

Troopers Seek Public's Assistance in Identifying Assault Suspect

New Castle, DE- Delaware State Police are currently investigating an assault incident and are asking for the public's assistance in identifying the male suspect.

The initial investigation has determined the incident occurred at approximately 2:02 p.m., Saturday, November 19, 2016, as a male suspect entered the BP station located at 1 Jay Drive off of West Basin Road in New Castle. The suspect concealed items in his pants pockets while inside the BP station and was then

confronted by two store clerks. The suspect became combative and assaulted the clerks. During the incident the suspect kicked and smashed the glass door and fled on foot northbound onto Jay Drive in the direction of the Chelsea Estates neighborhood. The clerks sustained minor injuries and decided to drive themselves to an area hospital.

The suspect was described as a black male approximately 25-35 years of age, 6'00" tall and 190-210 lbs. The suspect was last seen wearing a red Phillies baseball cap, sunglasses, black t-shirt and tan pants. A front of the t-shirt read "IMMA ALWAYS KEEP IT 100". (See attached photos)

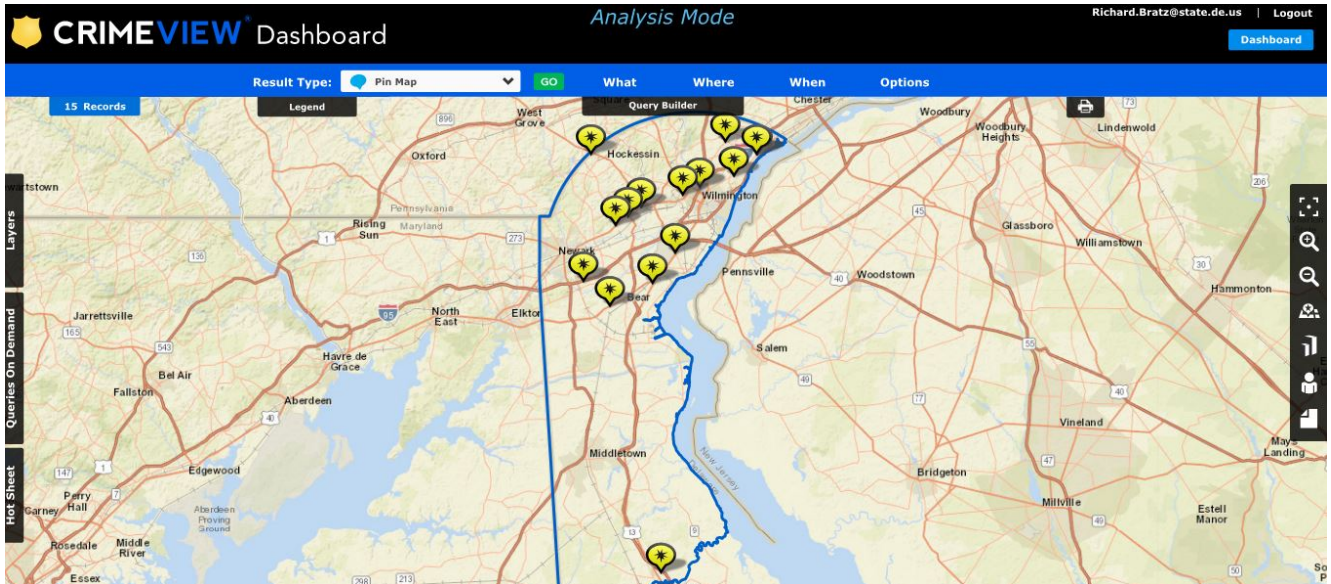

Think, Stop, and Look – It could save your Life- Pedestrian Safety Tips

The Delaware State Police would like to offer these pedestrian safety tips to help educate and encourage pedestrians to make smart and safe decisions when walking near roadways. By following these basic safety tips and laws it is our hope that no other pedestrians lose their lives.

- Do not walk under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Impaired walking is like impaired driving; it is illegal and can be deadly.
- Teach children not to run into the street after balls or other toys, and don't allow them to cross alone until you've practiced the basics with them.
- Carry a flashlight or other reflective item when walking at night. It's the law.
- Do not step into a cross walk if it will create a hazard to motorists. When it is clear to cross, continue to

watch for traffic while crossing the street until you have safely reached the other side.

- Be sure to evaluate the distance and speed of oncoming traffic before you step out into the street to ensure that a vehicle has adequate distance in which to stop safely.
- Use sidewalks. If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic and as far off the edge of the road as possible.
- Do not risk crossing outside of a cross walk or intersection just because it's more convenient, especially on high-speed roadways. Cars cannot stop in time for you.
- Cross only at cross walks or intersections with signals or traffic signs. Look left, right, and left again. Only start to cross when it's clear.
- Make eye contact with drivers when crossing busy streets and continue to watch out for traffic the entire time you are in the crosswalk. Your life may depend on it, regardless whether or not you have the right of way.
- If your vehicle breaks down on an interstate or busy roadway, don't leave your vehicle. Instead call #77 or 911 for assistance. Motorists can also call #77 to report a disabled vehicle they see on the roadways.
- If you are driving, be on the lookout for pedestrians near the roadway.
- We urge pedestrians and drivers to be more observant, cautious and safe.

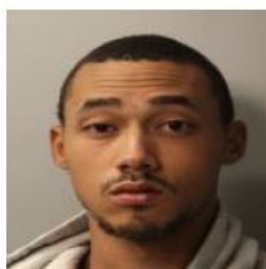

Troopers Investigate Liquor

Store Robbery

Camden, DE- Delaware State Police are investigating the armed robbery of a Camden area liquor store which occurred late last night.

The initial investigation has determined the incident occurred at approximately 11:00 p.m. Friday, November 18, 2016, as two male suspects entered the Marvel Liquor store located at 3086 South State Street, Camden. The suspects approached a male employee at the counter and demanded money. One suspect displayed a hand gun and the other brandished a knife. The clerk complied with the suspect's demands and turned over an undisclosed amount of money. The second suspect removed items from the store shelves before both suspects fled in an unknown direction. The employee was not injured.

The suspects were described as black males, approximately 5'10"-6'0" tall, weighed approximately 160-180 pounds with average builds. Both suspects were dressed in dark clothing with their faces covered.

There is no further physical or clothing description of the suspects available at this time. No video surveillance photos are available to be released at this time.

****Traffic Advisory** Troopers Investigating Crash West of Arden**

Arden, De. – The Delaware State Police are currently investigating a two vehicle crash that occurred west of Arden, injuring one person.

The incident occurred around 7:10 p.m. Friday, November 18, 2016 as a pickup truck was northbound on Marsh Road and another vehicle was southbound in the area of Old Orchard Road. For unknown reasons, the passenger vehicle turned into the path of the truck which caused the truck to strike a utility pole.

One person was transported to the

Wilmington Hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

Troopers are continuing their investigation into this incident. Marsh Road between Harvey/Grubb Road and Old Gate Lane is currently closed and is expected to be closed for an unknown amount of time while utility crews work to repair the pole and remove wires from the vehicle and roadway.

This crash remains under investigation by the Delaware State Police.

Brandywine Hundred- Delaware State Police are currently investigating the robbery of a Wilmington area TD Bank branch which occurred last night.

The initial investigation has determined that the incident happened at approximately 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, November 17, 2016, as a male suspect entered the TD Bank, located at 1803 Marsh Road, Wilmington. The suspect approached a female teller and presented her with a demand note for cash. The note implied that the suspect was armed, however, a weapon was not displayed. The teller complied with the suspect's demands and turned over an undisclosed amount of money to him. He then exited the bank and was last seen fleeing the parking lot in an unknown make and model passenger vehicle. There were no injuries.

The suspect was described as a white male. He was 5'08"-6'00" tall, weighed 180-220 lbs., and was last seen wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, dark pants, and had a mask covering his face. There is no further physical or clothing description available. No video surveillance photos are available to be released at this time.

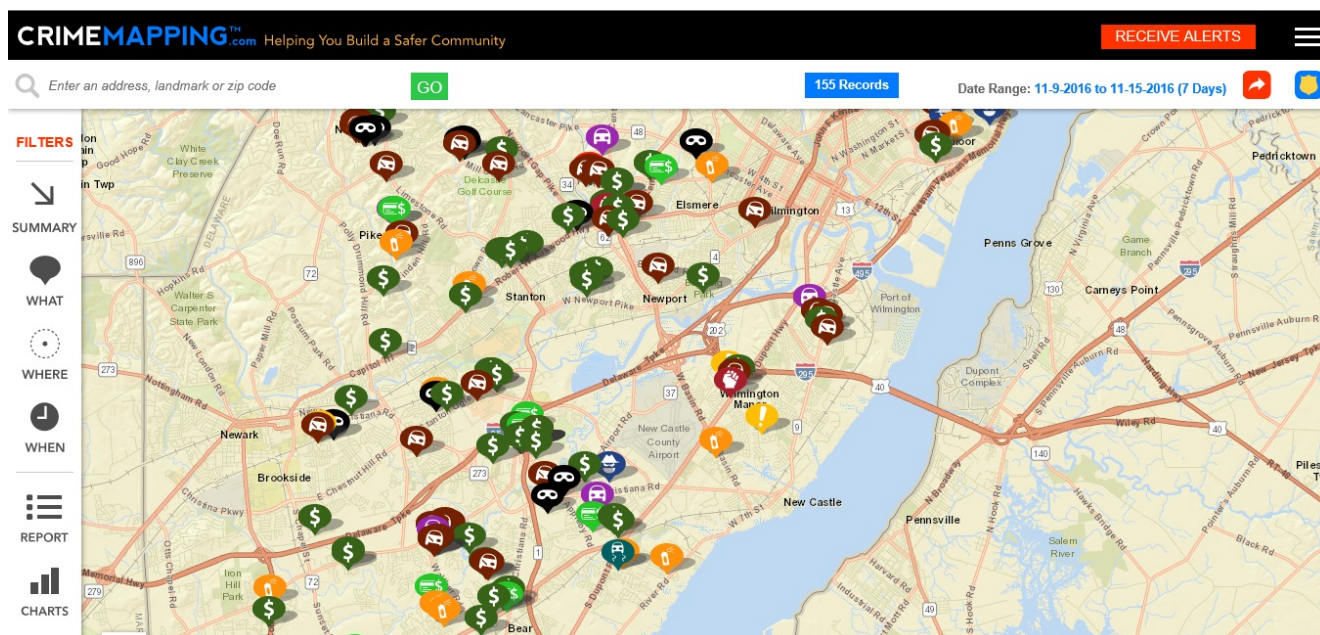

Delaware State Police Announces Crime Mapping

Engaging the communities we serve is vital to crime prevention. Crime mapping is one tool that serves that purpose and is an extraordinary example of DSP's effort to leverage technology to improve services to better inform the public. A mutual benefit where residents are better informed and encouraged to be vigilant is a win, win. Like a virtual neighborhood, it is an opportunity to lend a hand for community members who want to see what is going on locally in their own community. It helps to reduce misinformation when people have real time data and facts. Mapping data can also act as a deterrent to crime and serve as a safety measure in community policing to make people more engaged, aware and cautious.

The Delaware State Police is providing access to this website which makes crime information available to the public. The mapping service allows residents to analyze interactive maps

of recent crime activity near their neighborhoods, workplaces, schools and places of interest.

The Delaware State Police will update crime data and log it into the Crime Mapping website every 24 hours and is available for up to 180 days past the date the crime occurred, so essentially the public will have the ability to receive personal crime alerts within the 180 days of rolling data and will be able to submit crime tips to the Delaware State Police from this platform.

There are related links available after clicking on a map icon which includes the ***Delaware State Police Official Web Site, Crime Stoppers and the DSP Crime Tip for easy access.***
