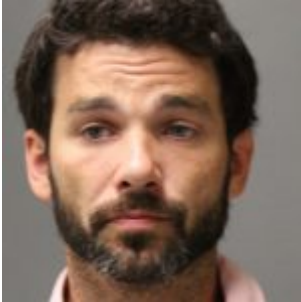


State Police Detectives Arrest Two in Lincoln Area Burglaries

Lincoln – State Police Criminal Investigators at Troop 4 have arrested a boyfriend and girlfriend in a series of residential burglaries in the Lincoln area.

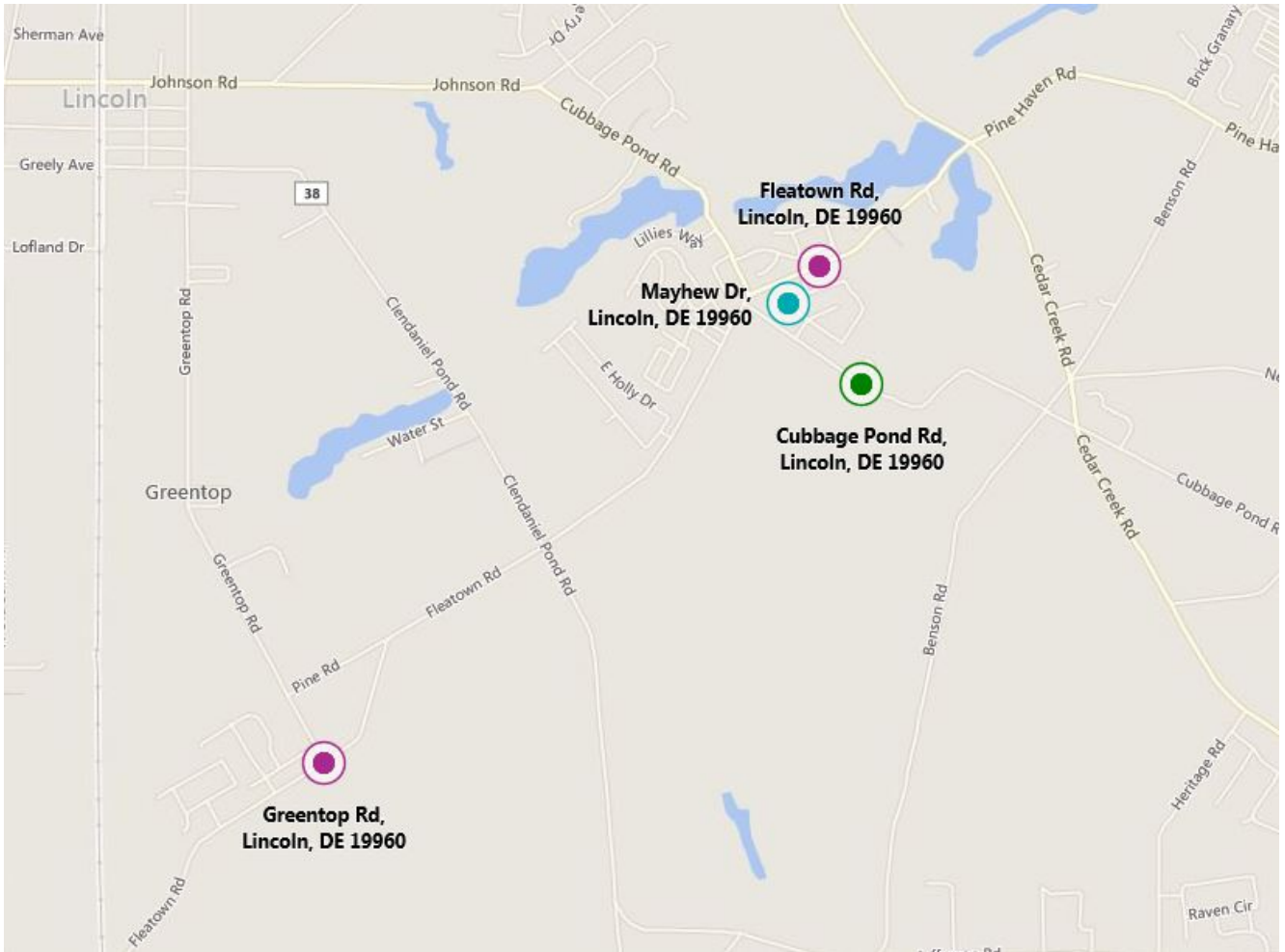
Detectives recently arrested **Christopher S. Malvas**, 32, and **Cheryl L. Bracey**, 30, both of Lincoln, in connection with multiple residential burglaries committed at various locations on Greentop Road, Mayhew Drive, Fleatown Road, and Cabbage Pond Road, that occurred between April and June of 2017. These burglaries occurred at various hours of the day to residences and outbuildings that were unoccupied at the time. Once breaking into the houses or outbuildings, the duo would remove various electronic devices, currency, jewelry, lawn equipment, scrap metal, and other power tools, and then

attempt to sell or trade them for drugs.

Christopher Malvas was charged with six counts of Burglary, two counts of Possession of Burglar Tools, nine counts of Theft, two counts of Attempted Burglary, four counts of Attempted Theft, eight counts of Conspiracy, six counts of Criminal Mischief, Unlawful Use of a Credit Card, and Resisting Arrest. He was arraigned at JP2 and committed to Sussex Correctional Institution on \$81,800.00 cash bond.

Cheryl Bracey was charged with three counts of Burglary, Possession of Burglar Tools, seven counts of Theft, two counts of Attempted Burglary, Attempted Theft, seven counts of Conspiracy, three counts of Criminal Mischief, Unlawful Use of a Credit Card, and Resisting Arrest. She was arraigned at JP2 and committed to Delores J. Baylor Womens Correctional Institution on \$14,750.00 secured bond.

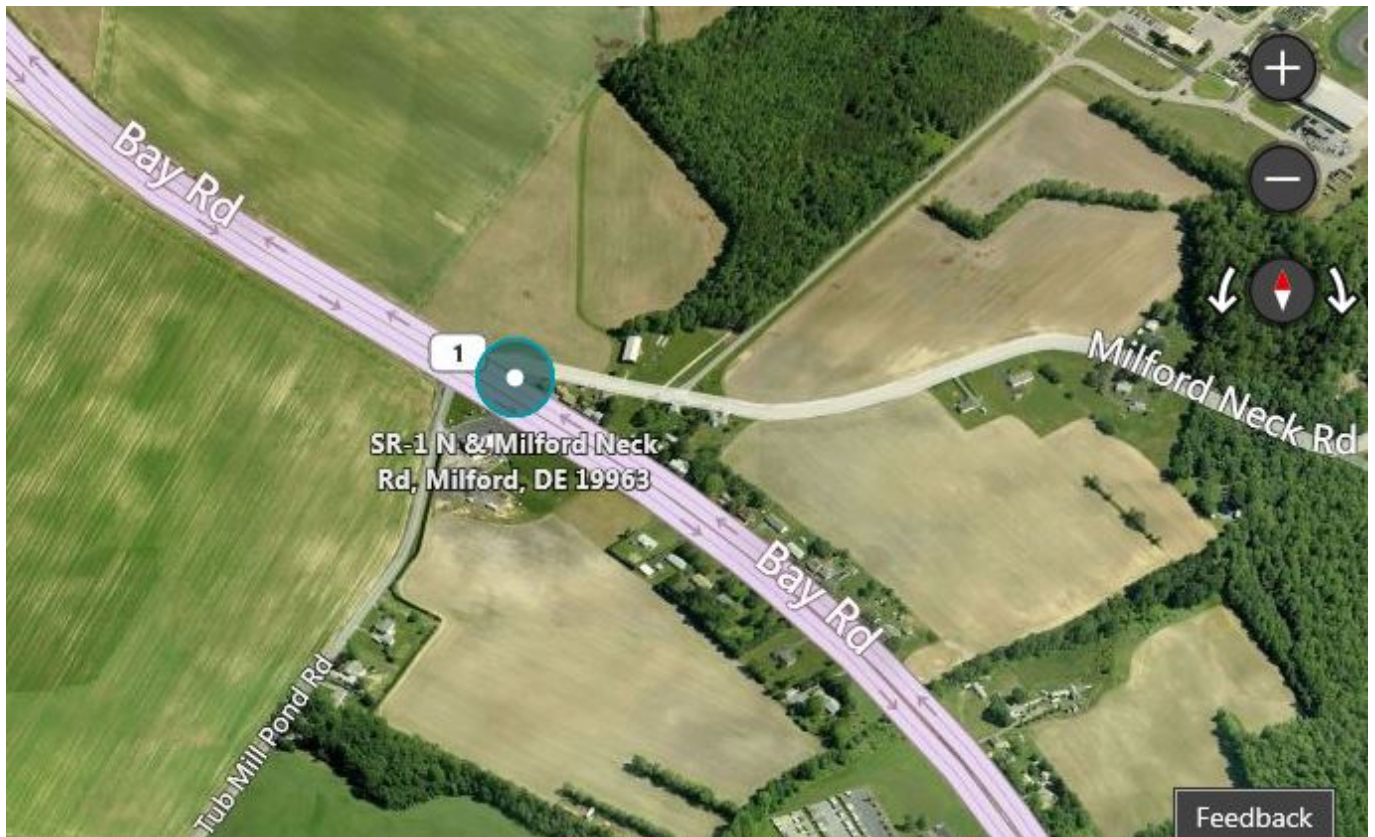

**Troopers Investigate
Pedestrian Crash – Frederica**

Frederica, DE- The Delaware State Police are investigating a motor vehicle crash in which a pedestrian was injured south of Frederica.

The initial investigation has determined the crash occurred at approximately 9:12 p.m. Saturday, July 8, 2017, as a 2007 GMC Yukon operated by Jennifer R. Valentine, 34 of Pennsylvania, was traveling northbound on Bay Road in the right lane approaching Milford Neck Road. It was at this point a pedestrian, David M. Cane, 41 of Milford, was standing partially in the right lane in the path of the vehicle on Bay Rd just South of Milford Neck Road when he was struck with the vehicle's right side. Jennifer R. Valentine was able to bring her vehicle to a controlled stop on the road north of the pedestrian.

David M. Cane was treated on scene for his injuries prior to being transported by EMS to the Bayhealth Milford Memorial Hospital for his non-life threatening injuries. Cane was cited for Failure to Carry a Light on Public Roadway.

Jennifer R. Valentine and her passengers were properly restrained at the time of the crash and were not injured.

“Troopers remind pedestrians to use caution and safety when walking on or near roadways. If you must cross a roadway utilize appropriate cross walks and make sure to look left, then right, then left again before proceeding. When walking near a roadway always make yourself visible to drivers by wearing bright/light colored clothing and reflective materials. Pedestrians that are walking at night must carry a flashlight and use them properly for added safety.”

Troopers Investigate Gas Station Robbery – Newark

Newark- The Delaware State Police is currently investigating the robbery of a Newark area Shell gas station that occurred last night.

The initial investigation has determined the incident occurred at approximately 9:13 p.m., Saturday, July 8, 2017, as an armed male suspect entered the Shell Gas Station located at 668 Paper Mill Road, Newark. The suspect confronted the clerk and demanded money from the cash registers. The suspect displayed what appeared to be an unknown make and model handgun. The employee complied with the suspect's demands and turned over an undisclosed amount of cash to him. The suspect then exited the business and fled in an unknown direction. There were no injuries.

The suspect was described as a white male approximately 5'09" to 5'11" tall, weighed 160 to 170 lbs., approximately 20-25 years of age with his face covered. There is no further physical or clothing description available. No video

surveillance footage is available at this time.

Troopers Searching for Driver in Hit and Run Crash – Wilmington

Wilmington, De.-The Delaware State Police are investigating a serious hit and run crash of a male subject on a motorized wheel chair which occurred late last night .

The preliminary investigation indicates the crash occurred Friday, July 7, 2017, at approximately 10:44 p.m. as a 29 year old male of Wilmington had operated a motorized wheel chair eastbound in the westbound lane of East Lea Boulevard. A dark colored SUV was traveling westbound on East Lea Boulevard approaching the intersection with North Market Street in the straight/right turn lane. As the motorized wheel chair traveled directly into the path of the SUV, the front right of the vehicle struck the right side of the wheel chair. The collision caused the wheel chair to spin in a counter clockwise direction and went partially up onto the sidewalk before tipping over and trapping the operator under the wheel chair. The operator of the dark colored SUV pulled into the parking lot and stopped briefly before fleeing the scene on eastbound East Lea Boulevard.

The 29 year old male was treated at the scene by EMS and was transported by ambulance to a local area hospital with serious but non-life threatening injuries.

The victim on the wheelchair did not have any lights or reflective equipment displayed on the front of the wheel chair, but did have a reflective vest on the back of his chair.

Troopers continue to collect and analyze evidence at the scene to determine make and model of the striking vehicle.

East Lea Boulevard in the area of the collision was closed for approximately one hour while the crash was investigated and cleared. Troopers continue to investigate this incident.

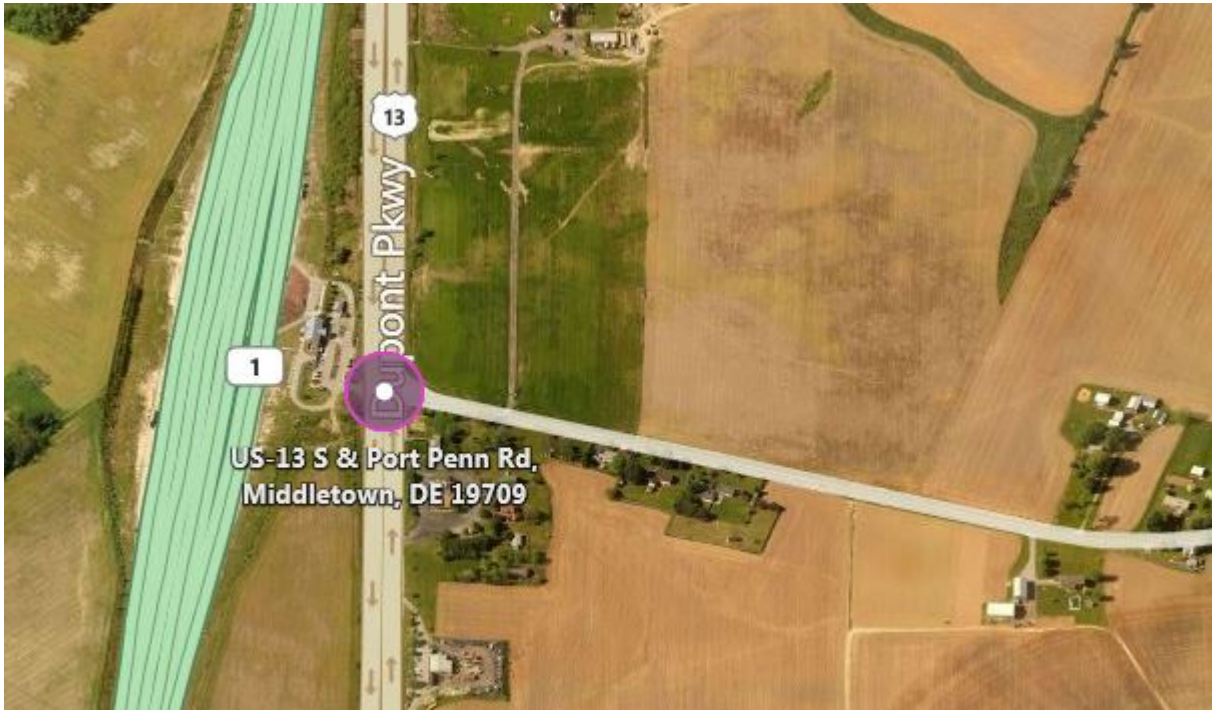

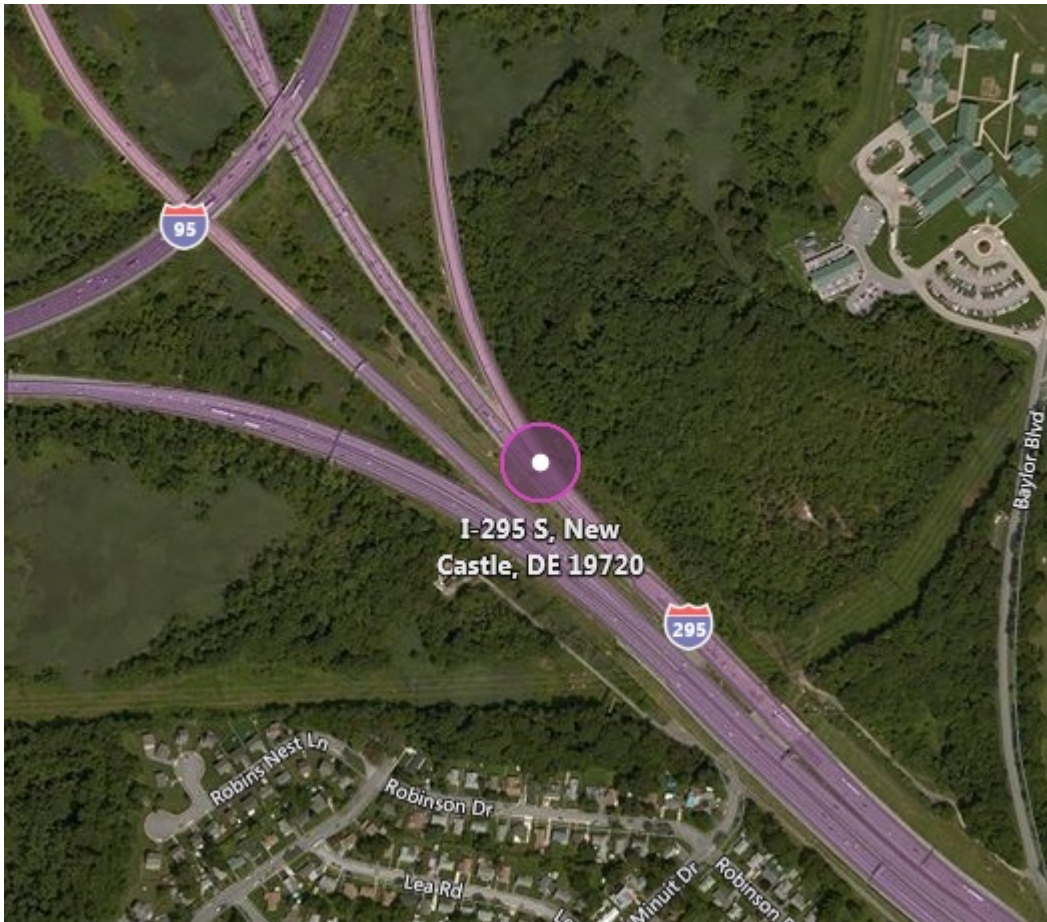

****Traffic Advisory** – Troopers Investigating Multi-Vehicle Crash – Update**

New Castle – Delaware State Police continue to investigate a multi-vehicle crash which occurred this morning near New Castle.

The initial investigation has determined that the crash occurred at approximately 8:39 a.m. this morning, Friday, July 7, 2016, as Nicholas Antalick, 30, of Brooklyn, CT, was operating a 2012 Peterbuilt tractor and trailer and was traveling in the left hand westbound lane of I-295 just prior to the northbound I-495 split. The front of the tractor trailer then struck the rear of a 2012 Mercedes-Benz E350, which was stopped in traffic in the left hand lane, and which was being operated by a 62-year-old Baldwin, MD man. The force of the initial crash caused the Mercedes to travel forward where its front then struck the rear of a 2017 Chevrolet Cruz which was being operated by a 21-year-old Woodstown, NJ woman.

The Cruz then flipped onto its right hand side and caught on fire as it was pushed forward. Its front end then struck the rear of a 2016 Chrysler Town and Country, which had been stopped in the left hand lane, and which was being operated by a 40-year-old Swedesboro, NJ woman. The Town and Country then traveled forward where it then struck the rear of a 2012 Lexus IS, which had been stopped in the left hand lane, and which was being operated by a 53-year-old Sewell, NJ woman. The Town and Country then entered into the right hand lane where it was sideswiped by an unknown make and model tractor and trailer, which had originally stopped but then fled the scene.

The operators of the Town and Country, the Chevrolet Cruz, and the Mercedes-Benz were all treated at the scene by New Castle County Paramedics before being transported to the Christiana Hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

Nicholas Antalik, who was not injured, was cited by troopers with Following Too Closely.

The westbound lanes of I-295 were partially closed for approximately 1.5 hours as the crash was investigated and cleared.

Suspicious Activity Leads to Drug and Gun Arrest

Claymont- The Delaware State Police New Castle County Governor's Task Force has arrested a Chester, PA man after he was found to be in possession of drugs and a gun yesterday in Claymont.

The investigation began at approximately 9:30 p.m. on Thursday, July 6, 2017, as members of the New Castle County Governor's Task Force (GTF) were conducting proactive patrols in the Claymont area. It was at this time that they observed a male subject, later identified as Jihad Amaad Rashaad Morris of Chester, PA, conducting what appeared to be hand to hand drug transactions in the parking lot of the Northtowne Plaza, located at 601 Naamans Road. GTF members contacted Morris who was seated in the driver's seat of a silver Chevrolet Impala and upon conducting a pat down search of him, they located 10 grams of powder cocaine inside of his pants. A fully loaded Glock 9 mm handgun was also located in the armrest of the vehicle.

Jihad Morris was transported to Troop 1 where he was arrested and charged with Delivery of a Controlled Substance, Possession with the Intent to Deliver a Controlled Substance, Possession of a Controlled Substance, and Carrying a Concealed Deadly Weapon. He was arraigned at JP Court 11 and committed to the Howard Young Correctional Institution in default of \$53,000.00 cash bond.

Michael B. Reynolds, Jr., turned himself in to detectives at Troop 2 yesterday evening. Reynolds was subsequently arrested and charged with Robbery 1st Degree. He was arraigned at JP Court 2 and committed to the Howard Young Correctional Institution in default of \$25,000.00 secured bond.

Reynolds was wanted by detectives after he was identified as the suspect who robbed a male victim in the bathroom of the

Wawa located at 2621 Philadelphia Pike, Claymont, on May 29, 2017.
