

# **\*\*Update-Two Arrested\*\* Joint Investigation – DSP and DOJ Charged 13 in Operation “Duck Hunt”**

**Delaware** – On Monday May 23, 2016, at 1:00 a.m., Sohail Zeeshan, 39 of Rehoboth Beach, was apprehended by Customs and Border Protection as he attempted to re-enter the United States by bus at the Canadian Border, with the assistance of Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and U.S. Homeland Security Investigations Unit (HSI). Sohail Zeeshan was then turned over to the Buffalo City Police Department by Customs and Border protection and extradited back to Delaware on Wednesday June 01, 2016.

Sohail Zeeshan was charged with Organized Crime and Racketeering, Two counts of Fraud and False Statements, two counts of Knowingly Engaging in Transactions with Proceeds of Criminal Activity and seven Counts of Money Laundering. He was arraigned at Justice of the Peace Court 2 and committed to Sussex Correctional Center in default of \$75,000.00 cash bond. (photo attached)

Today, Friday, June 03, 2016, at 1:30 p.m., Linda Mcglotten, 49 of Milford, turned herself in at Justice of the Peace Court 3 in Georgetown. She was charged with Racketeering three counts of Money Laundering. Mcglotten was arraigned and committed to the Sussex Correctional Center in default of \$75,000.00 cash bond. (photo attached)

## **Troopers Investigating Fatal Motor Vehicle Crash – Milton**

**\*\*Final Update\*\***

**Milton, DE** – The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating a fatal crash that occurred this afternoon north of Milton.

The preliminary investigation has determined the crash occurred on Friday, June 03, 2016 at 1:24 p.m., as Joshua P. Courts, 23 of Dover, was operating a 2007 EX6 Kawasaki motorcycle in the left southbound lane of SR 1 just north of

the intersection of SR 5. Penny J. Jeffries, 67 of Pennsylvania, was operating a 2007 Lincoln MKZ, was stopped on the northbound SR 5 for a stop sign posted on SR 1. Jeffries pulled from the stop sign in an attempt to cross the southbound travel lanes and enter the median crossover to turn northbound. As a result, the front of the Kawasaki struck the driver's side door of the Lincoln MKZ within the southbound left lane. The Lincoln came to rest upright in the median crossover facing northbound. Courts was ejected from the motorcycle at impact and came to rest next to the motorcycle which fell onto its left side facing in a westerly direction just west of the vehicle.

Joshua P. Courts, who was wearing a helmet at the time, was pronounced deceased at the scene.

Penny J. Jeffries, who was wearing a seatbelt, was flown by Lifenet to the Christiana Medical Center where she was admitted with serious injuries.

(SR 1) Coastal Highway southbound was closed for approximately 1 ½ hours and north bound was restricted to one lane during the investigation while the crash was investigated and cleared.

# Troopers Investigate Gas Station Robbery North of Wilmington

*Wilmington, DE-* Delaware State Police are currently investigating the robbery of a Wilmington area gas station which occurred late last night.

The initial investigation has determined that the incident occurred last night, Thursday, June 2, 2016, at approximately 11:21 p.m., as a male suspect entered the Exxon gas station located at 5301 Concord Pike, Wilmington. The suspect then walked behind the sales counter where he confronted a male store clerk and demanded money from the cash register. The male employee, however, fled from the sales counter and retreated to the storage area of the business. The suspect, who was armed with a tire iron, then removed a cash drawer from the sales counter and fled from the store in an unknown direction. The clerk was not injured.

The suspect was described as a black male. He was 30-40 years of age, 5'08"-5'10" tall, weighed 230-250 lbs., and was last seen wearing a multi-colored shirt, dark pants, and dark sneakers. There is no further physical or clothing description available.

This incident remains under investigation by the Delaware State Police. Robbery Unit detectives are attempting to determine if the suspect was the same man who committed the robbery of the same business on Wednesday, June 1, 2016.

# Farmington Man Arrested After Hitting DFS Worker with Car

**Farmington, DE-** Delaware State Police have arrested a Farmington man with Assault after he struck a Division of Family Services (DFS) worker with his car.

The investigation has determined that the incident occurred at approximately 2:50 p.m., Wednesday June 1, 2016, when a 41-year-old female, employed as a case worker with DFS, was conducting a follow-up on an investigation at a residence in the 1000 block of Staytonville Road. As the DFS employee was standing in the yard talking to an adult female that resides at the residence, **Wayne R. Nichols**, 67, returned to the house in his car and began to drive toward where the two were standing. The case worker attempted to avoid being hit by jumping out of the way, but was unsuccessful and was struck by the vehicle's front bumper. The female victim then ran from the yard and sought refuge in her vehicle when Nichols began to drive directly at her again. This time, he stopped abruptly at her driver's side door without striking the car. She was then able to flee in her vehicle to a nearby house where she called 9-1-1.

Wayne Nichols was taken into custody without further incident by arriving troopers and transported back to Troop 3 in Camden. He was charged with Assault 2<sup>nd</sup> and Reckless Endangering 1<sup>st</sup> and arraigned at JP7 before being committed to James T. Vaughn Correctional Center on \$4,000.00 secured bond.

# Troopers Investigating Pair of Title Loan Business Robberies

*New Castle County-* Delaware State Police Robbery Unit detectives are currently investigating the robberies of a pair of area title loan businesses that occurred in Wilmington and New Castle late last month.

The first incident occurred on Monday, May 23, 2016, at approximately 7:45 p.m., as a male suspect entered the Northeast Title Loans located at 2900 Concord Pike, Wilmington. The suspect, who was armed with an unknown make and model handgun, confronted a male employee of the business. He then demanded money from the cash registers, as well as the keys to the employee's car. The employee complied with the suspect's demands and turned over an undisclosed amount of money to him as well as the keys to his 2011 Hyundai Sonata. The suspect then exited the business and fled from the parking lot in the victim's car. The victim was not injured. Troopers were able to locate the victim's unoccupied car approximately 3 hours later in the parking lot of the St. Mary Magdalen Church located at 7 Sharpley Road, Wilmington.

The suspect was described as a black male 20-30 years of age. He was 5'06"-5'08" tall, weighed 180-200 lbs., and was last seen wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, black jeans, and grey sneakers. There is no further physical or clothing description available.

The second incident occurred at approximately 4:15 p.m. on Friday, May 27, 2016, as three male suspects entered the Loan Max, located at 1517 N. DuPont Highway, New Castle. All three

suspects were armed with unknown make and model handguns. They then confronted three employees of the business and demanded money from the registers as well as the employee's cell phones. All three employees complied with the suspect's demands and turned over their cell phones as well as an undisclosed amount of money to them. The suspects then fled in an unknown direction. There were no injuries.

All three suspects were described as black males 25-35 years of age. Two of the suspect's were 5'07"-5'11" tall, weighed 165-185 lbs., and were last seen wearing a white t-shirt and blue jeans. The third suspect weighed 185-205 lbs., and was last seen wearing a white t-shirt and dark grey sweatpants. There is no further physical or clothing description available.

Both of these incidents remain under investigation by the Delaware State Police. Robbery Unit detectives do not believe that they are related however. No video surveillance photos are available to be released at this time.

# Troopers Investigate Attempted Robbery

*Wilmington, DE-* Delaware State Police are investigating the attempted armed robbery of a Wilmington area gas station that occurred early yesterday morning.

The initial investigation has determined that the incident occurred on Wednesday, June 1, 2016, at approximately 1:54 a.m., as a male suspect entered the Valero gas station located at 1327 McKennan's Church Road, Wilmington. The suspect approached a male clerk who was standing behind the sales counter and demanded money and cigarettes from him. The clerk refused to comply with the suspect's demands. The suspect then implied that he was armed and again demanded money and cigarettes. Again the clerk refused. It was at this time that the suspect attempted to remove a cash register from the sales counter. A struggle then ensued between the clerk and the suspect. The suspect then exited the business without obtaining any money or cigarettes. He was last seen entering a red unknown make and model vehicle and fleeing from the parking lot in an unknown direction. The store employee suffered minor injuries during the struggle. He refused treatment at the scene.

The suspect was described as a black male. He was 5'10"-6'00" tall, weighed 230-250 lbs, with black hair and brown eyes. He was last seen wearing a white t-shirt, dark shorts, dark sneakers, and a baseball cap. There is no further physical or clothing description available. No video surveillance photos are available to be released at this time.

## Facebook Tip Leads to Arrest in Thefts from Vehicles in South Dover Area

**Dover, DE-** Delaware State Police Detectives have arrested a Magnolia man in connection with numerous thefts from vehicles that occurred in developments off South State Street and South Old Mill Road .

Troopers began their investigation on Saturday May 28, 2016, after numerous incidents of car break-ins were being reported in the Stone Ridge Development and Bradys Lane, south of Dover. In most of the incidents, the vehicles were left unlocked and the suspect removed various items of cash and personal belongings before fleeing the area.

Detectives from Troop 3 received images from a video surveillance camera located at a residence in the area of the incidents and that photo along with information surrounding the crimes was sent out through the social media platforms of

Facebook and Nextdoor. Within a few hours, an anonymous tip was received from a Facebook user identifying the subject depicted in the photo as **Antonio Powell**, 27 of Magnolia.

Detectives began searching for Powell in the Magnolia area and observed him traveling as a passenger in a vehicle leaving a residence on Walnut Shade Road. Upon conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle, Powell provided false information to the detective who had already arrested him in the beginning of May for thefts from vehicles in the Rising Sun area.

Antonio Powell was subsequently taken into custody without incident and transported back to Troop 3 in Camden. He was charged with nine counts of Theft under \$1500, four counts of Attempted Theft under \$1500, twelve counts of Criminal Trespass 3<sup>rd</sup>, and Criminal Impersonation. He was arraigned at JP2 and committed to James T. Vaughn Correctional Center on \$9,100.00 cash bond.

Troopers are continuing their investigation into these incidents and additional charges may be forthcoming.

The Delaware State Police want to remind people to utilize the following tips:

- Lock your car doors and roll up you windows
- Do not leave valuables inside your vehicle
- Leave outdoor lights on in the driveway or have security lighting installed
- Report any suspicious activity to 9-1-1
