

# Vehicle Stop Leads to Drug and Gun Charges

***Dover-*** Delaware State Police have arrested a Dover man after he was found to be in possession of a loaded gun and drugs during a traffic stop on Friday.

The incident occurred at approximately 10:40 a.m. on Friday, April 21, 2017, as a trooper on routine patrol was conducting

speed enforcement on southbound SR1 approximately .5 miles south of White Oak Road, Dover. It was at this time that the trooper observed that a white Nissan Pathfinder was traveling well above the posted speed limit and conducted a vehicle stop of the car. As the trooper made contact with the operator and sole occupant of the car, later identified as Dynzel L. Reed, 26, he detected the odor of marijuana coming from the interior of the car. Reed was then asked to exit his vehicle and after questioning by troopers, he admitted to being in possession of marijuana. A subsequent search of the vehicle revealed a black duffel bag containing 19.6 grams of powder cocaine, 1.3 grams of crack cocaine, 296 grams of marijuana, 4 ecstasy pills, 16 cyclobenzaprine hydrochloride (Flexeril) pills, a loaded 9 mm. Beretta semi-automatic handgun, additional ammunition, and \$3,281.00 is suspected drug sale proceeds.

Dynzel Reed was transported to Troop 3 where he was arrested and charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance in a Tier 4 Quantity, Possession with the Intent to Distribute a Controlled Substance in a Tier 4 Quantity, Carrying a Concealed Firearm, Possession of a Firearm with a Controlled Substance, Possession of a Controlled Substance in a Tier 1 Quantity, Possession of a Controlled Substance, Illegal Possession of a Prescription Drug, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and Speeding. He was arraigned at JP Court 2 and committed to the James T. Vaughn Correctional Institution in default of \$292,000.00 cash bail.

# **Delaware State Police and DHSS Warn of Spike in Overdoses in Western Sussex County; Immediate Assistance Available at 911 or DHSS' Crisis Helpline**

**Sussex County (April 22, 2017) – In the wake of a series of heroin overdoses in western Sussex County, including one that was fatal, from early Friday through early Saturday, health and law enforcement officials are warning users, families, treatment providers and health care professionals of the dangerous spike.**

**For users and families who want to be connected to treatment immediately, call the Department of Health and Social Services' 24/7 Crisis Helpline at 1-800-345-6785 in Sussex and Kent counties, or 1-800-652-2929 in New Castle County. If individuals see someone overdosing, they should call 911. Under Delaware's 911/Good Samaritan Law, people who call 911 to report an overdoses and the person in medical distress cannot be arrested for low-level drug crimes.**

Sergeant Richard D. Bratz, Director of the Public Information Office for the Delaware State Police reports that a significant spike of heroin overdoses have occurred over the past several days in Sussex County Delaware. The Sussex County Drug Unit is actively investigating and seeking information on any of the drug overdoses. The public is encouraged to call Sergeant M. Dawson of the Sussex County Drug Unit at (302) 752-3815 with any information.

Michael Barbieri, director of the Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health, alerted treatment providers statewide of the surge in overdoses in western Sussex. Hospitals and urgent care centers were notified of the increase by the Division of Public Health's Emergency Medical Services, which oversees the state's paramedic service. EMS responded to seven reported overdoses in a 24-hour period beginning Friday in the Seaford and Laurel areas. In several of the cases, paramedics used naloxone, the overdose-reversing medication, to save the individual before transporting each person to the hospital.

"This spike in overdoses is in alarming," said Dr. Kara Odom Walker, a family physician and Cabinet Secretary for the Department of Health and Social Services. "Even one use of heroin or another opioid can end a life. For people in active use and their families, please convince your loved ones to seek treatment for their addiction or keep naloxone in your home. Addiction is a disease and treatment does work. Our staff at the DHSS Crisis Helpline will listen and they will connect you to treatment options."

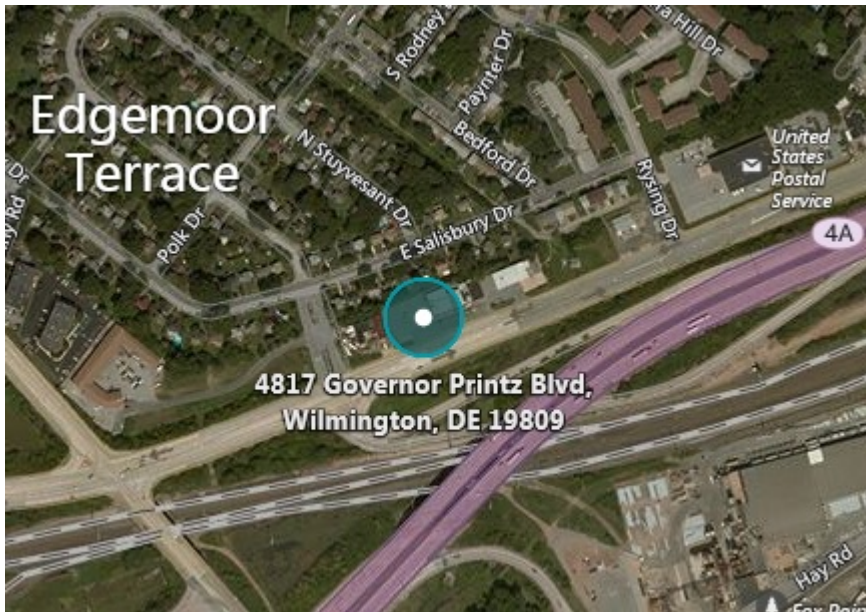

# Troopers Investigate Robbery of Pizza Shop

***Wilmington (19809)*** – Delaware State Police are investigating the armed robbery of a Wilmington area pizza shop that occurred yesterday afternoon.

The investigation thus far has determined that the incident occurred at approximately 4:16 p.m. on Friday, April 21, 2017, as a male suspect entered the Bella Italy Pizza located at 4817 Governor Printz Boulevard. The suspect approached the sales counter where he then displayed an unknown make and model handgun and confronted a male employee. He then demanded money from the cash register. The employee complied with the suspect's demands and turned over an undisclosed amount of money to him. The suspect then exited the business and fled in an unknown direction. The employee was not injured.

The suspect was described as a black male. He was 27-28 years of age, 5'08"-5'10" tall, weighed approximately 160 lbs., and was last seen wearing a black t-shirt, blue jeans, a black

hat, and sneakers.

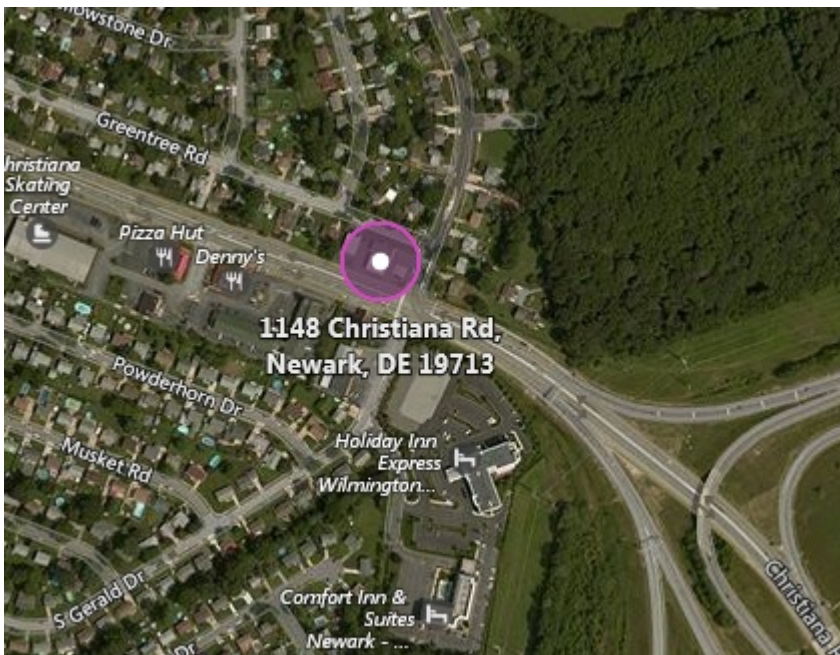

# Troopers Investigate Gas Station Robbery

**Newark (19713)**- Delaware State Police are investigating the armed robbery of a Newark area gas station that occurred early Thursday morning.

The initial investigation has determined that the incident

happened at approximately 6:52 a.m. on Thursday, April 20, 2017, as a male suspect entered the Shell gas station located at 1148 Christiana Road, Newark. The suspect approached the sales counter where he then displayed an unknown make and model handgun and confronted a male employee. He then demanded money from the cash register. The employee complied with the suspect's demands and turned over an undisclosed amount of money to him. The suspect then exited the store and fled on foot in an unknown direction. There were no injuries.

The suspect was described as a black male 30 years of age. He was 5'09" tall, weighed approximately 185 lbs., and was last seen wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, black pants, black baseball cap, and sneakers. There is no further physical or clothing description available. No video surveillance photos are available at this time.

# Troopers Investigate Serious Crash – Update

**Greenwood-** The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit continues to investigate a single vehicle crash which has claimed the life of a Pikesville, MD woman that occurred yesterday afternoon.

The investigation thus far has determined that the crash happened at approximately 3:07 p.m. on Friday, April 21, 2017, as a 62-year-old Pikesville, MD man was operating a 2016 Cadillac SRX4 and was traveling in an eastbound direction on Hickman Road (SR16) just west of McDowell Road, 1 mile west of Greenwood. For an unknown reason, the Cadillac left the north

edge of the roadway and entered a field where it then traveled approximately 700' before striking a ditch and overturning end-to-end. It then came to rest on its right hand side.

The male operator, who was properly restrained at the time of the crash, was trapped in his vehicle until he could be extricated by Emergency Medical Services personnel. He was pronounced dead at the scene. The name of the victim is being withheld pending the notification of his next of kin.

This crash remains under investigation by the Delaware State Police. Impairment does not appear to be a factor in the crash.

Hickman Road was closed in both directions for approximately 2.5 hours as the crash was investigated and cleared.
