****Update** State Police Investigating Fatal Crash Near Houston**

Houston – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating a single vehicle fatal crash that occurred early Thursday evening.

The incident occurred around 5:45 p.m. Thursday December 22, 2016 as Samuel R. Ellers 3rd, 20 of Harrington, was operating a 1997 Dodge Ram 1500 pickup truck westbound on Williamsville Road approaching Hunting Quarter Road. Ellers failed to negotiate a moderate right curve and traveled off the south side of the roadway into a small ditch where it struck a culvert, propelling the truck airborne into a mailbox. The vehicle then struck a tree with its left side driver's door and continued a short distance before striking another tree with its driver's side door. The pick up re-entered the roadway and continued westbound where it came to a stop in a

ditch on the south edge of the roadway facing in a northwesterly direction.

Samuel Ellers, who was properly restrained and the sole occupant of the truck, was pronounced dead at the scene.

The Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing their investigation into this incident. Speed may have been a contributing factor in this case. Williamsville Road at Hunting Quarter Road was closed for approximately three hours while the crash was investigated and cleared.

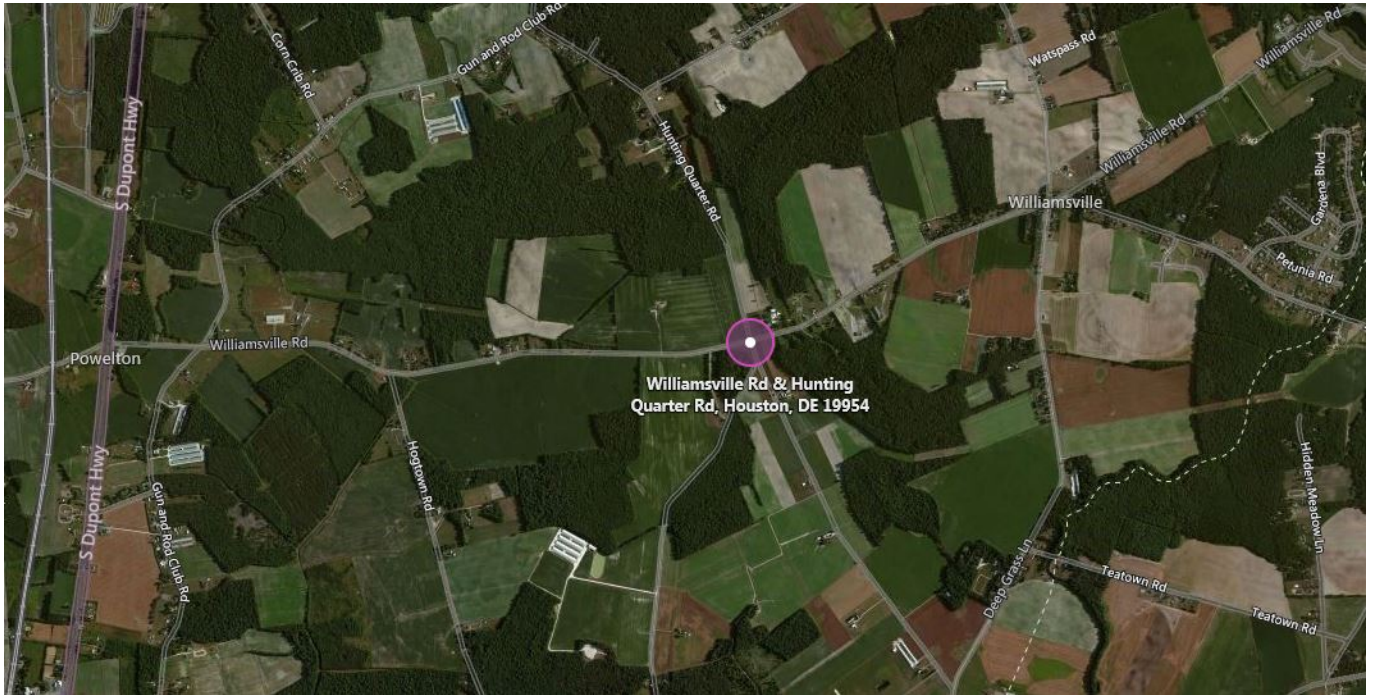

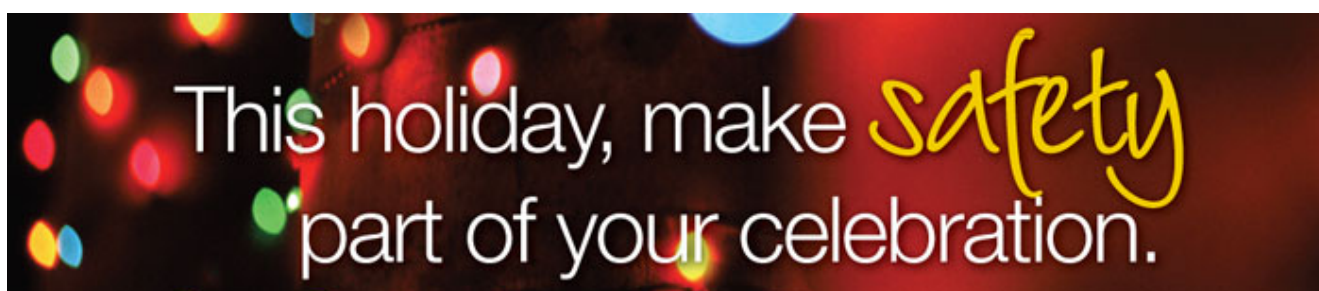

On behalf of our Superintendent, Colonel Nathaniel McQueen Jr. and the women and men of the Delaware State Police, we would like to extend our best wishes for everyone to have a safe and happy holiday season. Your family and home safety are always on our minds and we must work together for a safer Delaware. Troopers kindly offer safety tips throughout the year but specifically during the holiday season.

Please take the time to secure your home and lock all windows and doors when leaving for any length of time. Even while you are home, we recommend that you keep your house secured. Close the blinds and drapes and do not keep any gifts or valuable items in view. Set timers for lights. If a person knocks at your door and you don't recognize them, don't feel obligated to open your door. Teach your children not to open the door to anyone prior to your knowledge. Inform a trusted neighbor or

dependable person to watch your house when you travel during the holidays. During the holiday is an excellent time to get to know your neighbors. Neighbors watch out for neighbors and help keep a watchful eye out for suspicious activity to make communities stronger and safer. Mail should be stopped or arrangements for a trusted neighbor or friend to pick up when you are away from home for a period of time.

While shopping we suggest you lock your vehicle and hide valuables, preferably in the trunk or locked compartment. Stay alert to your surroundings and take a moment to glance around for possible suspicious persons, vehicles or situations. Prior to getting into your vehicle take a look inside and around before entering. When in crowded places, be alert for potential suspicious activity. Never leave personal belongings unattended. As an added precaution, make sure you have a record of all your credit card numbers in a secure place at home. Try to shop with friends, there is safety in numbers. Teach your child to go to a trusted adult or store clerk and ask for help in case your child is separated from you. Teach children to stay close to you at all times while shopping. Never allow children to make unaccompanied trips to the restroom. Children should never be allowed to go to the car alone and they should never be left alone in the car. Teach children their full name, address and telephone number to give to police officers or mall security. Teach children to immediately inform you if a stranger is bothering them.

More people are moving to online shopping. The Internet does have risks so it is essential to take steps to safeguard yourself when shopping online. It is suggested that you make sure you have a form of security (firewall, anti-virus and anti-spyware) installed and updated with the most current information before shopping online. Also, keep your operating system and Web browser up-to-date. Before you enter your personal and financial information for an online transaction, look for signs that the site is secure. This includes a closed

padlock on your Web browser's address bar or a URL address that begins with shttp or https. This indicates that the purchase is encrypted or secured. Never use unsecured wireless networks to make an online purchase.

Many people celebrate the season by attending holiday parties with family and friends. Enjoy these gatherings responsibly so this time of happiness does not become a time of tragedy. Don't drink then drive, get a ride with someone who is responsible and sober. It is recommended that you prearrange transportation if you plan on consuming alcoholic beverages. ****Update** Detectives Make Arrest in November Robbery of Canterbury Shore Stop**



Felton – The Troop 3 Criminal Investigations Unit have made an arrested in the late November robbery of the Canterbury Shore Stop.

Daequan Martin, 18 of Frederica, was arrested Wednesday December 21, 2016 and charged with Robbery 1st, Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Felony, Wearing a Disguise During the Commission of a Felony, two counts of Possession of a Firearm or Ammunition by a Person Prohibited, and Possession of a Destructive Weapon for his involvement in the November 21, 2016 robbery of the Canterbury Shore Stop.

Through investigative measures, Martin was identified as the suspect in the gas station robbery while detectives were conducting a separate burglary investigation that occurred sometime between November 28, 2016 and November 30, 2016 at the Liberto Storage Facility (1502 East Lebanon Road, Dover). In this investigation, Martin and two other subjects used bolt cutters to remove a lock from a storage unit and remove over \$3,500.00 worth of various personal items.

On Wednesday December 21, 2016, detectives obtained a search warrant for a residence in Leipsic where Daequan Martin was taken into custody without incident. Upon conducting the search, detectives located a 7.62 mm rifled and a 12 gauge shotgun with a modified barrel less than 18 inches in the bedroom in which Martin was staying.

Daequan Martin was transported back to Troop 3 where he was charged with the above listed crimes as well as the additional charges of Burglary 3rd, Theft over \$1500, Criminal Mischief, Conspiracy 2nd, and Possession of Burglary Tools. He was arraigned at JP2 and committed to James T. Vaughn Correctional Center on \$121,000.00 secured bond.

The two other subjects involved in the Liberto Storage Facility burglary, **Christopher Forster**, 37 of Dover, and **Tanya P. Martin**, 34 of Frederica, have also been arrested for their involvement and were released on unsecured bonds.

State Police Investigating Robbery of Canterbury Shore Stop

Felton – Troopers are investigating a robbery of the Canterbury Shore Stop that occurred just after midnight.

The incident occurred around 12:18 a.m. Monday November 21, 2016, when a male suspect entered the convenience store located at 8953 South DuPont Highway and approached the female employee at the counter armed with what appeared to be a shotgun. The clerk complied and turned over an undisclosed amount of currency. The male then fled the business in an unknown direction. The female employee was uninjured in this incident.

The suspect was described as a black male, 16-30 years of age,

5'05"-5'10" tall, 130-185 lbs., wearing all dark colored clothing (No further physical or clothing description). Armed with what appeared to be a shotgun. (Surveillance photo attached)

Daymien J. Robert, 36 of Newark, was arrested on Thursday December 15, 2016 and charged with Home Invasion, Robbery 2nd, Wearing a Disguise During the Commission of a Felony, Theft of a Motor Vehicle, and Conspiracy 2nd. He was arraigned at JP2 and committed to Howard R. Young Correctional Institution on \$50,000.00 secured bond.

Detectives are also looking for **Avery Maxwell**, 24 of Smyrna, who is wanted for Home Invasion, Robbery 2nd, Wearing a Disguise During the Commission of a Felony, Theft of a Motor Vehicle, and Conspiracy 2nd. Maxwell may be in the New Jersey area.

Troopers Investigate Home Invasion West of Cheswold

Cheswold – The Delaware State Police are investigating an early morning home invasion style robbery that occurred west of Cheswold.

The incident occurred around 5:55 a.m. this morning, Wednesday August 31, 2016 when three male subjects forcefully entered the front door at a residence located in the 3000

block of Seven Hickories Road. The suspects confronted a 36-year-old female and demanded cash before tying her up and removing an undisclosed amount of U.S. Currency. The three then left the home and fled in the victim's white 2006 Chevrolet Trailblazer with Delaware registration; PC173332 traveling westbound on Seven Hickories Road. The female victim, who was uninjured, was eventually able to free herself and ran to a nearby neighbor's house where she called 9-1-1.

The three suspects were all described as black males with black masks covering their faces. No further physical or clothing description available.

Selbyville Man Charged with Attempted Murder

Selbyville – The Delaware State Police have arrested a 30-

year-old man after he stabbed a woman west of Selbyville.

The incident occurred around 3:05 p.m. Monday December 19, 2016 when troopers were dispatched to the area of Baker Road and Blueberry Farm Road for a report of a female that had been stabbed. It was also reported that a male subject had just fled the area in a tan Suzuki SUV with a Delaware registration. Responding troopers along with officers from Selbyville, Frankford, and Dagsboro Police Departments began searching the area for the suspect, who was identified as **Temourise O. Taylor**, 30 of Selbyville, and located him within 20 minutes when he was taken into custody during a traffic stop on DuPont Boulevard (US113) south of Daisey Street in Frankford.

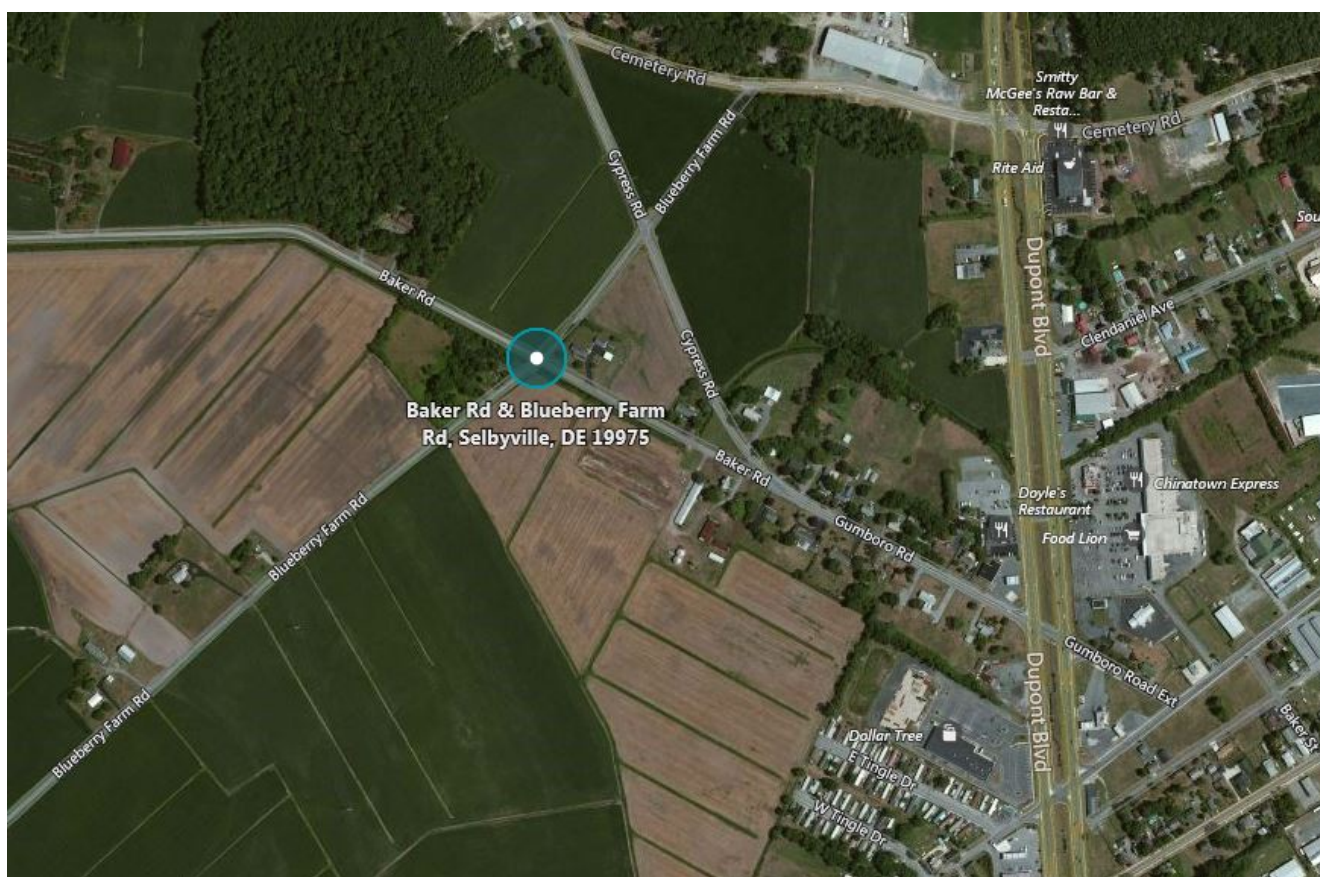
The investigation revealed Taylor and the 36-year-old female victim, who is an acquaintance of Taylor, drove to his house shortly before the stabbing occurred to drop off Christmas presents. While at the house, Taylor propositioned the female numerous times to engage in sex with him and she continuously refused. The two then left the house in order to take her back to her residence when she noticed Taylor wasn't driving in the correct direction. When Taylor parked the vehicle in a secluded area on Blueberry Farm Road west of Selbyville, the victim exited the vehicle and began walking away. Taylor then approached her and grabbed her by the shirt causing her to grab him and strike him in the face in order to get away. At this point, Taylor removed a knife and began stabbing in her upper torso. The victim was able to flee from Taylor to an occupied truck that witnessed the incident and called 9-1-1. Upon Taylor seeing the truck, he then fled the scene in the tan Suzuki SUV and was captured a short time later.

The 36-year-old female victim was transported by EMS to Beebe Healthcare where she was treated and admitted in stable condition.

Temourise Taylor was transported to Troop 4 in Georgetown

where he was charged with Attempted Murder 1st, Attempted Rape 1st, and Possession of a Deadly Weapon During the Commission of a Felony. He was arraigned at JP3 and committed to Sussex Correctional Institution on \$250,000.00 cash bond.

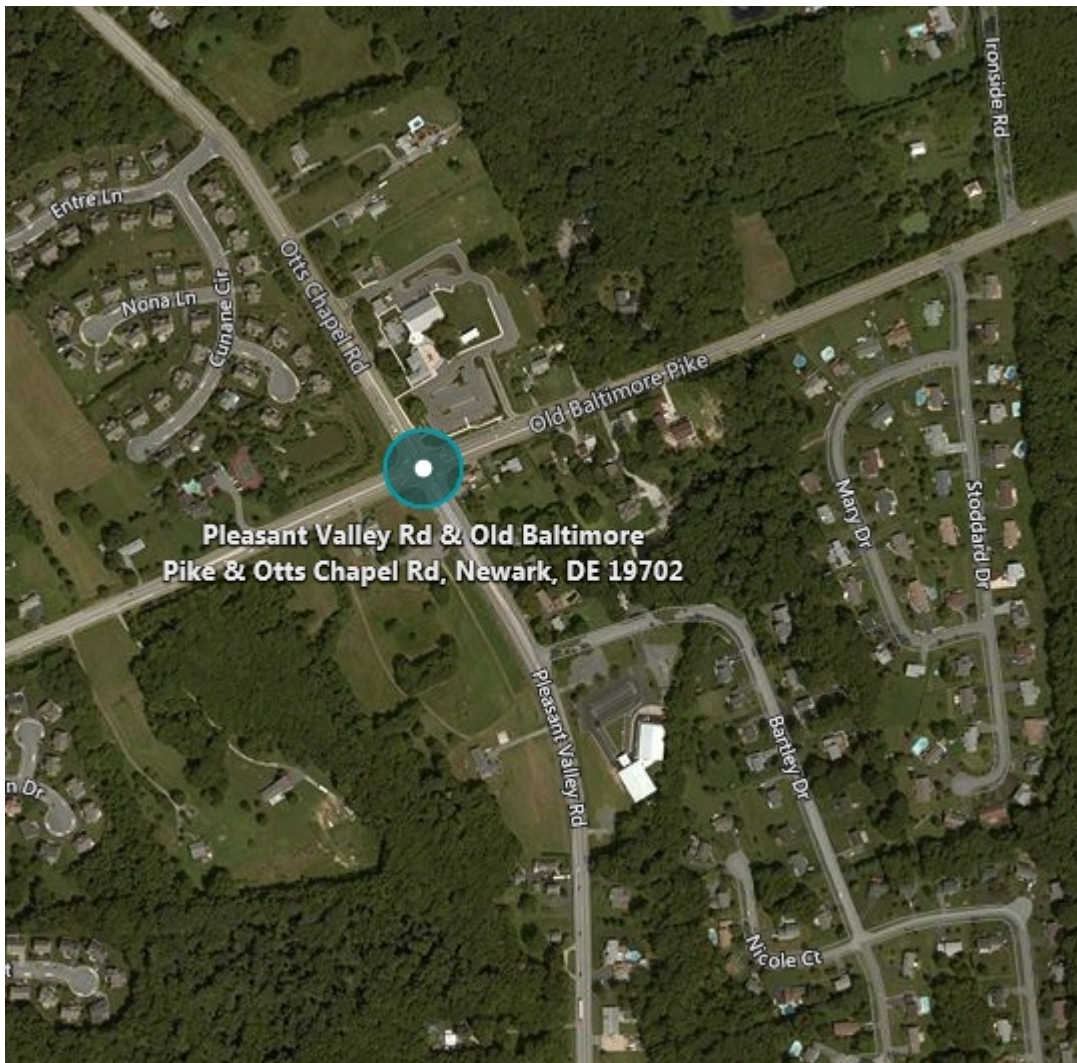

Troopers Investigate Serious Crash

Newark- The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is continuing to investigate a two vehicle crash which has seriously injured a motorcyclist that occurred yesterday evening in Newark.

The investigation thus far has determined that the crash occurred at approximately 9:19 p.m. on Sunday, December 18, 2016, as Carolyn R. Jackson, 71, of Wilmington, was operating a 2010 Toyota Rav 4 and was attempting to make a left hand turn from westbound Old Baltimore Pike onto southbound Pleasant Valley Road. As Jackson began to turn, she drove directly into the path of a 2008 Triumph Daytona motorcycle,

which was being operated by Amr M. Ali, 24, of Wilmington, and which was traveling in an eastbound direction on Old Baltimore Pike. The front of the motorcycle then struck the right front wheel of the Toyota, ejecting Ali from the bike. He then landed in the intersection.

Amr Ali was treated at the scene by New Castle County Paramedics. He was then transported by ambulance to the Christiana Hospital Trauma Center where he was admitted with serious injuries. Ali was wearing a helmet at the time of the crash.

Carolyn Jackson, who was properly restrained at the time of the crash, was also removed from the scene and transported to the Christiana Hospital for treatment. An 85 year old female passenger in Jackson's car was removed from the scene by a privately owned vehicle and transported to the Christiana Hospital where she refused treatment.

The investigation into this crash by the Delaware State Police is ongoing. Speed and alcohol use does not appear to be a factor in the crash.

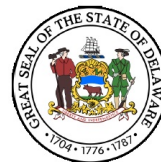
