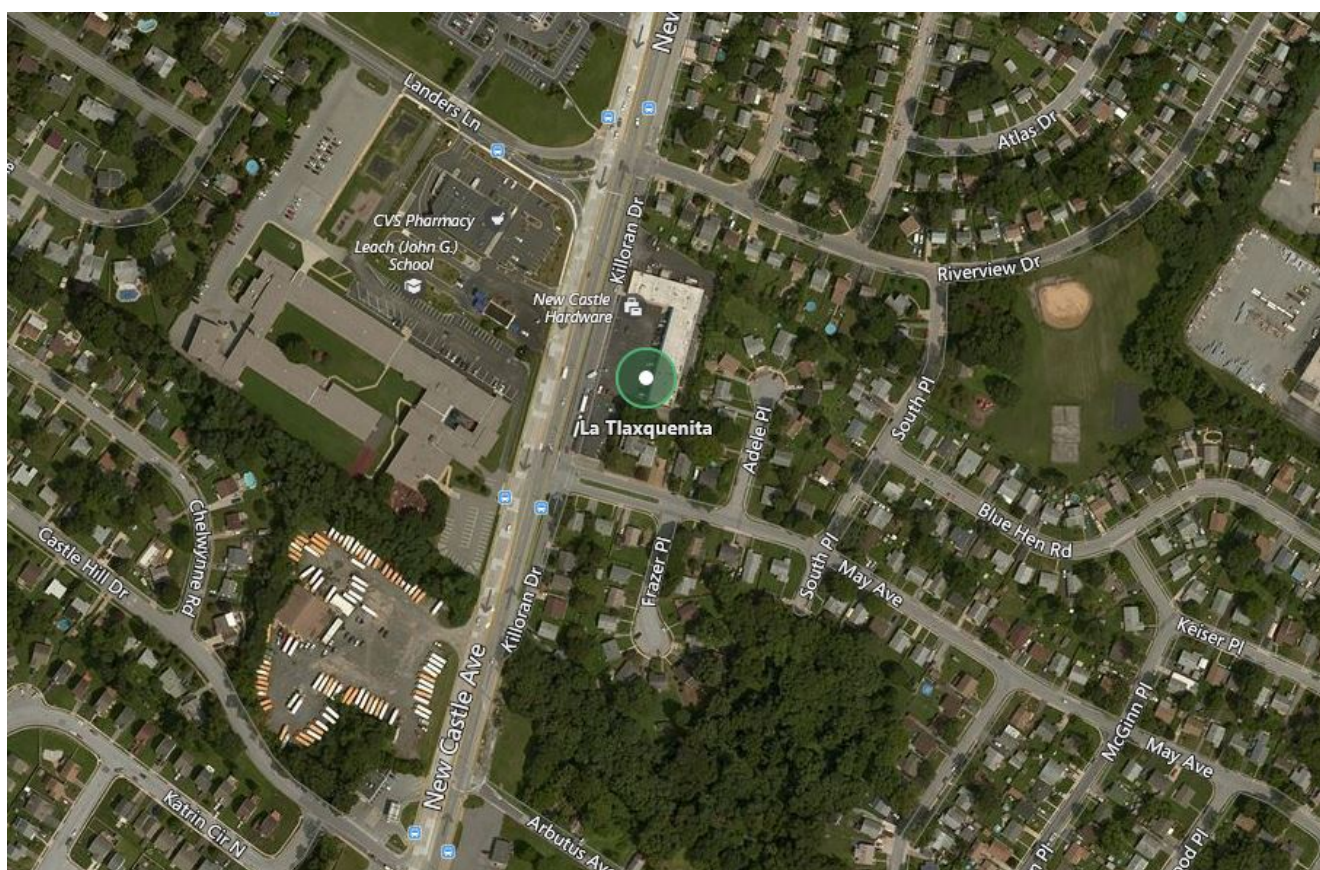

State Troopers Investigating Robbery of New Castle Area Grocery Store

New Castle – Delaware State Police are currently investigating the armed robbery of a New Castle area grocery store that occurred early Friday evening.

The investigation thus far has determined that the incident happened on Friday September 1, 2017 at approximately 8:40 p.m., as two male suspects entered the La Tlaxquenita located at 218 New Castle Avenue. One of the suspects then approached a male employee who was standing behind the sales counter and pointed a handgun at him while demanding money from the register. The second suspect stood by the front door armed with a handgun and ushered two female patrons to the middle of the store. The employee provided the suspect with an undisclosed amount of money from the cash register before the two exited the business and fled in an unknown direction. There were no injuries reported.

The first suspect was described as a black male, 30-40 years of age, 6'00"-6'02" tall, weighed 180-190 lbs. He was last seen wearing a dark colored hooded sweatshirt and dark colored pants (no further physical or clothing description available). Armed with an unknown type handgun.

The second suspect was described as a black male, 18-20 years of age, 5'08"-5'10" tall, weighed 175-180 lbs. He was last seen wearing a dark colored hooded sweatshirt and dark colored pants (no further physical or clothing description available). Armed with an unknown type handgun.

No surveillance photos available.

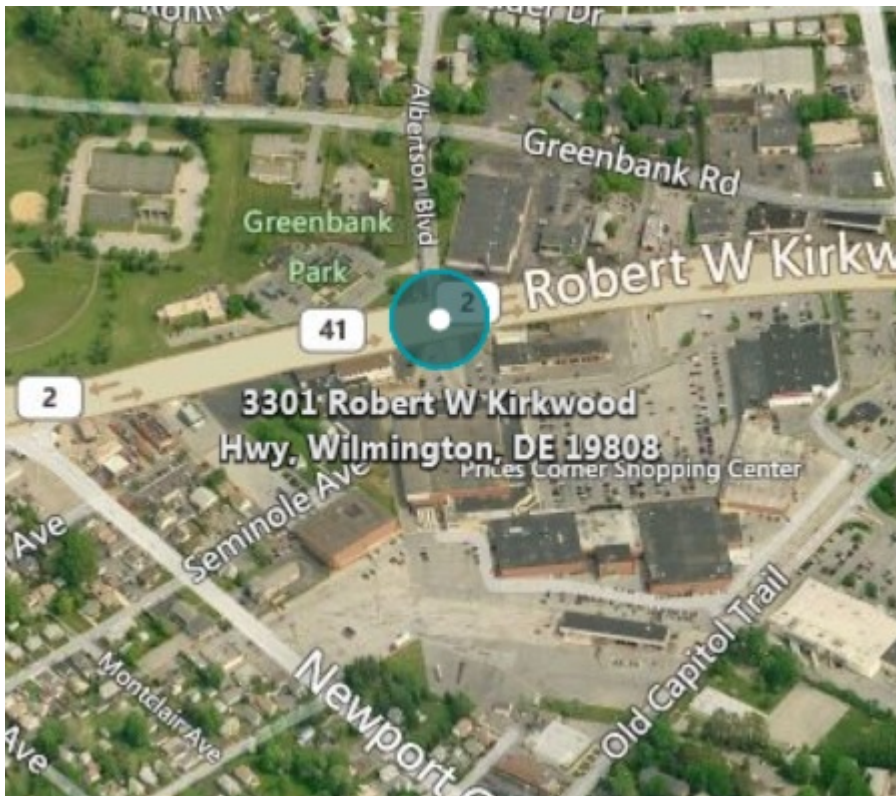
This crash remains under investigation by the Delaware State Police.

Personal Injury Crash**

Wilmington – The Delaware State Police are currently investigating a personal injury crash involving a vehicle and a light pole which has forced the partial closure of Kirkwood Highway.

The initial investigation has determined that the crash occurred at approximately 11:25 a.m. on westbound DE Rt. 2 (Kirkwood Highway) at Albertson Drive, and involves a vehicle which struck and knocked over a light pole. Injuries have been reported in the crash, however, the nature and extent of those injuries is unknown at this time.

As a result of the crash, the westbound lanes of DE Rt. 2 have been closed to traffic at Albertson Boulevard. Commuters are asked to find alternate routes of travel.

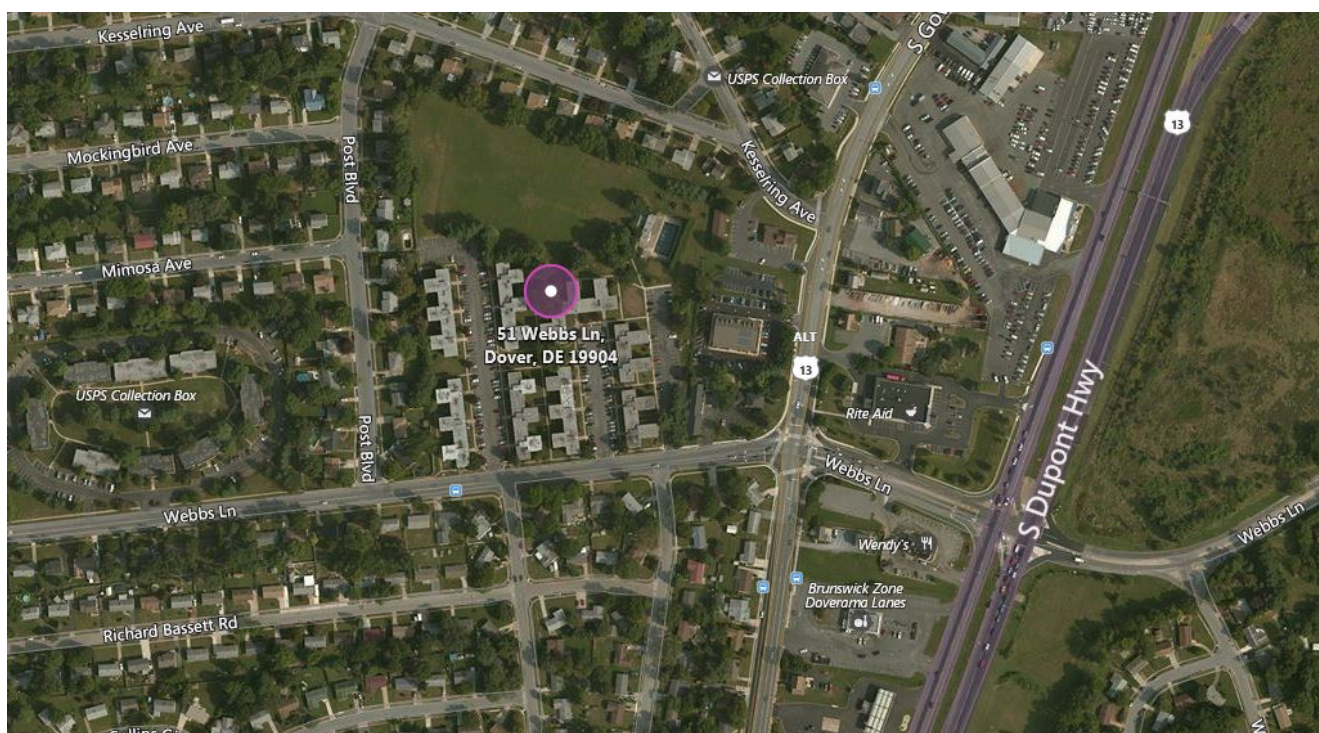
The investigation into this crash is in its early stages. **Further details will be released upon the conclusion of the investigation.**

Detectives Investigating Assault and Gun Fire at Alder Park Apartments

Dover – The Delaware State Police Criminal Investigations Unit is currently investigating an incident at Alder Park Apartments in which two people were assaulted and shots were

fired.

The incident occurred around 1:25 a.m. Friday September 1, 2017 when troopers responded to 51 Webbs Lane, "K" building for a report of shots fired. As troopers and officers from Dover Police Department arrived on scene, multiple people and vehicles were observed fleeing from the area. Through the investigation it was determined that there was a party taking place in one of the apartments when an argument ensued between two unknown males in the living room. A 20-year-old female attempted to break up the argument when one of the male suspects struck her in the forehead with a handgun. The same suspect also struck a 20-year-old male on his forehead. At some point, the suspect discharged the firearm inside the apartment.

Both victims were transported to Bayhealth Kent General Hospital where they were treated and released with non-life-threatening injuries.

No other injuries were reported.

The suspect is described as a black male, 5'06"-5'07" tall, 200-210 pounds, with a beard, wearing a white t-shirt and khaki pants (No further physical or clothing description). Armed with an unknown type handgun.

****Update** State Police Investigating Fatal Crash South of Hartly**

Hartly – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating a fatal crash south of Hartly.

The incident occurred around 8:05 p.m. Thursday August 31, 2017 as Ervin D. Miller, 55 of Hartly, was operating a horse drawn carriage westbound on Halltown Road (SR8) attempting to make a left turn into Royal Farms at the intersection with Hartly Road (SR44). An unknown make and model vehicle was traveling eastbound on SR8 and collided with the carriage, ejecting both Miller and his 55-year-old wife into the

roadway. The vehicle then continued eastbound on SR8 and possibly turned northbound on Pearsons Corner Road.

Ervin Miller was transported by EMS to Bayhealth Kent General Hospital (KGH) where he was later pronounced dead. His wife was also transported to KGH and is currently admitted in critical condition.

The fleeing vehicle was only described as a dark colored older style passenger car that may have sustained considerable damage to the front bumper, hood, and window.

The horse detached itself from the carriage and ran from the scene, later to be located back at the residence of the victims. It is unknown if it sustained any injuries.

SR8 in the area of the crash was closed for three and a half hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

The Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing their investigation into this incident.
