Instructions to First Responder:

(Police Officer, Firefighter, EMT)

- · Driver or passenger has a disability
- · Speak calmly and relaxed
- Speak clearly and use simple language
- Be patient and allow driver extra time to respond
- Turn off bright lights and reduce loud noises
- Try not to touch the person
- · Tell the driver when they can leave

1 This person may...

- Appear anxious due to lights/noises
- Be unaware of danger
- · Be non-speaking and use a communication device
- Display repetitive body movements and unusual eye contact
- Not respond to verbal commands
- · Wander if unattended
- Become upset; consider calling their emergency contact (flip envelope for additional information)
- Resist help
