# **Delaware State Police**

Police Accountability Committee March 18, 2025 (Minutes)

## **Beginning of Meeting**

- 1. Meeting began at 1738 hours with Captain Skinner whom turned the meeting over to Colonel Crotty to give the opening remarks (Delaware State Police Troop 3 Community Room)
- 2. Captain Skinner introduced three (3) new committee members David Shockley, Erica Young, and Bruce Wright.
- 3. Captain Skinner introduced himself and Community Engagement Unit consisting of Sgt. DeMalto, Cpl/3 Jones, and Cpl/1 Malloy to the new committee members.
- 4. Attendance was noted as ten (10) members: Collick, Elias, Keeler, McKendell-Arringon, McLarthy, Moore, Rigby, Wright, Young, and Shockley.

## **Body of Meeting**

- Captain Skinner asked for a motion to accept the minutes from the last Police Accountability Committee Meeting.
  - a. Motion made by Collick and second motion made by Pastor Moore.
- 2. Captain Skinner reviewed the policy change made to the Delaware State Police Duty to Intervene Policy based on suggestions made by committee members from the previous meeting.

#### DSP BWC Technology Overview by Major Jeremiah Lloyd and Marisa Warren

- 1. Marissa passed around Body Worn Camera (BWC) for Committee members to look at and touch.
- 2. Presented on Axon Body 4 (AB4) overview that is being worn by DSP Troopers and Axon Signal items used by DSP which automatically triggers the Axon BWC and in Car Cameras.
- 3. Discussed Axon's Community Requests ability to send out requests to citizens or businesses to retrieve private or CCTV video footage to be uploaded to Evidence.com for cases.
  - a. Wright asked a question about Troopers editing their videos.
    - i. Marissa advised that individual Troopers do not have the ability to edit their videos. She advised the original video cannot be edited but IT can redact certain things for copies.
  - b. Elias asked a question regarding the BWC 18-hour buffering period.
    - i. Major Lloyd advised that the BWC buffers when it's on, recording in the background for up to 18 hours.
  - c. Young asked how long is video stored.
    - Major Lloyd advised videos are kept for a minimum of three (3) years which is greater than the civil liability period of two (2) years. Some videos are stored for longer periods based on the type of incident.
- 4. Major Lloyd reviewed DSP BWC Policy with Committee members.
  - a. Elias asked if Troopers have to manually turn the BWC on.
    - i. Major Lloyd and Marissa confirmed they are required to manually turn it on.

- b. Young asked what happens if a Trooper turns off their BWC in the middle of a call.
  - i. Major Lloyd advised they are required to document why and if they do not the Trooper will be counseled or disciplined dependent on the incident.
- c. Collick asked about interactions with Troopers mentioned during the policy.
  - i. Major Lloyd went over common interactions between Troopers on a day-to-day basis.
- 5. Major Lloyd covered supervisory responsibilities to review BWC and In-Vehicle Cameras

#### 5-Minute Break

### <u>Internal Affairs Overview – Office of Professional Responsibility by Captain William Thompson</u>

- Discussed BWC videos of incidents that are reported as citizen complaints for Committee members.
  - a. Collick made comments that the Citizens observed were not reasonable at all.
  - b. Moore asked if the troopers in the videos felt personally threatened based on the behavior of the citizens during the interactions observed.
- 2. Discussed BWC videos of incidents which are reported to IA as administrative complaints for Committee members.
  - a. Collick asked if Troopers have remorse after their IA investigations.
    - i. Captain Thompson advised it varies between Troopers and incidents.
  - b. Young asked if Troopers have to go through more training after certain incidents.
    - i. Captain Thompson advised that they offer various resources and trainings to the Troopers involved.

## **Open Discussion**

- 1. Captain Skinner opened the floor up for open discussion.
- 2. Young made a comment that she wanted to commend the Troopers and what they do daily. She asked if DSP's videos are open to the public.
  - a. Captain Skinner advised they can be requested through discovery.
  - b. Captain Thompson advised if you make a complaint, you can also get access to the videos involved in the complaint.
- 3. Collick and Moore recommended all committee members do the ride-a-longs.

### **Closing Business**

- 1. Captain Skinner proposed Tuesday June 10, 2025 for the next PAC meeting.
- 2. Captain Skinner asked if there is any proposed topics from the Committee.
  - a. Shockley asked about what we're doing for mental health of Troopers as a Topic.
    - i. Marissa touched briefly on the wellness app and peer to peer program.
  - b. Collick suggested recruitment as a possible topic and what we look for.
  - c. McKendell-Arringon suggested a topic on how we are working with ICE

- Motion made by McKendell-Arringon for communication to be shared division wide from the executive staff regarding our responsibilities cooperating with ICE. Motion seconded by Wright.
- 3. Captain Skinner also suggested the divisions pursuit policy as future meeting topic.
- 4. Captain Skinner asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting, Motion made by McKendell-Arringon, second by Collick, and voted unanimously by members.
